Dear Chair Lee, Chair Elefante, and members of the Committees,

The Hawaii Fire Fighters Association (HFFA), Local 1463, IAFF, AFL-CIO, represents more than 2,000 professional active-duty fire fighters throughout the State. The HFFA, on behalf of all our members, **strongly opposes S.B. No 1102,** which proposes to impose term limits, three four-year appointments, for the Chief of the State Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting Unit of the Airports Division of the Department of Transportation.

HFFA believes this bill could negatively impact HFFA BU11 members who serve in the State ARFF division. The ARFF Fire Chief position requires the years of service specific to this position which includes but not limited to, proficiency in working with and understanding FAA requirements impacting airport fire personnel, understanding of the BU 11 collective bargaining agreement to ensure compliance, and direct resources that meet the specific training and certifications for ARFF personnel as required by the FAA. This is an arduous task and proficiency in the position should not be dictated by an arbitrary term limit as directed by statute.
