TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF HCR19 / HR19

Chair Belatti, Vice Chair Iwamoto, and Members of the Committee:

Efforts to strengthen public-military relationships in Hawai'i are both timely and necessary. Hawai'i has a long history of military presence, and while this presence brings both opportunities and challenges, it is clear that deliberate coordination and partnership between military and civilian sectors are critical to maintaining public trust, ensuring mutual benefit, and promoting resilience across our islands.

In this spirit, I would like to respectfully highlight the work and mission of the State's new Military and Community Relations Office (MACRO), established to promote and sustain strong partnerships between Hawai'i's military and civilian communities. MACRO's work includes identifying areas of shared interest, fostering transparent communication, and building trust through collaboration. This includes initiatives focused on land use, workforce development, emergency preparedness, natural resource protection, and other issues relevant to both the public and the military.

MACRO has begun to serve as a convener and liaison across sectors and would be a valuable resource to any future task force as proposed in this resolution. Leveraging existing infrastructure like MACRO can enhance the effectiveness of any task force and help ensure alignment with statewide efforts to address the concerns raised in the resolution such as access to resources, environmental stewardship, and coordinated emergency response.

Should the Governor move forward with convening a task force as proposed, incorporating insights from MACRO and aligning with its current initiatives may help advance thoughtful, long-term public-military solutions that serve Hawai'i's communities.
