Bill No. and Title: Senate Bill No. 1150, SD1, Relating to Health Care.

Purpose: Expands the protections established under Act 2, SLH 2023, to include gender-affirming health care services. Clarifies jurisdiction under the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act for cases involving children who obtain gender affirming health care services.

Judiciary's Position:

The Judiciary takes no position on this bill but offers the following comment regarding Section 15 of the bill which seeks to add a new subsection (e) to HRS Section 583A-207 of the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act ("UCCJEA").

If the legislature decides that the issue of gender affirming care should be considered by the family court when determining whether Hawai'i is a convenient forum under the UCCJEA, the Judiciary respectfully suggests that the issue be added to the nine (9) factors that the family

court is currently required to consider in HRS Section 583A-207(b) rather than creating a new subsection (e).

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony on this bill, which would, among other things, amend protections for reproductive health care services to include gender-affirming health care services. The Office of Information Practices (OIP) takes **no position on the substance** of this bill, but **supports** the proposed **amendment to section 323J-4**, HRS, which would fix a potential conflict between the existing language of that section and chapter 92F, HRS, the Uniform Information Practices Act (UIPA).

Section 323J-4, HRS, currently prohibits government agencies as defined in the UIPA and their employees from providing any information "in furtherance of any out-of-state or interstate investigation or proceeding seeking to impose civil or criminal liability" for the provision, use of, or assistance related to reproductive health care services. Since the definition of "agency" is explicitly based on that used in the UIPA, the prohibition is clearly intended to apply to UIPA requests. The problem is that the prohibition on disclosing information applies not just to patient health information or similarly confidential information but to information in

general, and it is not limited to a situation in which the agency or employee furnishing information actually knows that the record request was made in connection with an investigation or proceeding seeking to impose liability. An agency providing records as required under the UIPA could thereby find itself in violation of section 323J-4, HRS.

This bill (at page 8 line 2) would amend section 323J-4, HRS, to limit the prohibition to situations where an agency discloses **nonpublic** information under the UIPA in furtherance of an investigation or proceeding seeking to impose liability as described. This amendment makes clear that the general prohibition on disclosure does not bar an agency from disclosing public records, and OIP **supports** it.

The Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission (HCRC) writes in strong support of S.B. 1150 S.D. 1 (whose companion bill is H.B. 615) because it would protect patients, providers and families from discrimination and unjust punishment tied to gender-affirming care.

HCRC carries out the Hawai'i constitutional mandate that no person shall be discriminated against in the exercise of their civil rights. Art. I, Sec. 5. HCRC enforces laws protecting the people of Hawai'i from discrimination in the areas of housing, employment, public accommodations, and in some state and state-funded services.

Access to health care, including gender-affirming care, is an important benefit for individuals who are under the protected characteristics of sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity or expression.

In establishing Act 2, SLH 2023, the State of Hawai'i recognized the vital need for transgender, māhū and gender-diverse individuals to access healthcare without fear of harassment or legal repercussion. Supporting S.B. 1150 aligns with Hawai'i's foundational values of safety and rights for all in our vibrant community. Our diversity is our strength.

Transgender, māhū and gender-diverse individuals are caretakers, healers, givers, educators, cultural advisors, leaders, lawyers, wellness-providers. The next generation of transgender, māhū and gender-diverse individuals should be given protection to be valued for who they are, not prosecuted because of people's hatred and fear for what they do not know.

HCRC recognizes that protecting the right to gender-affirming care also safeguards transgender, māhū and gender-diverse individuals' well-being. A Stanford Medicine article found that starting gender-affirming hormone treatment in adolescence was linked to better mental health outcomes than waiting until adulthood. Erin Digitale, Better Mental Health Found Among Transgender People Who Started Hormones as Teens, Stanford Medicine (January 12, 2022), https://med.stanford.edu/news/all-news/2022/01/mental-health-hormone-treatment-transgender-people.html.

S.B. 1150 S.D. 1 would also uphold parental rights by ensuring families can make informed healthcare decisions for their children without outside interference from states or bad actors in other jurisdictions seeking to penalize those accessing or offering gender-affirming care. Furthermore, ensuring that mental health counselors are not compelled to disclose information about gender-affirming care upholds the confidentiality of care. Without these protections, there will be a chilling effect on healthcare providers; they should focus on what matters most – delivering effective care that promotes better health outcomes that affirm the dignity and autonomy of the individual. This actualizes Hawai'i's public policy by taking a stand against the erosion of civil rights happening in other jurisdictions.

S.B. 1150 S.D. 1 will prevent the weaponization of interstate legal systems to target transgender individuals, their families and their doctors. Consequently, S.B. 1150 bolsters civil rights by affirming that gender diversity and the medical care supporting it are valid, protected and not subject to external political attacks.

I am writing in strong support of Senate Bill 1150 SD 1 on behalf of the Hawai'i State Lesbian. Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer Plus. (LGBTQ+) Commission, which was established by the 2022 Hawai'i State Legislature with the following purpose:

"...to improve the State's interface with members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual. transgender, queer, plus community; identify the short- and long-range needs of its members; and ensure that there is an effective means of researching, planning, and advocating for the equity of this population in all aspects of state government."

The Hawai'i State LGBTQ+ Commission submits this testimony in strong support of Senate Bill 1150, which expands the protections established under Act 2, SLH 2023, to explicitly include gender-affirming health care services and clarifies jurisdiction under the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act for cases involving children who obtain such care.

Act 2 was a monumental step toward ensuring that Hawai'i remains a beacon of safety and acceptance for LGBTQ+ individuals, particularly transgender, Māhū, and non-binary community members. SB 1150 builds upon this foundation, ensuring that individuals who seek genderaffirming care—recognized by every major medical association as medically necessary and life-saving—are protected from out-of-state legal attacks and discriminatory policies that seek to criminalize such care.

As we have seen across the nation, the transgender, māhū, and non-binary community faces unprecedented attacks from certain factions of the federal government and state legislatures that seek to restrict access to gender-affirming health care. These efforts are not only politically motivated but also dangerous, putting lives at risk by denying individuals the ability to access the care they need to live authentically and safely. By enacting SB 1150, Hawai'i has the opportunity to stand in direct opposition to these harmful policies and reaffirm its commitment to protecting the rights, dignity, and well-being of all its residents.

For transgender, māhū, and non-binary keiki and adults, access to gender-affirming care can mean the difference between life and death. Studies show that access to such care significantly reduces the risk of depression, anxiety, and suicide. Yet, across the country, from the Federal to certain states, extremist efforts seek to strip these individuals of their right to exist safely and freely. We cannot allow such hostility to take root in Hawai'i.

Aloha Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Gabbard, Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Moriwaki and Members of the joint Senate Judiciary and Ways and Means Committees:

The Democratic Party of Hawai'i **STRONGLY SUPPORTS** SB1150 SD1, RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. Pursuant to the Platform of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i, the Party supports an inherent right to live a healthy life and believes all people have the right to access high quality healthcare. The Democratic Party of Hawai'i supports protection of transgender rights by advocating for legislation that safeguards gender affirming care and condemns anti-transgender measures.

This bill expands the protections established under Act 2, SLH 2023, to include gender-affirming health care services.

SB 1150 SD1 will provide significant legal and civil protections to individuals and entities providing and receiving gender affirming care. It will:

- Defends Hawai'i's Sovereignty: This is a STATE'S RIGHTS issue, ensuring that the laws we enact in Hawai'i are protected from interference by laws passed in other states on the continent.
- Protects Parents' Rights: Parents in Hawai'i will be safeguarded from outof-state courts attempting to interfere with their decisions regarding medical care for their children—decisions made under the supervision of licensed healthcare professionals and legal in Hawai'i.
- Supports Families and Medical Professionals: Parents, guardians, and medical providers will be empowered to make informed, compassionate decisions for their keiki without fear of retaliation or legal threats from other states.

- Ensures Medical Privacy: Ensuring that your medical records belong to YOU. This bill expands protections to keep Hawai'i residents' healthcare information private and secure from external entities.
- Defends Hawai'i's Healthcare Providers: Doctors and healthcare professionals practicing in Hawai'i will be shielded from punitive actions by other states when delivering care that aligns with Hawai'i's laws.
- Preserves Indigenous Values: This bill safeguards the cultural heritage of Pacifika Islanders, who have long embraced gender diversity, from external pressures to conform to western gender-binary "ideals". This is about stopping the erosion of indigenous cultural values.
- Reinforces Existing Protections: This legislation mirrors the protections for reproductive rights enacted under 2023's ACT 2, extending the same security to gender-affirming care.
- X What this bill does not do: It does NOT authorize surgeries on minors; It does NOT permit prescriptions or procedures without parental consent; It does NOT force anyone to transition or "make" anyone transgender; It does NOT allow children to be removed from their families.

We, the Democratic Party of Hawai'i, believe that providing and receiving life saving health care is a basic human right. Sadly, over the past several years, it has become clear that extremists across the nation have made it their legislative priority to target women and members of the LGBTQIA+ community by stripping away their rights, especially access to health care.

Dozens of states across the nation have either passed or are considering passing laws prohibiting gender affirming health care to people of ALL AGES. These laws target providers and recipients, making it a criminal offense to provide gender affirming care. Recently, the Texas AG has gone as far as issuing subpoenas for medical records relating to gender affirming care - from medical providers outside his own state of Texas - to prosecute gender affirming care providers and recipients who may reside in Texas. Such moves are intended to have a chilling effect, frivolously overreaching state lines, in the pursuit to diminish and extinguish gender affirming care across the nation – even in states that do not have such discriminatory and misguided laws on their books. We must take action and take a stand to protect the human rights and human dignity of our LGBTQIA+ Community. The LGBTQIA+ community is under unprecedented attack across the nation, and it is our responsibility to stand up to bullies and protect the civil and basic human rights of our fellow residents.

In 2023, we passed a similar bill (SB1, now ACT 2) to address specific protections for reproductive rights. We are confident that, together, we can continue to make a difference and also pass protections for gender affirming care. Hawai'i will not bow to the politics of fear and hate. Please support this bill.

Hawaii Lawmakers:

We, The Libertarian Party of Hawaii, vehemently denounce SB1150/HB615, or what we've dubbed "the Hawaii Kidnapping Bill". This proposed legislation is a flagrant violation of individual liberty and a gross abuse of governmental power that threatens the fundamental rights of parents and children alike.

Several clauses buried in this bill seek to essentially legalize child kidnapping across state lines, including by a non-parent, so long as the abduction is performed under the guise of obtaining 'gender-affirming' treatments. The proposed law would provide immunity for what would otherwise be a criminal act. It removes informed consent from parents and violates parental rights.

This bill is a thinly-veiled act of political war against the rights of other states and families. The lawsuits will cost Hawaii dearly and may lead to bigger issues. By redefining crucial legal frameworks such as the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction & Enforcement Act (which governs interstate child custody cases), this bill creates loopholes that enable the systematic removal of children from their families under the pretext of 'Gender Affirming Care', which threatens Hawaii's participation in the UCCJEA, and will result in Hawaii no longer being able to reliably return children who are taken away from Hawaii in child custody disputes.

This bill not only disregards the sanctity of family but also infringes upon the basic freedoms of individuals to make personal and informed decisions regarding their children's healthcare. This bill undermines due process, disregards parental authority, promises expensive fights with other states, and poses a grave threat to the well-being of minors nationwide.

It mandates secrecy, criminalizes interference with kidnappers, and obstructs the extradition of those charged with criminal acts in connection with 'gender-affirming care'. Such measures not only defy ethical medical principles but erode transparency and accountability in our justice system.

SENATE BILL 1150, SD1, RELATING TO HEALTH CARE

FEBRUARY 26, 2025 · JDC/WAM HEARING

POSITION: Support.

RATIONALE: The Democratic Party of Hawai'i Education Caucus <u>supports</u> SB 1150, SD1, relating to health care, which expands the protections established under Act 2, SLH 2023, to include gender-affirming care services; and clarifies jurisdiction under the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act for cases involving children who obtain gender-affirming health care services.

Gender-affirming care is health care. In recent weeks, the Trump administration has issued multiple executive orders targeting the rights of LGBTQ+ individuals, including orders banning transgender service members from the military, moving transgender women back into men's prisons, denying passports with gender markers, blocking schools from requiring teachers and other school staff to use names and pronouns that align with transgender students' preferred gender identify rather than the sex they were assigned at birth, and defunding gender-affirming care for transgender youth.

These efforts fly in the face of decades of research supported by every major medical association. The American Psychiatric Association, for instance, released a statement in 2018 saying, "Significant and long-standing medical and psychiatric literature exists that demonstrates clear benefits of medical and surgical interventions to assist gender variant individuals seeking transition. Access to medical care (both medical and surgical) positively impacts the mental health of transgender and gender variant individuals." Similarly, the American Public Health Association issued a statement in 2017

asserting that the APHA "urges Congress and state legislatures to enact legislation to protect the

rights, legal benefits, and access to services of people of all gender identities and expressions."

For its part, the American Medical Association, the largest association of physicians and medical

students in the United States, has articulated its position on this issue on multiple occasions, most

recently in 2023, when it said that the AMA "recognizes that treatments for gender dysphoria and

gender incongruence are medically necessary" and that the organization "will work with stakeholders

to advocate for laws and policies that protect access to care, oppose laws and policies that impede

the provision of care, support protections against liability for physicians and institutions who provide

care and patients who seek it, communicate about the importance of gender-affirming care, and

advocate for coverage of gender-affirming care by public and private health insurers."

Sadly, our society has seen a surge in far-right organizations and states attempting to ban gender-

affirming care, arguing that being transgender is an "ideology." As the Human Rights Campaign has

stated, "These proponents have perpetrated a concerted disinformation campaign that has fueled not

only discriminatory laws, but also threats and violence against providers of gender-affirming care." As

conservative states continue seeking access to patient data in an effort to not only suppress the right

of transgender individuals to receive gender-affirming care, but eliminate transgender people's

existence within our country altogether, it is imperative that Hawai'i takes a strong stand to reaffirm

the islands as a sanctuary for gender-affirming care and transgender rights, including by establishing

a shield law for patients and medical providers who seek and provide gender-affirming care.

On February 4th, Attorney General Anne Lopez joined a coalition of fourteen attorneys general to

reaffirm their pledge to protect access to gender-affirming care. The coalition released the following

statement: "As state attorneys general, we stand firmly in support of healthcare policies that respect

the dignity and rights of all people. Health care decisions should be made by patients, families and

doctors, not by a politician trying to restrict freedoms. Gender-affirming care is essential, lifesaving

medical treatment that supports individuals in living as their authentic selves."

Let's follow the coalition's lead, oppose fearmongering and discrimination, and enshrine the right to

gender-affirming care for our transgender community in state law.

My name is Abby Simmons, Chair of the Stonewall Caucus of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i, and I am testifying on behalf of our Caucus in <u>strong support of SB1150 SD1</u>, the Health Care Access Protection Act.

Some states have gone further—threatening parents with legal action for supporting their children's health needs and criminalizing medical professionals for simply following best practices.

2. Preventing Government Overreach in Family and Custody Matters

SB 1150 SD1 ensures that Hawai'i courts will not participate in the unjust separation of children from their parents based on another state's politically motivated laws against genderaffirming care.

- It protects health care professionals from disciplinary actions taken by other states that do not align with Hawaii's laws and values.
- It ensures that subpoenas, warrants, and extradition requests related to lawful medical care in Hawai'i will not be enforced.

Hawai'i has always been a leader in LGBTQ+ rights—from being one of the first states to challenge same-sex marriage bans to enacting strong anti-discrimination protections. Now, with SB 1150 SD1, Hawai'i can once again lead by example by refusing to be complicit in politically motivated attacks on bodily autonomy and medical freedom.

We cannot allow the legal chaos and fear-mongering of other states and the far right extremists to dictate what happens in our islands. We must send a clear and unwavering message:

Hawai'i is—and will always be—a place where LGBTQ+ individuals are safe, affirmed, and free to make personal medical decisions without fear of persecution.

In conclusion:

2024-29: Affirming Transgender Rights by Protecting Gender Affirming Care

Whereas, Across the United States, there have been over 550 legislative measures introduced in 2023 and over 500 in 2024 that target transgender people and/or access to Gender Affirming Care, including bills introduced here in Hawai'i; and

Whereas, Gender Affirming Care is supported by every major medical association and leading world health authority as safe and life-saving, and is defined as medically-necessary healthcare that respects the gender identity of the patient; and

Whereas, These anti-transgender bills make it a crime for transgender individuals to use public restrooms that match their gender identity; make it a criminal offense for healthcare workers to provide medically necessary gender affirming care; threaten to cause parents who provide access to gender affirming care to lose custody; prohibit gender marker updates to birth certificates, driver's licenses, and other state issued forms of identification; reverse past gender marker updates on birth certificates and other state issued forms of identification; make it a criminal offense for teachers and counselors to use the chosen pronouns and preferred names of transgender students; prohibit transgender students from participating in sports under the gender they identify as; and ban speaking about transgender topics, including books and educational material in public schools that inform about transgender identities and lived experiences; and

Whereas, The harm that is being done by the introduction and signing into law of these bills cannot be overstated, resulting in criminalizing Hawai'i's transgender community members simply for existing in public spaces when they visit states where this type of legislation has been passed; and

Whereas, Many transgender children are being shamed, bullied and physically assaulted by their peers because of who they are, diminishing their healthy mental development and growth, while also leading half of transgender youth in the past year to consider suicide; and

Whereas, These bills attack our most basic values, including the freedom to be ourselves, to make our own healthcare decisions, and the right to raise our own keiki; therefore be it

I am writing in continued strong support of SB1150, which would help protect patients, providers, and families from out of state persecution, professional discipline, and separation when gender affirming care is received or provided in Hawai'i to a resident of a state where such care may be unlawful.

- 3. that electronic health records, billing systems, patient-centered notification systems, and clinical research be designed to respect the asserted gender identity of each patient while maintaining confidentiality and avoiding duplicate charts;
- 4. that insurance plans offer coverage for health care that is specific to the needs of youth who identify as TGD, including coverage for medical, psychological, and, when indicated, surgical gender-affirming interventions;
- that provider education, including medical school, residency, and continuing education, integrate core competencies on the emotional and physical health needs and best practices for the care of youth who identify as TGD and their families;
- 6. that pediatricians have a role in advocating for, educating, and developing liaison relationships with school districts and other community organizations to promote acceptance and inclusion of all children without fear of harassment, exclusion, or bullying because of gender expression;

- 7. that pediatricians have a role in advocating for policies and laws that protect youth who identify as TGD from discrimination and violence;
- 8. that the health care workforce protects diversity by offering equal employment opportunities and workplace protections, regardless of gender identity or expression; and
- 9. that the medical field and federal government prioritize research that is dedicated to improving the quality of evidence-based care for youth who identify as TGD.

The Hawai'i Nurses' Association – OPEIU Local 50 is affiliated with the AFL-CIO, was founded in 1917, and represents 4,000 nurses & health care professionals in the State of Hawai'i. We appreciate the opportunity to testify today in <u>strong support</u> of SB1150 and to share our concerns regarding the broader national implications of restricting gender-affirming care.

Protecting Patients' Right to Evidence-Based Care

The Hawaii Nurses' Association is committed to ensuring that every patient has access to compassionate, evidence-based healthcare. Gender-affirming care is recognized by leading medical organizations—including the American Medical Association and the World Professional Association for Transgender Health—as a medically necessary treatment for transgender and gender diverse individuals. It is vital for the physical, mental, and emotional well-being of these patients.

A national ban on gender-affirming care would not only limit access to essential services but would also infringe on patients' fundamental right to receive appropriate and individualized care. Denying gender-affirming treatment risks exacerbating health disparities and may lead to increased rates of mental health challenges, such as anxiety, depression, and suicidal ideation among transgender patients. By impeding access to care, such legislation would undermine the progress made in supporting the health and dignity of all individuals.

Implications for Nursing Practice and Licensure

Equally concerning are the professional ramifications for nurses. Our practice is built on a foundation of ethical commitment to patient-centered care and adherence to evidence-based standards. Should a national ban on gender-affirming care be imposed, nurses who provide this care in alignment with current professional guidelines could find themselves in a precarious position. They might be forced to choose between fulfilling their ethical duty to their patients and complying with new legal constraints that contradict established medical practice.

This conflict is not only detrimental to patient outcomes but also poses a direct threat to the professional integrity and licensure of nurses. Imagine a scenario where a nurse, acting in the best interests of a patient, provides gender-affirming care only to face potential disciplinary action or even the loss of their professional license. Such a risk is unacceptable and fundamentally incompatible with the principles of nursing practice. Nurses must be free to practice in accordance with evidence-based guidelines without the fear of legal repercussions that compromise their ability to advocate for their patients.

A Call to Action

In light of these concerns, the Hawaii Nurses' Association respectfully urges this committee to:

- 1. **Recognize the Critical Role of Gender-Affirming Care:** Ensure that any policies or legislation support patient access to medically necessary care and protect the clinical judgment of healthcare providers.
- 2. **Safeguard Nursing Practice:** Prevent any national mandates that would force nurses to choose between ethical, evidence-based practice and compliance with laws that restrict patient care, thereby protecting both patient rights and nurses' professional licenses.
- 3. **Promote Policies Grounded in Science:** Advocate for legislative measures that are informed by current medical research and the collective expertise of healthcare professionals, ensuring that all patients receive the care they need.

The Hawaii Nurses' Association stands firmly with our patients and our nursing professionals. We believe that upholding the right to gender-affirming care is essential not only for the health of transgender individuals but also for the integrity of our healthcare system. We respectfully request that this committee consider these critical issues as you deliberate on SB1150. Our collective goal must be to ensure that all patients receive the highest standard of care, and that nurses are empowered to practice without fear of punitive repercussions when they deliver evidence-based treatment.

Hawai i Health & Harm Reduction Center (HHHRC) *strongly supports* SB 1150, SD 1, which expands the protections established under Act 2, SLH 2023, to include gender-affirming health care services.

This state's shield laws in the context of reproductive health provide protections against out-of-state discipline, civil liability, and disclosure of medical information related to reproductive health care services. These same protections should also extend to gender-affirming care. 17 states and the Washington, D.C., have shield law protections for gender affirming care. Hawai'i should join them.

These are very fraught times for sexual and gender minorities, who already face persistent obstacles to their health and well-being. This includes <u>LGB youth</u> and <u>trans youth</u> in Hawai'i. Presidential executive orders have sought to erase and suppress trans people, including one on 1/29 <u>targeting trans students in K-12 schools</u> calling for forced outing, restrictions on participation in co-curricular activities, and banning any instruction regarding gender identity.

Hawai'i has made a good deal of progress in affirming the rights of trans people, with gender identity and gender expression protected categories in its non-discrimination laws. Yet there are still barriers to receiving care, and the outlook is grim given a White House occupant intent on demonizing trans people in service of an extremist authoritarian ideology—one that has precedent.

HHHRC proudly serves Oʻahu's trans community with our <u>Kuaʻana Project</u>. Our mission is to reduce harm, promote health, create wellness, and fight stigma in Hawai'i and the Pacific. We work with many individuals impacted by poverty, housing instability, and other social determinants of health. Many of our program clients and participants have also been deeply impacted by trauma, including histories of physical, sexual, and psychological abuse.

SD1 Relating to Health Care

Dear Chairs Dela Cruz and Rhoads, Vice Chairs Moriwaki and Gabbard, and Members of the Committees:

The American Civil Liberties Union of Hawai'i ("ACLU of Hawai'i") writes in **support of SB1150 SD1**. This bill expands protections established under ACT 2, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, to include gender-affirming health care services and clarifies what factors should (and should not) be considered when Hawai'i courts are asked to decline jurisdiction under the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act (UCCJEA) in cases involving children who obtain gender-affirming health care services.

The ACLU of Hawai'i is committed to defending LGBTQ+ individuals and their right to necessary health care services. We also believe in principles of federalism, which gives a State the right to rely on its Constitution and enact laws to more expansively protect the civil rights and liberties of its residents. It also means that another State cannot force the State of Hawai'i to enforce its laws that are contrary to the public policy of Hawai'i.

Each person has the right to bodily autonomy and bodily integrity. *Medical decisions* should be left to individuals and their doctors. Patients and their doctors should be trusted to make private medical decisions, not politicians. Parents have a fundamental right to make decisions about medical care for their children. And every family should have the freedom to love and support their child, transgender or not. Gender-affirming care is a critical part of helping transgender adolescents succeed in school, establish healthy relationships with their friends and family, and live authentically as themselves.

Transgender youth who are affirmed in their gender by their families do better in school, feel safer in their communities, establish healthy relationships with their parents and peers, and are better equipped to plan for their future. In contrast, denying them this support increases their likelihood of dropping out of school, increases their risk for substance use, worsens symptoms of depression and anxiety, and gravely increases their risk for suicide.

Importantly, **SB1150 SD1** does not create child custody jurisdiction where it would not already exist under current provisions of the UCCJEA. The proposed amendments to the UCCJEA (Sections 15 & 16) provide that Hawai'i family courts should consider a child's need for gender-affirming care in deciding whether to decline jurisdiction in favor of another state. The UCCJEA is implicated not only in child custody proceedings between parents, but any time the custody of a child is at issue, including in child welfare proceedings. Accordingly, the ACLU of Hawai'i believes these clarifications are necessary, as other states seek to punish parents who support gender-affirming care for their children. If Hawai'i has jurisdiction over a child in need of gender-affirming care, Hawai'i family courts should hesitate to decline jurisdiction in favor of a state whose laws are contrary to Hawaii's public policy of supporting access to gender-affirming care.

SB1150 SD1 not only protects young individuals and their parents from other state jurisdictions and from being separated based on the laws of those other states, this bill also provides for and protects the right to "medically necessary health care that respects the gender identity of the patient, as experienced and defined by the patient." This includes mental and behavioral health care.

The legal landscape across too much of the country is changing in harmful ways; as a result, many of our fundamental rights, dearly held and relied upon for generations, are being called into question.

The Executive Order that President Trump issued on January 28, 2025, directing all federal agencies to "immediately take appropriate steps to ensure that institutions receiving Federal research education grants end" gender affirming medical care for people under nineteen has an openly discriminatory purpose. Its effect is to prevent transgender people from expressing a gender identity different from their sex designated at birth—and expressing governmental disapproval of transgender people who, by definition, have a gender identity that does not align with their sex designated at birth.

These Orders are part of a government-wide effort by the Trump Administration to restrict legal protections and essential services for the transgender community. These orders contravene the State of Hawai'i's strong commitment to the protection of civil rights. Article I, Section 5 of the Hawai'i Constitution provides that "no person shall be denied the enjoyment of civil rights or be discriminated against in the exercise thereof because of race, religion, sex or ancestry."

Let's be clear – these discriminatory orders taken at the federal level are already having a chilling effect on the transgender community and their allies. People are scared, and they need to know that they will be protected if they continue to exercise their right to necessary medical care for themselves or their families.

We appreciate the legislature's commitment to safeguarding medically necessary treatments and **upholding freedom from unjustified government intrustions into bodily autonomy**, a core liberty interest protected by due process.

Dear Chair San Buenaventura, Chair Keohokalole, and the Members of the Committees,

Members of Indivisible Hawai'i thank you for this opportunity to testify again in strong support of SB1150 which would provide necessary protections to transgender people.

We urge you to approve this bill as badly needed in this time of growing discrimination against transgender people. The Trump administration has attempted by executive order to render transgender people simply non-existent: "It is the policy of the United States to recognize two sexes, male and female." See Executive Order "Defending Women from Gender Ideology Extremism and Restoring Biological Truth to the Federal Government." So are we now to pretend that our transgender citizens simply do not exist?

Here in a nutshell is what this bill would accomplish:

- Amendment to HRS Sec. 583A: Provides that courts of this state shall not enforce nor apply a law of another state which authorizes a state agency to remove a child from a parent because that parent allowed the child to receive gender affirming care.
- Amendment to HRS Sec. 323J: (1) Provides a definition of gender affirming care and clarifies that it be "medically necessary care"; (2) Provides that, subject to exceptions, information regarding a patient's receipt of gender-affirming care not be released without the patient's permission; (3) clarifies

that no Hawaii agency shall provide nonpublic information or expend Hawaii resources for any out-of-state or interstate investigation seeking to impose civil or criminal liability on a person for obtaining gender affirming healthcare or for providing gender affirming healthcare lawful in Hawaii; and (4) provides that the Hawaii Governor will not surrender a person for prosecution by another state for receiving gender affirming care or providing such care, unless the conduct was also illegal in Hawaii.

- Amendments to HRS Secs. 451J-11, 451J-12, 453-8, 453-8.6, 453D-12, 453D-13, 457-12, 457-12.5, 461-21.5, 465-13: Provides that medical and other licensed providers of care will not lose their licenses in Hawaii because they suffer conviction or loss of license in another state for providing gender affirming care which is legal in Hawaii.
- Amendments to HRS Secs. 583A-20 and 208: Provides that Hawaii courts, in deciding whether to exercise jurisdiction over a custody case between parents who live in different states, will not consider a removal of the child from the parent with legal custody as a factor weighing against the other parent when deciding whether Hawaii should accept jurisdiction if (1) the provision of gender affirming care to the child is one of the issues between the parents and (2) the law of the other state which could hear the case limits the ability of the parent to obtain gender affirming care for the child.
- Amendments to HRS Sec. 636C-9: Provides that Hawaii courts will not enforce foreign orders which restrict, burden, punish, penalize or otherwise interfere with the provision of gender affirming healthcare services which are lawful in this state.
- Amendment to HRS Sec. 836-2: Providing that judges will not grant requests to issue any summons requiring a person to appear as a witness in another state for a prosecution or grand jury investigation or proceeding which involves (1) someone seeking, receiving, or paying for gender affirming healthcare (or helping to do this) (2) someone providing gender affirming health care or responding to requests for information regarding the same (or helping to do this).

Contrary to the arguments submitted opposing this bill, **SB1150 contains no language** allowing children to be removed from their homes or from their parents, much less removed to be surgically mutilated. **It contains no language legalizing parental or**

other kidnapping of a child by anyone whatsoever, and such conduct continues to be subject to full prosecution under HRS Sec. 707-726 Custodial Interference in the first degree (Class C Felony), HRS Sec. 707 Custodial Interference in the second Degree (Misdemeanor), and HRS Sec. 707-20(G) Kidnapping (Class A Felony). Arguments that there is no such thing as gender dysphoria fly in the face of sound medical opinion and the experiences of the many transexual people who have provided comments and testimony to these committees.

Transgender people have always been among us and part of our society, and have long faced widespread discrimination. In its decision *Bostock v. Clayton Cnty*, 590 U.S. 644 (2020), the U.S. Supreme Court disallowed discrimination against transgender people in the employment context, finding that such discrimination was unlawful under the clear language of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 which bars discrimination based on sex. Despite *Bostock* and the application of its plain ruling barring such discrimination in countless other similarly worded statutes all over this country (including Hawaii's State Constitution which itself bars discrimination based on sex in Article 1, Section 5), the Trump Administration issued its executive order ignoring *Bostock*, simply attempting to erase transgender individuals altogether.

Hawaii has long been in the forefront of assuring protections for its citizens against discrimination. SB1150 provides specific and reasonable protections for our transgender citizens. It is important to provide these protections at this precarious time in our society.

Planned Parenthood Alliance Advocates – Hawai'i ("PPAA") strongly supports SB 1150 SD1, a bill that takes critical steps toward protecting gender affirming care providers. Fundamentally, providers and patients should not fear being investigated, jailed, or losing their license for providing or obtaining legal health care services.

Because of the national climate, gender affirming care providers and patients alike are living in fear of being criminally prosecuted by hostile states. In 2023 and 2024, we saw numerous states ban gender affirming care for both minors and adults, and this year, we are seeing attacks from the federal government. The law is crystal clear that gender affirming care provided in Hawai'i remains legal. Nonetheless, overzealous prosecutors and lawmakers in hostile states are pursuing laws that target providers and discipline outside of states' borders.

Lawmakers should also ensure Hawai'i health care providers do not have their licenses negatively impacted or face discipline locally due to the provision of gender affirming care health care, even if providers are subject to discipline, investigations, or criminal charges in other states. With gender affirming care bans for minors in place, providers in these states are being forced to violate their ethical duties and medical judgment for fear of prosecution, jail time, and loss of licensure. This bill aims to ensure that if a provider is prosecuted or otherwise disciplined in another state for providing patient-focused and medically appropriate care, they can continue to practice medicine in Hawai'i.

All people in our state need to be confident that Hawai'i law protects their right to access gender affirming care services, and providers should not be afraid to be jailed, lose their license, or be barred from ever practicing medicine again simply for providing basic, legal health care. Providers need to be confident that they can continue to focus on patient health and that Hawai'i will always be a safe place to do what is best for the person they are serving. Hawai'i Christian Coalition Strongly OPPOSES SB1150, relating to Healthcare

Aloha Chairs, Vice Chairs & Members of the Judiciary Committee and the Ways & Means Committee,

My name is Margaret Mejia, and I am writing on behalf of *Hawai'i Christian Coalition*, who has 35,000 members and represents approximately 130,000 people.

Hawaii Christian Coalition Strongly OPPOSES SB1150. First of all, this bill is dangerous in that it could permanently damage a child with, (in the words of Chloe Cole – who was transitioned from a biological female to a "male" and now is back to a female), "lifelong, irreversible harm." This bill preys upon vulnerable children who are not mature enough to make permanent choices. This bill is not about the autonomy of adults, but as adults, we need to protect our children.

Let's take into account children like Chloe Cole, who was born a biological female. At age 12 Chloe, like most young girls, was feeling insecure and awkward as she was going through puberty and didn't like her figure. At the time, this 12 year old thought that she was experiencing *gender dysphoria*, which is defined as emotional and psychological distress that can arise when a person's internal sense of gender doesn't align with the sex they were assigned at birth. So at age 13, Chloe Cole started a *medical transition*. She was given puberty blockers and testosterone so that she could transition into a boy. At age 15, she was given a double mastectomy where they removed both of her breasts.

Later, at age 16, Chloe Cole decided that she didn't want to become a boy and started the *de-transitioning process*. Chloe desperately wanted to go back to being a female. However, now, Chloe is left with (in her own words), "lifelong, irreversible harm." She is permanently left with a deep voice, excessive scarring on her chest, and many more physical attributes that she cannot change. They are permanent! **The puberty blocker they gave Chloe is NOT approved by the FDA and Chloe has side effects from the puberty blocker, today.**

Chloe Cole's story is not the only story like this. Many children, who went through *medical gender transitions*, are left with permanent damage to their bodies that they cannot reverse.

Children are not medically mature enough to make these permanent choices. On the top of page 2 where this bill, SB1150 describes "Gender-affirming health care services," it says that this includes "Medically necessary health care that respects the gender identity of the patient, as experienced and defined by the patient..." "the patient" is a minor, a child. A child has never experience puberty before. They have limited experiences, limited knowledge, and as you know, a child's brain, especially the frontal lobe where they make decisions is not developed yet. It develops slightly earlier in girls but for boys, it doesn't develop until they are about 25 years of age. Therefore, no child, no teenager can medically, or scientifically reasonably make a decision regarding their gender identity.

Hawai'i should instead, create laws that safeguard minors from adults who may influence them towards ANY irreversible procedures, especially since they may cause "lifelong, irreversible harm." **As legislators, you have the responsibility to uphold** the well-being of the children and make sure there are guardrails to protect our keiki.

Helping children to change their gender does NOT prevent them from committing suicide. There is no current or accurate scientific data to back that claim. As a matter of fact, in the case of Chloe Cole, who was born a biological female and transitioned to a male and is now de-transitioning into a female, she is now experiencing suicidal thoughts over the fact that she cannot change the permanent damage that was done to her body and she now has to receive ongoing mental health services.

This bill also undermines Parental Rights. I didn't see anything in this bill regarding parental consent. This bill is intentionally not considering the rights of the parents. The government should not trump the rights of the parent. The parent or guardian is a steward of their children, not the government.

On the top of page 10, it also refers to "An individual accessing gender-affirming health care..." Once again, Children are not medically mature enough to make these permanent choices. The frontal lobe in their brain which helps people make decisions, is not yet developed in a child. These decisions can cause lifelong, permanent damage to these children. Even the article on the The Teenage Brain on the Transgender Trend website, Dr. Sallie Baxendale says that the teen's brain doesn't fully develop until they are in their mid 20's.

Some in the medical field believe that puberty blockers or hormone blockers also affect an individual's neurotransmitters. Neurotransmitters are the "messengers that facilitate communication between neurons in the brain and nervous system and influence our mood, emotions, stress, responses and cognition. Once again, many of these puberty blockers are not approved by the FDA.

Some people say that Governor Josh Green wants Hawai'i to be a "sanctuary state" for Abortions for minors, and for Sex changes for minors. Wow! I would rather Hawai'i be known for its beautiful beaches, pristine mountains and waterfalls, than for abortions and sex changes for minors.

Aloha Chair Dela Cruz, Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Moriwaki, Vice Chair Gabbard, and Members of the Committees.

Lambda Law Hawai'i, a Law Student Association at the William S. Richardson School of Law, at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, strongly supports SB1150 SD1. This bill expands the protections established under Act 2 of 2023 to include gender-affirming healthcare services. It also clarifies Hawai'i jurisdiction for child custody and child enforcement act cases for children whose parents choose to authorize gender affirming care (GAC) for their keiki. Finally, it protects healthcare providers who provide GAC from professional licensing penalties incurred in states who are hostile to such care.

Gender affirming care covers a wide range of practices that are medically sound and supported by experts as best practice for many people, including trans and nonbinary children and adults, but also encompassing cis children and adults. The negative rhetoric that has been building against GAC, which has been unfortunately imported into Hawai'i as of late, is unfounded and biased against trans people, who are a minority in our population. We must ensure that this life-saving care is not criminalized in the Aloha State, and that parents who choose to allow their children to pursue this care (as well as doctors who provide this care) will not be subject to the punitive and cruel laws of other states.

This bill would not force anyone to engage in any health care practices they disagree with, nor would it impose any obligations on parents, healthcare providers, or children to do anything they aren't already doing. This bill simply **protects a vulnerable population facing attacks from**

other states, and shields those who support them from criminalization and other penalization as other jurisdictions attempt to reach into our own for such purposes.

No matter what the current U.S. President says, trans and nonbinary people are here to stay, and we deserve and must be guaranteed access to the medicines and practices that we require to live happy and healthy lives. Let us continue to be a leader in materially respecting the dignity of all the people of Hawai'i, including māhū, fa'afafine, bakla, and LGBTQ+ people who make our communities that much stronger.

Hawai'i Children's Action Network Speaks! **STRONGLY SUPPORT S.B. No. 1150 S.D. 1**, a crucial piece of legislation that expands protections for individuals seeking gender-affirming health care and ensures that Hawai'i remains a safe place for children, families, and health care providers from harmful out-of-state legal actions.

As an organization committed to the well-being of Hawai'i's children and families, we recognize that access to necessary medical care is essential for ensuring the health and safety of young people. Gender-affirming healthcare is supported by every major medical organization, including the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Medical Association because it is proven to save lives. Young people who receive this care experience improved mental health outcomes, while those denied access face an increased risk of depression, anxiety, and suicide.

Why SB 1150 SD1 Matters for Hawai'i's Children and Families

1. Ensuring Access to Essential Health Care

Across the country, states are enacting laws that criminalize gender-affirming healthcare, forcing families to choose between their children's well-being and their legal safety. S.B. No. 1150 S.D. 1 ensures that individuals in Hawai'i—residents or visitors—can receive the care they need without fear of legal consequences from other states. No family should have to flee their home or compromise their children's health because of discriminatory policies that seek to undermine their right to make medical decisions.

2. Keeping Families Together

A loving and supportive family is one of the most important factors for children's well-being. Yet, some states have gone so far as to threaten parents/guardians with legal action or loss of custody simply for ensuring their children receive medically necessary care. S.B. No. 1150 S.D. 1 ensures that Hawai'i will not participate in the unjust separation of families based on out-of-state laws that attack gender-affirming care. Parents must have the right to make informed, medically sound decisions for their keiki without fear of government interference.

3. Protecting Privacy for Families and Health Care Providers

Medical privacy and patient confidentiality are fundamental rights. S.B. No. 1150 S.D. 1 reinforces these values by ensuring that Hawai'i will not assist in out-of-state investigations targeting LGBTQ+ individuals, their families, or their healthcare providers. It also protects healthcare professionals from being penalized under another state's discriminatory policies and prevents enforcement of subpoenas, warrants, and extradition requests related to lawful medical care in Hawai'i.

4. Honoring Hawai'i's Cultural Legacy of Inclusion

Hawai'i has a deep cultural history of embracing gender diversity. In Native Hawaiian society, **māhū**—individuals who embody both masculine and feminine traits—were honored as caretakers, teachers, and healers. Unlike Western colonial perspectives that introduced rigid gender binaries and discrimination, traditional Hawaiian culture recognized and valued māhū as an integral part of the community. This history reflects the values of aloha and inclusion that continue to define Hawai'i today.

By passing S.B. No. 1150 S.D. 1, Hawai'i reaffirms its commitment to protecting LGBTQ+ individuals, not just through policy but in alignment with our islands' cultural values of respect, acceptance, and support for all members of our community.

5. Affirming Hawai'i's Commitment to Equity and Justice

Hawai'i has long been at the forefront of LGBTQ+ rights, from challenging same-sex marriage bans to enacting strong anti-discrimination protections. As other states move to restrict access to gender-affirming care and criminalize those who seek it, Hawai'i must continue to lead with compassion and justice. S.B. No. 1150 S.D. 1 sends a clear message: our state will not be complicit in efforts to deny people their right to make personal medical decisions.

Hawai'i must continue to be a place where all keiki and families are safe, supported, and free to access the healthcare they need. S.B. No. 1150 S.D. 1 is a necessary step in ensuring that LGBTQ+ youth and their families are protected from unjust legal actions and that healthcare providers can continue to offer evidence-based care without fear of punishment.

For these reasons, HCAN Speaks! urge the committees to pass S.B. No. 1150 S.D. 1 and uphold Hawai'i's legacy of inclusion, medical privacy, and family autonomy.

SB 1150, SD1, RELATING TO HEALTH CARE

FEBRUARY 26, 2025 · JDC/WAM HEARING

POSITION: Support.

RATIONALE: Imua Alliance <u>supports</u> SB 1150, SD1, relating to health care, which expands the protections established under Act 2, SLH 2023, to include gender-affirming health care services; and clarifies jurisdiction under the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act for cases involving children who obtain gender-affirming health care services.

Everyone deserves access to the medical care they need. This includes gender-affirming care for transgender individuals. The Trump administration signed an executive order on January 28, 2025 that aims to block access to gender-affirming care for children and young adults. The order seeks to cut off federal funding from institutions that provide hormone therapy, puberty blockers, and surgical treatment for people under 19.

Washington, Oregon, and Minnesota have already filed lawsuits opposing the order. According to the three states, the order particularly targets medical care that is recommended for gender dysphoria, when a person's internal sense of gender identity conflicts with their sex assigned at birth. The lawsuit calls the order "cruel and baseless," and accuses the executive branch of "attempts to dictate medical care by executive fiat." The states argue that the order violates the Fifth Amendment's equal protection guarantee by singling out transgender individuals for discrimination.

On February 4th, Attorney General Anne Lopez joined a coalition of fourteen attorneys general to reaffirm their pledge to protect access to gender-affirming care. The coalition released the following statement: "As state attorneys general, we stand firmly in support of healthcare policies that respect

the dignity and rights of all people. Health care decisions should be made by patients, families and doctors, not by a politician trying to restrict freedoms. Gender-affirming care is essential, lifesaving medical treatment that supports individuals in living as their authentic selves."

The World Medical Association (WMA), an international group representing physicians from 114 National Medical Associations, states: "The WMA emphasizes that everyone has the right to determine one's own gender and recognizes the diversity of possibilities in this respect. The WMA calls for physicians to uphold each individual's right to self-identification with regard to gender...The WMA urges that every effort be made to make individualized, multi-professional, interdisciplinary, and affordable transgender healthcare (including speech therapy, hormonal treatment, surgical interventions and mental healthcare) available to all people who experience gender incongruence in order to reduce or to prevent pronounced gender dysphoria."

In a coordinated push led by national anti-LGBTQ+ hate groups, legislators across the country have overridden the recommendations of the views of the medical establishment and introduced hundreds of bills that target transgender, non-binary, and gender-expansive youth's access to age-appropriate, medically necessary care. By preventing doctors from providing care or threatening to take children away from parents who support their child in their transition, these efforts prevent transgender, non-binary, and gender-expansive youth from accessing medically necessary, safe health care backed by decades of research and supported by every major medical association representing over 1.3 million US doctors, according to the Human Rights Campaign.

LGBTQ+ youth, who comprise an estimated 40 percent of the runaway and homeless youth population in the United States, are exponentially more likely to fall prey to human traffickers because of discrimination, family and community trauma, and a longing for comfort and acceptance (an estimated 26 percent of LGBTQ+ adolescents are rejected by their families and put out of their homes simply for being open and honest about who they are). In providing care for victims of human trafficking, we have heard their stories hundreds of times. Eliminating access to gender-affirming care only worsens this cycle of alienation and abuse. On the other hand, enshrining access into state law is s step toward ensuring that transgender youth can receive the care they need to live meaningful, fulfilling, and healthy lives.

Chairs and Members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary,

The Trevor Project writes in support of **SB 1150**, which would safeguard providers and access to legal, best-practice health care for transgender people in Hawai'i. Transgender medical care has been shown to significantly lower suicide risk among transgender and nonbinary youth. Providers of this care can be safeguarded for years to come through the enactment of SB 1150, and we encourage you to vote yes on SB 1150 to pass it out of committee.

The Trevor Project is the leading suicide prevention and crisis intervention organization for LGBTQ+ young people. Trevor offers 24/7 crisis services, connecting highly trained counselors with LGBTQ+ young people whenever they need support. To drive prevention efforts, The Trevor Project also operates robust research, advocacy, education, and peer support programs.

LGBTQ+ young people are not inherently prone to suicide risk because of their sexual orientation or gender identity. Rather, they are placed at higher risk by the mistreatment and stigmatization they experience in society. According to https://project's 2024 U.S. National Survey on the Mental Health of LGBTQ+ Young People. 39% of LGBTQ young people seriously considered attempting suicide in the past year, including more than half of transgender and nonbinary young people. In Hawai'i, 52% of LGBTQ+ youth seriously considered suicide and 17% attempted suicide in 2022.

Fortunately, access to transgender medical care can protect the lives of transgender youth. Transgender medical care for youth is associated with positive mental health outcomes including showing promise for reducing suicide risk. In February 2022, the *Journal of the American Medical Association* published new research that found transgender medical care for transgender teens was associated with 60% lower odds of moderate or severe depression and 73% lower odds of suicidality over a 12-month follow-up.

Hawai'i is a leader in providing best practice medical care to LGBTQ+ young people, including access to transgender medical care. Enacting SB 1150 presents a prime opportunity to protect providers and access to this care. As unfounded attacks on transgender young people continue nationwide, it's crucial that Hawai'i joins 16 other states and Washington,



D.C. in enacting this proactive measure to shield Hawai'i's providers of health care for transgender people from attacks based on other states' laws.

For these reasons, The Trevor Project supports the passage of SB 1150 and encourages you to vote yes on the legislation to advance it out of committee. My name is Tuia'ana Scanlan, IATSE International Trustee and President of IATSE Local 665, the union representing technicians and artisans in the entertainment industry in Hawai'i. **IATSE 665 strongly supports SB1150 SD1**, relating to health care.

This critical legislation is a bold step to safeguard the healthcare rights of Hawai'i residents and uphold the values we cherish as a community. This is a state's rights issue, ensuring that the laws we enact in Hawai'i are protected from interference by laws passed in other states on the continent. Well, aloha and mahalo for dropping S.B. No. 1150, the "Health Care Access Protection Act," into our laps—a steaming pile of woke garbage so absurd it makes a lava flow look tame. Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in **strong support** of SB 1150, **Relating to Health Care: Gender-Affirming Care**.

My name is **Efren Berrones**, and I serve as the Co-Chair of the **Oʻahu Youth Action Board (OYAB)**—a board composed of youth with lived experience of homelessness on Oʻahu, advocating for policies that directly impact houseless young people. We firmly believe that any decisions affecting us must include our voices, perspectives, and lived experiences.

SB 1150 is a **critical measure** that would have a **profound impact** on our community. According to the National Network for Youth, an estimated **40% of youth experiencing homelessness are LGBTQ+**, with family rejection due to sexual orientation or gender identity being a leading cause. While I could cite alarming statistics that underscore the urgency of protecting LGBTQ+ youth, I believe it is equally important to **humanize this issue**.

I grew up in Houston, Texas, raised by a single mother who found refuge in a church after leaving a domestic violence shelter. This religious community was our only support system—they sent me to private school, helped with groceries and rent, and lifted us out of poverty. But their support was **conditional**. When I came out, all of it disappeared. I suddenly found myself lost and alone.

Fortunately, I had chosen to attend college in Hawai'i, a place known for its strong protections and embrace of the LGBTQ+ community.

This community became my refuge. Today, I am proud to call Hawai'i home, to give back, and to advocate for the next generation of LGBTQ+ youth who, like me, need a safe place to belong.

These young people are **not just statistics**—they are **real people** who are **four times more likely** to attempt suicide and **120% more likely** to experience homelessness than their heterosexual peers, simply because of **who they are**. Hawai'i has a **longstanding cultural tradition** of recognizing and respecting aikāne, māhū, and gender-diverse individuals. It is imperative that we reject the **harmful colonial narratives** that are sweeping across the country and instead **uphold** the **values of inclusion**, **aloha**, and **respect**.

Now is the time for Hawai'i to lead.

I strongly urge you to pass SB 1150 and ensure that Hawai'i remains a safe and affirming place for the LGBTQ+ community.

As an organization dedicated to protecting children and strengthening families, we believe that parents should be the first and foremost educators of their children. No law should create a system that purposely excludes them from crucial decisions affecting their child's well-being. We all agree that any policy impacting minors—especially those involving medical interventions and early childhood education—must be grounded in scientific evidence, ethical considerations, and the best interests of our keiki. Unfortunately, research does not support promoting gender ideology or medical transitions for minors.

Research does not support medical interventions for gender-confused minors¹.

Medical interventions such as puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, and surgeries are experimental and lack long-term safety studies. The FDA has not approved puberty blockers for gender dysphoria, and European countries (such as Sweden, Finland, and the UK) have reversed or restricted their use due to safety concerns. Our concern is that minors lack the maturity to consent to irreversible medical procedures that will have lifelong consequences. Allowing minors to make these decisions without parental consent is not only poor public policy but also a threat to family unity.

<u>Our bottom line is that parents—not schools or policymakers—should be the primary educators</u> on moral and sensitive topics concerning gender and sexuality.

Medical transition has not been shown to reduce youth suicidesii.

Advocates often claim that medical transition is necessary to prevent youth suicide, but peer-reviewed studies contradict this claim. In fact, quite the opposite may be true. Swedish longitudinal studies found that individuals who underwent medical transition had higher suicide rates compared to the general population. That means any promise made in saying that medical transition would resolve any mental health struggles is both misleading and dangerous, as gender dysphoria is often linked to other psychological conditions.

Childhood gender dysphoria usually resolves by adulthood.iii

There is research that shows that 80-95% of children with gender dysphoria eventually accept their biological sex by adulthood if not affirmed in a transgender identity. Psychologists recognize that gender confusion in children is often a phase, influenced by emotional development, peer relationships, and societal factors. Public policy should never encourage social and medical transitions that prevent a natural resolution while pushing our keiki toward unnecessary medicalization.

The dramatic increase in gender dysphoria is likely being driven by social factorsiv.

In the past decade, cases of gender dysphoria have surged, especially among adolescent girls, a demographic not historically affected. Studies suggest social contagion and peer influence play a significant role in this rise, as online communities and social media promote transgender identities. We must be cautious and strongly hesitant of any attempt to ignore social influences or rush to medical interventions without understanding the broader context.

Sex education for early elementary school children, including transgender ideology, has not been shown by research to be beneficial.

No scientific research supports the claim that introducing young children to transgender ideology improves mental health or well-being. Early exposure to complex gender concepts can cause confusion and distress in young minds.

In closing, it is our moral and societal responsibility to protect vulnerable keiki from experimental medical procedures and ideologies. We must work together to ensure that policies affecting minors are based on truth, compassion, and the best available research—not on ideological pressure or social trends.

Hawaii Women Lawyers is a lawyer's trade organization that aims to improve the lives and careers of women in all aspects of the legal profession, influence the future of the legal profession, and enhance the status of women and promote equal opportunities for all.

Hawaii Women Lawyers submits testimony in **strong support of S.B. 1150, S.D. 1**, which seeks to expands the protections established under Act 2, SLH 2023, to include gender affirming health care services and clarify jurisdiction under the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act for cases involving children who obtain gender affirming health care services.

S.B. 1150 would serve to further the important protections codified by Act 2, SLH 3 to include gender-affirming health care services, as well as to protect patients, parents of minors receiving these services, and our medical professionals providing these services from the gross overreach of other states seeking to enforce their draconian laws via subpoenas intended for civil or criminal proceedings.

Hawaii Women Lawyers strongly supports the right to bodily autonomy and the right of all people to seek healthcare when, where, and how as an individual may deem appropriate for themselves. Individuals should be able to make personal healthcare decisions without fear of harassment or legal repercussion, and passing S.B. 1150 S.B. 1 would be a huge step in achieving this goal.

Opponents of gender-affirming care often rely on misinformation and fear-mongering (e.g., calling S.B. 1150 the "Hawaii Kidnapping Bill"), but the reality is that such opposition flies in the face of established research and denying this care puts people, and especially young people, at greater risk. Gender-affirming care is supported by leading medical organizations, including the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American Medical Association, and the Endocrine Society. These experts recognize that affirming a young person's gender identity through appropriate medical and psychological care can be lifesaving. Studies consistently show that transgender and non-binary youth who receive gender-affirming care experience lower rates of depression, anxiety, and suicidality compared to those who are denied such care. Medical decisions should be based on best practices and the needs of individual patients, not political agendas.

We are extremely proud of our own Attorney General, Anne Lopez, for joining the coalition of fourteen attorneys general to reaffirm their pledge to protect access to gender-affirming care and we applaud the Legislature's efforts enshrine the right to gender-affirming care for our gender-diverse community in the State of Hawaii.

For the above reasons, we strongly support S.B. 1150, S.D. 1 and respectfully request that the Committees pass this measure.

By doing so, we can enhance the validity and robustness of the findings, ultimately leading to better-informed decisions in clinical practice, especially legislation.

Given the current shortcomings in methodological rigor within the existing literature, it is crucial that we address these areas of concern to ensure the **safety and well-being** of individuals seeking gender-affirming care. I suggest supporting measures that help with research rather than jumping to conclusions that this bill will prevent individuals from taking their lives.

Dear Chairs Rhoads, Gabbard, Dela Cruz, Moriwaki, and members of the Senate Judiciary and Ways and Means Committees:

My name is Gerald Montano. I give this testimony as a Hawai`i-licensed physician with an American Board of Pediatrics certification in general pediatrics and specialty board certification in adolescent medicine. I have over ten years of experience in gender-affirming care and cared for over five-hundred transgender and gender-diverse youth and young adults. Additionally, I have conducted research, scholarship, and teaching in LBGTQIA Health.

I am asking for the Hawai'i legislature to protect: (a) <u>healthcare access for transgender and gender-diverse youth</u>, (b) <u>parents' rights in seeking healthcare for their child</u>, and (c) <u>a healthcare provider's right to practice compassionate</u>, <u>evidence-based medicine</u> **by passing SB1150**, which expands the protections established under Act 2, SLH 2023, to explicitly include gender-affirming health care services and clarifies jurisdiction under the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act for cases involving children who obtain such care.

Gender-affirming care is the process of affirming and expressing one's internal sense of gender, rather than the gender assigned to them at birth, through behavioral health support and medical/surgical interventions. It is a century-old medical practice. The clear evidence supporting the practice of gender-affirming care has led to all the major medical and mental health professional associations, including the American Academy of Pediatrics, the Endocrine Society, the World Professional Association of Transgender Health, and the American Medical Association—which together represent most physicians—to recommend gender-affirming care for children and adolescents. Additionally, there are thirty-two mainstream national and international organizations supportive of gender-affirming care.

However, gender-affirming care has come under attack. Since February 2020, at least 186 bills have been filed in US state legislatures to restrict access to gender-affirming care. ^{1,2} These bills would bar medical providers from prescribing gender-affirming hormone therapy (including puberty blockers) or performing gender-affirming surgeries on adolescents under age 18 years. ^{1,2} In addition to prohibiting specific medical interventions, these bills would also mandate jail time and fines for medical providers, and in some cases parents, who seek gender-affirming care for their transgender or gender-diverse children. ^{1,3} Most recently, the current US President issued an executive order aimed at restricting access to gender-affirming health care for minors. The order calls for a complete reversal of federal support for gender-affirming care for youth under age 19.⁴

Studies consistently find that transgender and gender-diverse youth are highly vulnerable to mental and behavioral health problems, including depression, anxiety, and substance use.⁵ A large, multi-state survey found that 35% of transgender youth reported having attempted suicide in the past year.⁶

It is important to understand that these poor outcomes are not because of one's gender identity, but rather due to a combination of gender dysphoria—the experience of significant distress about not having the physical characteristics of the gender one identifies with—and the shame and discrimination they face because of their gender identity, thus the need for gender-affirming care.

The evidence and clinical guidelines written by the Endocrine Society, WPATH Standards of Care, and the University of California at San Diego's Center of Excellence for Transgender Health and recommendations from organization like the AAP and the Endocrine Society inform the medical and mental health care of transgender and gender diverse youth. Guidelines on gender-affirming care are thorough, individualized, and family centered. Any decisions on gender-affirming care are made together by the multidisciplinary care team, family, and child and will require parental permission.

Gender-affirming care is not just about medicines. It is also about social support. For example, the only recommendation for the treatment of school-age, pre-pubescent children is allowing the child to wear the clothes and hair they want, use preferred name and pronouns, and play with the toys they like. This is referred to as social transition. This treatment brings tremendous benefits for transgender and gender-diverse youth, including decreased depression and anxiety, ^{10,11} and improvement of school wellbeing, decreasing truancy, and lower levels of bullying. ¹²

Medications in gender-affirming care are only given when: (1) a child has already started puberty, which can be distressing to youth with gender dysphoria, and (2) has displayed insistence, consistence and persistence in their gender identity. Not all transgender and gender diverse youth need or would like to use medications to affirm their gender identity. Puberty blockers, which are completely reversible, help give time for parents, youth, and providers to consider less reversible options and allows the youth not to have to deal with going through the puberty that is wrong for them and therefore decreases their distress. Puberty blockers are safe medications that have been used for many decades previously for children who are starting puberty too early or what is referred to as precocious puberty.¹³ We have multiple studies on the reversibility and on the safety and psychosocial benefits of these medications for gender dysphoria, ¹⁴⁻²¹ including similar psychosocial outcomes in young adulthood to cisgender youth and rates of suicidality three times lower than in youth who did not have access to puberty blocking medications.²⁰

Hormone therapy, like estrogen or testosterone, are partially reversible options for treatment. This allows for a young person to essentially go through the puberty that aligns with their gender identity. It is important to note that changes occur over a period of several years, like the natural puberty process. There is strong evidence that these hormones are safe and provide psychosocial benefit to youth experiencing gender dysphoria. 15,22-32 Hormone therapy does not sterilize. Many

studies have shown that people who have started hormone therapy are still able to have children after stopping or even when on hormone therapy.³³ This is why contraception is still recommended for all transgender and gender diverse people on gender affirming hormones.

For many transgender and non-binary individuals their chest and genitals may be a significant cause of distress, and they may choose to have a variety of gender-affirming surgical procedures to achieve alignment of their body with their gender identity. It is also important to note that many transgender individuals do not want or are not able to have gender-affirming surgeries for a variety of reasons. Most of these surgeries are offered to those eighteen and above and are not the main treatments for gender-affirming care for youth. The most common surgical procedure among older adolescents is masculinizing chest surgery, which is often referred to as top surgery. For those trans-masculine youth who are born designated female but have already developed breast tissue, they frequently experience severe distress related to their chest, almost universally wearing chest binders to flatten the appearance of the chest and/or withdrawing socially. Top surgery which involves removing breast tissue to create a more masculine chest appearance has been shown to have tremendous social and psychological benefit for transmasculine adolescents and young adults. Any genital reassignment surgery, if desired and appropriate, happens after age 18 and these procedures have shown similar benefit.³⁴

Several studies show that anti-trans legislation has led to an increased mental health burden to transgender and gender-diverse youth^{35,36}, including increased rates of depression, suicidality, and anxiety when compared to their cisgender peers. In addition, these policies have been associated with increased likelihood of violence against transgender and gender-diverse youth based on their gender identity.³⁷ It would also burden Hawai`i`s healthcare resources as untreated gender dysphoria may result in unnecessary use of medical and mental health services that do not address it.³⁸ In contrast, nondiscrimination laws and other inclusive policies have been associated with decreased depressive symptoms and nicotine use among transgender and gender-diverse youth.³⁹

Parents of transgender and gender-diverse youth who have lost access to evidence-based gender-affirming care have reported an increase in symptoms of anxiety, stress, depression and hypervigilance in their transgender or gender-diverse children.³⁷ In places where bills have been proposed but have not passed (e.g., in Florida, there are laws that criminalize caregivers who allow their child to receive gender-affirming care), <u>caregivers must make the agonizing decision to move to another state where gender-affirming care is protected.⁴⁰</u>

Gender-affirming care bans have also impacted medical and mental health providers. <u>Providers are leaving the states where these bans are implemented</u>. In cases where providers can still provide gender-affirming care, they face ethical dilemmas in providing care due to possible loss of license or being sued because the patient they treated has changed their gender identity. Additionally, providers are forced to make a mandated report of child abuse if a parent seeks their help regarding their child's gender identity. One study showed that the overall number of mental health providers who offered trans-specific care to trans adolescents was fewer in states with more restrictive laws/policies for transgender people. Hawai'i struggles to recruit competent healthcare providers, with 732 physicians needed to meet its citizens' healthcare

needs.⁴⁵ Any policy that would restrict or threaten to restrict the provision of care would hamper Hawai'i's efforts to recruit and retain healthcare providers.

Transgender and gender diverse youth face many threats to their health and wellbeing, especially with the recent onslaught of bills and executive orders restricting access to their healthcare. Additionally, states that have banned gender-affirming care have forced many families to leave to seek evidence-based healthcare for their children in other states. Finally, Hawai'i has a healthcare professional shortage and struggles to recruit and retain healthcare professionals. To protect transgender and gender-diverse youth, provide a reason for our ohana to stay in Hawai'i and recruit and retain healthcare professionals, **I strongly urge passage of SB1150**. To Whom it May Concern,

I am writing in strong support of SB1150 SD1. I am a Board Certified Psychiatrist and a World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH) GEI SOC8 Certified Member, who trained locally, is licensed in the state, and continues to teach, mentor, and collaborate on research with local providers.

Right now, the bodily autonomy and rights of transgender people across the U.S. are being threatened or limited in frightening ways. In the last few years, hundreds of bills have been proposed or made into law. This is happening despite strong evidence that supporting transgender people and providing them access to gender affirming care saves lives and improves mental health outcomes [1]. For example, research from the Family Acceptance Project show that LGBTQ youth who experience low family acceptance of their LGBTQ identity report higher levels of depression, substance use, suicidal ideation, and suicide attempts [2]. Conversely, a large national sample of LGBTQ youth found that being respectful of a youth's gender identity was associated with just over 40% lower odds of them attempting suicide in the past year [3]. The measures outlined in SB1150 would help safeguard Hawai'i's transgender community.

In 2023, the State of Hawaii's Department of Health released a statement on rights and public health, acknowledging that all TGD persons "...should have an equitable opportunity to achieve their optimal state of health and well-being." It recognized the unique contributions of māhūwahine, māhūkāne, transgender, gender diverse people, and other populations to the diversity of Hawai'i, and the importance of protecting them from discrimination. SB1150 will help.

This legislation ensures that our state remains a sanctuary for bodily autonomy and medical privacy, rejecting the influence of restrictive laws from other states that seek to punish people for seeking or providing care. I strongly urge you to pass this bill and continue Hawai'i's leadership in defending human rights and medical freedom. The state should not allow laws from other jurisdictions to undermine the rights of Hawai'i's residents to receive lawful health care. As a physician who provides gender affirming care, I believe SB1150 SD1 is essential to protect TGD persons and their families.

Aloha Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Gabbard, Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Moriwaki and Members of the joint Senate Judiciary and Ways and Means Committees:

It has become clear that extremists across the nation have made it their priority to target women and members of the LGBTQIA+ community by stripping away their rights, especially access to health care.

Dozens of states across the nation have either passed or are considering passing laws prohibiting gender affirming health care to people of ALL AGES. These laws target providers and recipients, making it a criminal offense to provide gender affirming care. My name is Christine Andrews and I am a resident of Wailuku, Maui. As a friend, family member, and ally of trans people, I submit this testimony today in strong SUPPORT of S.B. 1150, SD1, relating to health care.

I hope that the members of the Committees agree with me that every person has the fundamental right to access the health care they need without fear of discrimination, prejudice, or barriers to treatment that supports their mental, physical, and emotional well-being. Unfortunately, across the country right now, extreme politicians desperate to gain power are attacking the LGBTQ+ community, particularly transgender and non-binary youth, and weaponizing critical issues to rally support around anti-LGBTQ+ legislation. I ask that you act now to protect the people of Hawai'i, and LGBTQ+ youth in particular, from these escalating and harmful attacks.

The health care that transgender people need, sometimes referred to as gender-affirming care or transition-related care, is health care for transgender people of all ages. It includes a range of services, including mental health care, medical care, and social services. At all ages, clear, well-established, evidence-based standards of care exist. Gender-affirming care helps transgender and non-binary people live openly and authentically as their true selves. Just like any other form of health care, it also helps transgender and non-binary people live safe and healthy lives.

Gender-affirming care is treatment for a diagnosis of gender dysphoria, which impacts many transgender and non-binary people. Gender dysphoria happens when one's gender identity does not match their sex as assigned at birth. According to the Human Rights Campain, trans people's health care is always delivered in age-appropriate, evidence-based ways, and decisions to provide care are made in consultation with doctors and parents, just like health care for all other people. Collectively representing more than 1.3 million doctors across the United States, every major medical and mental health organization — including the American Medical Association, the American Academy of Pediatrics, and the American Psychological Association — recognizes that it is medically necessary to support people in affirming their gender identity.

Gender-affirming care for transgender people is best-practice, medically necessary health care. And research has consistently found that receipt of gender-affirming care can significantly improve the lives of people who receive it. A recent study from the Trevor Project shows that transgender youth with access to hormone replacement therapy medications have lower rates of depression and are at a lower risk for suicide. A study by Stanford University School of Medicine found that positive mental health outcomes were higher for transgender people who accessed hormone replacement therapy medications as teenagers, versus those who accessed it as adults. A third study, published in the New England Journal of Medicine, found that two years after initiating hormone replacement therapy medications, transgender youth reported higher levels of life satisfaction and positive affect, and lower levels of gender dysphoria, depression, and anxiety. Previous studies have also found that transgender and non-binary youth who are able to receive puberty blockers report positive psychosocial impacts, including increased well-being and decreased depression. Other recent studies have found that receipt of puberty blockers can dramatically reduce risk of suicidality — in some cases by over 70% — among transgender youth, compared to those who were unable to access desired treatment.

Similar results have been seen for transgender adults: In two separate systematic reviews, one focused on 53 studies exploring mental health following gender-affirming surgeries, and the second focused on 29 studies exploring mental health impact across multiple forms of gender-affirming care, authors found that quality of life and happiness increased among trans adults following receipt of gender-affirming care, and depression, anxiety, suicidality, and suicide attempts, and gender dysphoria were reduced.

Previous studies have found that de-transitioning is quite rare —with some studies finding levels of de-transition and regret as low as 1% or 2%. Transgender youth who meet criteria for gender dysphoria and who undergo social or medical transition are actually the least likely to de-transition — and those vast majority of transgender youth remain consistent and persistent in their gender identity over time: One recent study, published in the academic journal Pediatrics, followed over 300 transgender youth after first initiating social transition, and found that over 92% remained consistent and persistent in their gender identity 5 years later. However, evidence-based standards of care exist to ensure that no one, regardless of their age, undergoes any permanent, irreversible changes without informed consent and careful consultation with medical and mental health care providers.

Based upon the foregoing, I request that you pass S.B. 1150, SD1 to help protect members of our Hawai`i community and especially LGBTQ+ people from attacks on their civil rights.

Like so many parents, I want nothing more than for my child to be happy, healthy, and safe. But as the mother of a transgender person, I have witnessed firsthand the struggles that come with simply trying to exist in a world that so often refuses to understand or accept them. I have seen the anxiety and fear that come from feeling unseen. I watched my child go through nights of tears and fears, wondering if they will ever be accepted for who they are. And I have also seen the incredible difference that gender-affirming care makes—how access to supportive doctors, mental health professionals, and the right medical care has given my child a sense of hope, confidence, and a future they can look forward to.

The statistics make it painfully clear: transgender youth are at a much higher risk of depression, anxiety, and suicide. But what those numbers don't capture is what that looks like for a parent—watching your child withdraw, struggle, or lose hope simply because they are not given the opportunity to be themselves. Gender-affirming care isn't just about hormones or medical treatments; it's about providing young people with the support they need to live. It's about giving them the same chance at happiness that every other child deserves.

There is so much misinformation about this kind of care, especially when it comes to puberty blockers. Let me be clear: these are not dangerous or irreversible. They simply provide time—time for a young person to fully understand who they are without the pressure of unwanted and distressing physical changes. Time for families like mine to navigate this journey with the guidance of medical professionals. Time to make informed decisions that are in the best interest of the child.

As a parent, I cannot understand why anyone would try to take away the care that allows my child to thrive. These are deeply personal medical decisions that should be made between families, doctors, and patients—not politicians. Every major medical organization, from the

American Academy of Pediatrics to the American Medical Association, recognizes the importance of gender-affirming care. Denying it is not just harmful—it is dangerous. Without it, more children will struggle, more families will suffer, and more lives will be lost.

All children deserve a future where they can grow into the person they are meant to be. I urge you to support policies that protect access to gender-affirming care, so that every transgender person—youth and adult alike—can live with dignity, safety, and hope.

Aloha Senators.

My name is DeAnn Iman and I live in Kona, Hawaii. I am the mother of a wonderful, strong, and intelligent transgender child, who was born in Hawaii. I am here today to testify in support of SB1150, a bill that will protect access to gender-affirming care for my child and countless others, and prevent the prosecution of parents like me who are simply doing what is best for their children.

My child began to make confident, persistent, and clear statements that he was not comfortable with his birth assigned gender identity at the age of 5. As a parent, it was heartbreaking to see him struggle with this internal conflict, but it was also clear to me that he was trying to communicate something that was very real and very important for my child to know they are loved entirely and completely. As he grew older, his understanding of himself became even clearer, and his persistence in expressing that he was not the gender assigned to him at birth grew stronger. By the time he was 7, we knew we knew our child deserved to have access to professionals to help support his internal struggles and help him navigate through the very real struggles that are unique for each child. He has been under the care of trained mental health professionals and additional medical expert physicians and therapists ever since. Some who specialize in gender identity/gender dysphoria and mental health, some who specialize in children's health, and some who specialize in hormones. All of whom have always been in support of every part of medical and gender affirming care our child has received.

Today, my child is a happy, thriving middle schooler—a smart, strong, funny, and caring young person who is secure in his identity. He is a good student, plays guitar and was the lead in the school play last fall. He is nearly a black belt in karate, a testament to his determination, discipline, and love for learning new things. He's also passionate about animals, especially cats—he would love to save every stray cat on this island, a true reflection of his caring nature. And when he's not busy with school or extracurriculars, you'll find us at the beach, thanks to his love for the ocean and our beautiful Hawaii. He has been suffering lately as hundreds of millions of dollars have been spent in the last quarter on anti-trans marketing, and as misinformation and ignorance on this topic spread and hatred is amplified.

Affirming his gender identity has made a profound difference in his mental and emotional well-being. He is no longer burdened by the weight of trying to be something he is not. Instead, he is flourishing as the person he was always meant to be. The relief, stability, and joy we see in him every day are a testament to the power of having access to gender-affirming care—care provided by medical professionals with the expertise to understand and support children like mine.

But I must also emphasize the danger that denying this care presents. Interrupting or withholding gender-affirming care can be life-threatening. Transgender children who do not have access to appropriate medical care, or who are forced to detransition mid-care, experience significantly higher rates of depression, self-harm, and suicide. To force a child into a situation where their gender identity is not supported is emotional torture. It is not just cruel—it is potentially fatal. These are not abstract issues; they are real, and they affect real families. No child, including mine, deserves to have their rights, their identity, and their future held hostage by political agendas that fail to prioritize their well-being.

It is vital that parents, like myself, continue to have the right to determine the best course of medical care for our children in consultation with professionals who are trained, knowledgeable, and experienced. We, as parents, know our children better than anyone else. We are the ones who see their struggles, their triumphs, and their unique needs. We are the ones who advocate for them every single day, and we rely on the expertise of medical professionals to help guide us in making the best decisions for their well-being. It is both unjust and harmful to allow the government to intervene and criminalize parents for supporting their children with the best, science-backed, peer-reviewed care available.

I have raised four other children to successful adulthood—two currently in college and one who has completed an honorable tour with the military. I am an educated skilled essential worker, and a committed community volunteer here in Hawaii. I have dedicated my life to serving and improving the world around me. The care I provide to my children over the ast few decades has always been driven by love, responsibility, and a deep commitment to their well-being.

This bill is not just about protecting my child; it's about protecting the rights of every parent in Hawaii to make decisions in the best interest of their child, without fear of prosecution. Parents should not be criminalized for affirming their children's identities and ensuring they have access to appropriate and necessary healthcare. Please allow us to continue to be the advocates our children need and deserve.

I urge you to pass SB1150. Let us continue to build a community that uplifts and supports all families, where children, regardless of their gender identity, are allowed to live their truth and thrive.

My name is Robert Iman, and I am the father of a remarkable and strong transgender child. I'm speaking in support of SB1150 today, a bill that will protect the right to gender-affirming care for my child and countless others, and shield parents like me from prosecution for doing what we know is right for our children.

I was born and raised on Oahu's West Side. I'm an honored retired military service member who spent my career fighting for freedom and protecting the rights of people all over the world. I deployed four times to defend this country, believing that the very freedoms I was fighting for would continue to thrive. I never imagined I would face a situation where my rights as a father—my ability to care for and protect my child—could be questioned or stripped away in a way that undermines everything I've fought for.

When my child was 5 years old, they began expressing clear, persistent discomfort with the gender they were assigned at birth. It was a struggle for both of us—seeing my child so unsure of themselves and hurting. But I could tell this wasn't just a passing feeling—it was something much deeper. By the time my child was 7, we reached out for professional support. With guidance from doctors who specialize in gender identity, we made the decision to affirm my child's gender. Over the years, I've seen my child evolve into a confident, happy, and thriving individual who is secure in their identity.

Today, my child is an active, joyful young person. Most importantly, my child is a healthy, well-adjusted person because we have supported them in being who they truly are. They've been given the freedom to live authentically, and that has made all the difference.

However, the stakes are now incredibly high. The idea that I could be criminalized for supporting my child—who is thriving, happy, and loved—is a nightmare. Denying my child access to gender-affirming care, or worse, forcing them to detransition mid-care, would cause immeasurable harm. These are not hypothetical scenarios; they are real, and they could cost my child their happiness, their mental health, and even their life. Studies show that transgender youth who do not have access to affirming care suffer higher rates of suicide, self-harm, and depression. To deny my child the care they need is not just wrong—it is life-threatening.

As a father, I know my child. I have spent my life protecting and providing for my family, and I've always believed in the right to make decisions for my children in their best interest. We, as parents, are entrusted with the responsibility to care for and nurture our children. I would never knowingly harm my child or any child. It is unacceptable that a parent could be punished for acting in the best interest of their child and following the guidance of medical professionals who specialize in these matters. My duty as a parent has always been to protect my children, and I ask that you honor my right to continue doing so without fear of prosecution.

I have raised five children, and I am proud of each of them. My other 4 children are now adults, two of them currently in college, and one who has completed an honorable tour with the military. This is a family that has always worked hard to contribute positively to society. I am proud of my service to this country, and I am proud of the family I've built. I never imagined that a situation like this could threaten our ability to protect and love our youngest child in the same way we've done for all of them. I never imagined my own child would not have the same basic human rights I was going half way around the world to secure for other people of this country's behalf.

SB1150 is crucial for the protection of families like mine. We must preserve the right for parents to provide their children with the care and support they need without the threat of criminalization. Please protect the right to affirm a child's identity and ensure that families can continue to make these decisions with the help of trained professionals.

I urge you to pass SB1150, not just for my family, but for all families in Hawaii. Let us ensure that every child, regardless of gender identity, can grow up healthy, happy, and true to who they are.

I am writing in **strong support of SB1150**, which would help protect patients, providers, and families from out of state persecution, professional discipline, and separation when gender affirming care is received/provided in Hawai'i to a resident of a state where such care may be unlawful. This protection comes from ensuring covered entities in Hawai'i do not release related information to or comply with requests from bad actors in other jurisdictions.

Passing this bill is a vital step towards ensuring Hawai'i remains a safe place where people and families can receive access to gender affirming health care without fear of persecution.

My spouse has received gender affirming health care here in Hawai'i for the last 5 years. From first hand experience, I can tell you that being able to receive affordable primary care from a competent and empathetic provider is life-saving. But now we both fear that this provider could be targeted by spurrious lawsuits from those seeking to impede access to gender-affirming care by consenting adults. This is harmful on both a personal and a population level -- we should never target anyone for persecution based on identity.

17 states and the District of Columbia already have such laws in place, and it is vital that Hawai'i ensures similar protections are put into place here. With this bill, SB1150, we are merely asking that health care providers be permitted to continue to practice that aloha without fear of outside entities interfering with specious claims of harm. This bill does not exempt providers from all of the mandated reporting laws governing response to child abuse or trafficking. Living in shame is harmful; living into your full humanity helps all of us.

I strongly oppose SB1150 due to its overreach into parental rights, legal jurisdiction, and due process. This bill undermines the principles of family autonomy, disrupts established legal frameworks for child custody, and creates significant risks for both families and the state of Hawai'i.

SB1150 reclassifies parental refusal to provide "gender-affirming care" as medical neglect, equating it with child abuse. This diminishes parental discretion in medical decision-making and allows courts to override parental authority even in the absence of demonstrable harm. Furthermore, by permitting non-parents to seek emergency jurisdiction over minors, **the bill undermines due process by limiting parental ability to contest custody decisions**. Family autonomy must be preserved, and parents should not be excluded from critical medical decisions affecting their children.

SB1150 alters the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act (UCCJEA) by granting Hawai'i courts expanded emergency jurisdiction over out-of-state minors brought to the state for medical procedures. This **creates a legal loophole that could incentivize** individuals—including non-relatives—to transport minors across state lines without parental consent, circumventing existing custody agreements and state laws.

Additionally, the bill prevents cooperation with extradition requests related to custody disputes, effectively designating Hawai'i as a legal sanctuary for those seeking to remove children from parental custody without legal consequence. This departure from national legal norms could jeopardize Hawai'i's ability to enforce its own custody rulings in other states.

By weakening legal protections against unauthorized custody transfers, **SB1150 creates vulnerabilities that could be exploited by bad actors**, including those with coercive or harmful intentions. The bill provides no clear safeguards to ensure that minors transported across state lines for medical procedures are acting of their own free will or receiving appropriate medical oversight.

Furthermore, the bill's confidentiality provisions limit parental access to medical records, obstructing their ability to ensure their child's well-being. This **lack of transparency conflicts**

with well-established legal principles that recognize parental rights in medical decision-making and child welfare.

SB1150's unilateral approach to custody and medical jurisdiction could have unintended consequences for Hawai'i's legal standing. If the state refuses to return minors to their legal guardians in other jurisdictions, it risks undermining reciprocity under the UCCJEA, which could hinder Hawai'i's ability to reclaim its own children in future custody disputes. The bill also raises constitutional concerns, as it may conflict with the Full Faith and Credit Clause, which requires states to recognize and enforce each other's legal judgments.

SB1150 goes beyond protecting children—it disrupts legal norms, erodes parental rights, and creates significant risks for families and the state's legal framework. Instead of advancing policies that weaken custody protections and parental involvement, the legislature should focus on solutions that prioritize both child welfare and due process.

I urge you to vote **NO** on SB1150 to protect family integrity, uphold legal consistency, and ensure child safety under a fair and balanced legal framework.

Returning to Hawai'i, where health access for gender affirming care is much more accessible, I feel supported in my basic healthcare needs, and I have been able focus back on my own work 100% as a holistic health care provider. I have the social and systemic support and now bandwith to share my best self with my patients, thanks to current supportive policies in Hawai'i.

I have also been privileged to personally witness 2 young transgender children growing up who were clear from early on, around the age of 5, that their biological gender did not match their gender identity. One is now 19, the other is now 7. One, a musician and performer, is going to college, the other just won a children's award for her MLK day video. They both have been lucky enough to be born into supportive families and have supportive health providers. This isn't protection; it's a free pass for life-altering procedures with shaky evidence.

The UK's Cass Review (2022) found weak scientific support for these interventions in minors, citing risks like bone density loss and infertility. Yet this bill assumes they're "medically

necessary" without debate, putting kids at risk for an ideology's sake. Democrats, you've fought for evidence-based policy and child welfare—don't let this bill gamble with our kids' futures. Vote no to demand real scrutiny.

3. It Tramples State Sovereignty and Fairness

America thrives because states can set their own rules. S.B. 1150 spits on that by refusing to enforce other states' laws banning gender-affirming care (Section 7, §323J-7) and blocking cooperation with their investigations (Section 8, §323J-4). My name is Jackie Keefe and I am a community advocate. I have worked with people from all walks of life and believe in the power of intersectionality. I am writing today **in full support of SB1150**.

I want to start my testimony by saying that I am disappointed that this bill is being presented to and by the community in a way that implies that it is about sex change surgery.

It has been proven that gender-affirming care can be life-saving for LGBTQ youth (and adults, for that matter). They are at a greater risk of experiencing anxiety and depression as well as substance abuse and homelessness.

I am of the belief that everyone deserves to be housed, clothed, and fed. Regardless of gender identity. I also believe that the government should have *nothing* to say about gender identity. If we really care about "freedom," then children deserve freedom, too. The freedom to be who they are. The freedom to live life without harrassment. The freedom to go **one day** without people poking around in their business and worrying about their gender... because what is gender? Gender identity is a person's innate sense of their gender. Some people's gender identity is the same that they were assigned at birth. Some people's gender identity is not. Why is this anyone's business? How do we decide who is man or woman "enough?" Ultimately, to police gender, we will have to resort to genital inspections. NO THANKS! I am lucky to have never experienced sexual abuse, but I am the anomaly. **One in ten children will become a victim of sexual abuse before their 18th birthday.** *Transgender youth have higher rates of reported psychological, physical, and sexual abuse than heterosexual cisgendered adolescents*.

Is that not enough torture?

So far as I am aware, Hawai'i residents are in favor of freedom from government intervention in their lives. I believe that this bill protects people to identify as they feel fit. I believe that is how it should be. Other states in the USA have chosen to do things like 'authorize a state agency to remove a child from a parent or guardian based on the parent or guardian allowing the child to receive gender-affirming health care services' and I find this despicable. These parents and guardians are simply doing what they believe is best for their child (and is never against the desire of said child but explicitly in response to that child's own desires).

Just because they cannot yet vote does not mean that children do not deserve rights. You are making decisions for a class of citizens that has no ability to vote against you, and that is not okay. This bill should be **passed** to protect them from the anti-LGBTQ laws that other states are enacting. Both children and adults deserve the chance to be who they know themselves to be without anyone's intervention. Adults who have not experienced this themselves will often simplify this issue to "kids can't even add correctly; how can they possibly make a decision like this?!"

Adults who have had to undergo sex change operations themselves likely wish that they could have just taken puberty blockers. These prevent the onset of puberty. They delay things like breast development and facial hair growth. If these kids "grow out of this phase," as so many adults claim will happen, then they can simply change course and go off of these medications.

I would also like to point out that cisgender males frequently seek gender-affirming care like testosterone and hair plugs and cisgender women do the same with things like breast augmentation and lip plumping surgeries. Why is it okay for folks to seek gender-affirming care for a gender that society accepts but not a transgender or non-binary person? This is incredibly hypocritical!

In summary, I urge you to **pass SB1150** and support civil rights. Protect children from the anti-LGBTQ laws being passed in other states and support their decisions to be who they are. Disclosing if children are receiving such care to anyone—including employees of government agencies—is a violation of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996. Thus, persecution of parents and guardians who support their children in receiving gender-affirming health care is both a legal and an ethical issue.

Rather than facing persecution from government agencies, these parents and guardians should be revered as exemplary. All children deserve unconditional love and support from those that raise them, regardless of gender identity or any other personal characteristic. As such, I respectfully ask that you vote in favor of this bill to protect transgender children and their families.

Misinformation, Not Facts is Fueling Opposition to SB 1150

Now more than ever, we see the insidious impact of misinformation—how it spreads, how it distorts reality, and how it influences public policy. This is precisely why I wrote the article for *Civil Beat* on February 13, 2024, titled: "The Truth About Gender-Affirming Care — And Why It's Under Attack" (See attached.) The article provides a **scientific** and cultural fact-check of the arguments and misinformation surrounding gender-affirming care, particularly in relation to SB 1150.

So far the article has generated over 135 comments on *Civil Beat's* Facebook page—demonstrating an extraordinary level of public engagement on this issue, from both those in strong support and those in passionate opposition. Ironically, many of the loudest voices in opposition are rooted in the very misinformation my article debunks. For example, one of the most persistent claims is that gender-affirming care involves irreversible surgeries on minors, equating it to "child genital mutilation." It's clear from these comments that among the full-throated opposition to this measure, very few—if any—actually read the article or have made a genuine effort to understand the facts or what SB 1150 actually does.

Similarly, I fear the public testimony you receive in opposition to SB 1150 will undoubtedly be filled with these same false claims—repeating fear-based narratives that have no basis in reality.

Public Sentiment vs. Evidence-Based Policymaking

I must emphasize a crucial point: while public input is important, not all opinions deserve equal weight when evaluating a measure of this nature.

As lawmakers, you are tasked with considering public sentiment, but due diligence requires distinguishing between informed perspectives and misinformation. Testimony grounded in public health, clinical practice, and legal precedent must be prioritized over testimony based on misconceptions, fear-mongering, or outright falsehoods. (For what it's worth, I, too, would oppose unnecessary, irreversible surgeries on transgender youth. But that's simply not what this measure does.)

SB 1150 is about protecting access to medically necessary, evidence-based care. I urge you to center this discussion on facts—not fear—and pass SB 1150 to ensure that gender-affirming care remains accessible and protected in Hawai'i.

The Truth About Gender-Affirming Care — And Why It's Under Attack

Our national government is using deliberate falsehoods to stoke fear and suppress the rights of transgender youth.

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Hawai'i prides itself on being a welcoming and inclusive place where diverse communities can live as their authentic selves. The state has the highest percentage of youth who identify as transgender, according to data collected by the Hawai'i Department of Health.

This doesn't mean there are inherently more transgender kids here than anywhere else; rather, it reflects Hawai'i's deep-rooted culture of inclusivity, which acknowledges and honors gender diversity — including the historical recognition of māhū culture. In a more accepting environment, young people feel safer expressing their identities.

Despite this legacy of acceptance, our national government in Washington is attempting to impose nationwide restrictions on providing gender-affirming health care to anyone under the age of 20. **Senate Bill 1150**, currently being considered in the Hawai'i Legislature, aims to protect the state's health care providers from this federal overreach.

If passed, the measure will ensure that local medical professionals and other health care entities can continue offering evidence-based, life-saving gender-affirming care without fear of legal repercussions or retaliation.

Caught In A Firestorm Of Misinformation

The debate over transgender youth and gender-affirming care evokes strong emotions — sometimes genuine, but often counterproductive. Public testimony has been heated, fueled by misinformation. Claims of "child mutilation" or "kids undergoing surgery without parental consent" would be rightfully concerning if they were true — but they are not.

These are deliberate falsehoods, designed to stoke fear and suppress the rights of transgender youth. Misinformation is a powerful weapon, misleading even well-intentioned people who believe they are acting in the best interests of keiki.

Here are the facts. Gender-affirming care is:

- supported by every major medical association and leading global health authority;
- evidence-based, safe, medically necessary, and often life-saving;
- only provided to minors with parental consent;
- for prepubescent (young) children, gender-affirming care may include: talk therapy, using different names or pronouns, non-medical changes in appearance (e.g., hairstyles, clothing), family counseling;
- for adolescents, care may include fully reversible puberty blockers, which temporarily pause
 physical changes (e.g., breast growth, facial hair) to allow individuals to reach adulthood and
 mental maturity before making decisions about more permanent options like hormone injections
 and surgeries.

What gender-affirming care does <u>not</u> include:

- it is not provided to minors without parental consent;
- it does not involve surgeries on minors.


"Surge" In Transgender Youth

A common misconception is that the rise in transgender youth is some kind of new fad. "Why does it seem like more young people are identifying as transgender now? This never used to be a thing!"

If you've wondered this, history provides an explanation.

Take the case of left-handedness. Before 1900, most naturally left-handed children in America were forced to write with their right hand. Schools, parents, and society at large viewed left-handedness as awkward, undesirable, or even a sign of poor character.

Dubious claims suggested it led to negative health outcomes or antisocial traits. As a result, left-handed children conformed out of pressure and fear.



But when these outdated beliefs faded in the early 20th century, something remarkable happened: the percentage of left-handed people appeared to skyrocket. Suddenly, kids were identifying as lefthanded at much higher rates.

This led to backlash from older generations who saw it as an unnatural fad — "Why are all these kids choosing to be left-handed now? This never used to be a thing!"

Of course, the real prevalence of lefthandedness hadn't changed. The roughly 12% of people who are left-handed today had always existed; they had simply been hiding in plain sight. Once societal norms shifted, they finally had the freedom to live as they truly were.

The same logic applies today to gender identity. When a society suppresses something, it doesn't erase it — it just forces people into silence. And when that suppression lifts, the truth emerges.

It's Not Just About Health Care

Attacks on gender-affirming care extend beyond health care — they have far-reaching consequences for other marginalized groups and communities. History has shown that when governments restrict the rights of one vulnerable group, others soon follow.

Right now, our national government is targeting transgender youth. Protecting their access to care is about more than health care — it's about drawing a line in the sand to keep Hawai'i a place of aloha, where no community stands alone when their rights are under attack.

SB 1150 is a necessary safeguard against federal overreach that threatens Hawai'i's health care providers. It ensures that medical care in our state remains guided by science, compassion, and the well-being of keiki — not political ideology or misinformation.

Furthermore, in my and my wife's capacities as the administrators of the Facebook group Transgender Awareness Hawaii, which a we established after having established and run the first few annual Honolulu observances of Transgender Day of Remembrance before handing the reigns to HHHRC we see the need and importance of these protections every day as the Federal Government wages a ware of cruelty on historically excluded populations with a special hatred and cruelty towards women, people of color, immigrants, and certainly gender minorities. Their fixation on such a small segment of the populatino which they don't understand let alone empathize with is dwarfed only by their brazen lies and misinformation about what genderaffirming care, especially for minors actually consists of.

I know of what I speak as I have testified before the legislature before on gender-affirming healthcare issues in my capacity of a Director of The Lavender Clinic which was founded in 2014 and sadly we had to close in 2023. I can say unequivically there are adults alive today who would never have made it to adulthood if The Lavender Clinic had been unable to provide responsible, evidence-based, gender-affirming care to them as minors. They are successful thriving young adults who contribute economically and culturally to their societies. Furthermore, I would not be alive today without the access to gender-affirming care I received at The Lavender Clinic as an adult patient in the very beginning when it was founded. Many of the providers who are providing this care in Hawaii today are alumni of The Lavender Clinic and many other providers have been educated at least in part by the education and outreach we conducted. One of the commissioners on the status of lgbtqi+ people in Hawaii is my personal primary care provider to this day and had originally worked at The Lavender Clinic doing postdoctoral studies in gender-affirming care. We had hoped to establish a lasting partnership with UCSF; however, sadly, The Lavender Clinic as an Organization did not surive long enough to see that through. I've deviated to speaking about the Organization I was involved in, because I want to emphasize just how much I have personally interacted with this issue.

As an Organization The Lavender Clinic provided gender-affirming care to literally hundreds of patients from children to those well above retirement age. It is important to dispell the misinformation here with regards to gender-affirming care to minors, and while much ink has been spilled on the topic by many much more qualified than me, the same lies being spread on the National stage are being echoed by some Hawaii politicians in the name of "protecting"

children". I'm not afraid to call out directly State Representative Elijah Pierick who appears to have a pathological obsession with attacking people and spreading lies. The youngest patient I can personally recall coming to The Lavender Clinic for gender-affirming care was 5 years old when I met her. Her father has likely submitted testimony if the family still lives in Hawaii; however, I haven't followed them since the clinic's closure.

Here is how I met her. Her father brought her in to see one of our licensed mental health therapists who was licesned to work with families and children. He interviewed her father, then the 2 of them together. He reviewed and compared notes with the head physician of the clinic who had been speaking to the patient's father and the patient for over a year at that point. The therapist then wrote a letter for the patient so that her father could rent an apartment in a building which only allowed service or emotional support animals. The child already suffered from anxiety at age 5. Part of her anxiety came from the fact that since she had the ability to speak she told every adult who would listen that she was a girl not a boy. Like any parent in this situation, espeically a single parent, her father wanted to support his child but didn't know what to do or what was best. By the time she came to us for this letter it was certaily more than "just a phase". She had chosen a name which is now her legal name, and she looked like any other little girl of that age. The gender-affirming care she received that day was a letter for her emotional support dog which referenced her by her chosen name and her affirming pronouns. Over the next several years she and her father would have many more difficult conversations with our healthcare and therapy staff about whether it was right to do this or that but the this or that consisted of things like, how much should they push back on school officials about her name and pronouns? How can we get the schools not to out her? Normal childhood stuff which eventually became normal adolescant stuff. Most of the conversations were much more social than they were medical. Eventually blood tests did need to be ordered to determine what stage of puberty she was in. More check-ins with therapists asking her how it made her feel to have started puberty. These therapists had experience with many cisgender children so they knew the difference between "everybody hates puberty" and gender dysphoria. Eventually the decision was made jointly by her father, the therapists, and the patient herself that chemically blocking puberty to give the patient and her family more time to decide what should be the right path was made.

The last time I saw her she was 12 or 13 and looked like any other girl that age and very very happy. The occasion was Transgender Day of Visibility flag waving at the State Capitol and while most of the responses we got were honks of support, I remember very very clearly a large black SUV coming nearly to a stop in fast moving traffic on Beretania St and the driving turning his entire body towards the capitol where we flag waving and giving us all 2 middle fingers and the response from the dozens if not hundres of us waving flags was largely either polite boos or ignoring. This incident of a man so filled with hate for something he didn't know or understand and which clearly didn't affect him personally in any way illustrates why these protections are so necessary and vital to all of our survival.

When it comes down to it, this is about our right to exist. Thank you.

SB1150 does not take into account these serious medical concerns and may expose Hawaii's youth to unnecessary medical risks.

3. Legal Overreach and Custody Concerns

This bill proposes modifications to the UCCJEA that would interfere with existing custody laws, potentially allowing a child to receive gender-affirming care in Hawaii against the wishes of one or both parents. This sets a dangerous precedent where Hawaii courts could override parental decisions and undermine family autonomy in cases of medical disputes. Such a policy could incentivize parental conflict and open the door for legal manipulation in custody disputes.

4. Broad and Vague Protections

The bill lacks clarity on what specific "protections" are being expanded and how they would impact medical providers, parents, and children. Are medical professionals shielded from liability even in cases of malpractice? Would parents be denied access to their child's medical records if gender-affirming care is involved? Such ambiguities raise major concerns about the lack of transparency and oversight in implementing this policy.

Conclusion

While every individual deserves compassionate and ethical health care, SB1150 goes too far in removing parental involvement, ignoring international medical concerns, and expanding legal jurisdiction in an overreaching manner. Rather than rushing into policies that could cause irreversible harm, Hawaii should prioritize careful, evidence-based approaches that truly protect children's well-being.

For these reasons, I urge lawmakers to oppose SB1150 and instead focus on legislation that promotes responsible medical care, respects parental rights, and ensures informed decision-making for all patients.

Restoring Protections for Families and Trans Youth

Aloha Chair and Members of the Committee,

I write in strong support of SB 1150 but in strong opposition to the recent amendments that weaken the bill's ability to protect families and trans youth. The original language of SB 1150 provided critical legal protections for families fleeing states that have criminalized genderaffirming care. The removal of these provisions undermines the bill's purpose and puts vulnerable youth at risk.

1. I Know Firsthand the Consequences of Delayed Gender-Affirming Care

I speak from personal experience. I recently underwent three voice surgeries, a painful and high-risk surgery to correct the effects of a puberty I never wanted. If I had been given access to puberty blockers as a child, I might never have needed this procedure. But because I was denied timely care, I am now dealing with permanent, unnecessary medical burdens. I've also gone through facial surgeries, also high risk.

Puberty blockers are safe, reversible, and well-studied for over a century. Without access to them, trans youth face:

Permanent voice changes, often requiring surgery like mine.

Unwanted facial and body development, leading to more medical interventions later in life.

Increased depression, dysphoria, and suicide risk, as shown in extensive research.

The amendments to SB 1150 strip away protections for families seeking this lifesaving care, making it harder for them to access what should be a basic medical right.

2. The Amendments Remove Legal Protections That Families Desperately Need

Families are fleeing states where seeking gender-affirming care is now criminalized. Many parents are at risk of losing custody simply for following established medical guidelines. The original bill ensured:

Hawaii courts could take jurisdiction over child custody cases for families seeking gender-affirming care.

Emergency protections for trans youth unable to access care in their home states.

By removing these protections, the amendments leave families vulnerable to legal action from states that want to separate trans youth from supportive parents. Hawaii should not allow other states' anti-LGBTQ+ laws to dictate our custody decisions.

3. The 2050 Effective Date Is a Deliberate Stalling Tactic

Changing the bill's effective date to December 31, 2050 is nothing more than a way to kill this legislation without openly voting against it. This crisis is happening now:

Families are already fleeing hostile states and need legal protection immediately.

Trans youth in those states are already suffering due to care bans.

Every year of delay means more children will be forced through unwanted, irreversible puberties.

A delayed bill helps no one. If Hawaii wants to be a sanctuary for trans youth, we must act now—not in 2050.

4. Call to Action: Restore SB 1150's Protections

I urge the committee to:

- Restore the original jurisdictional protections so that Hawaii courts, not hostile out-of-state courts, determine custody.
- Reinstate emergency jurisdiction to allow Hawaii to protect children at risk.
- Remove the 2050 delay and ensure these protections take effect immediately.

Hawaii has a proud history of standing up for human rights. Let's not turn our backs on trans youth and their families now. Strengthen SB 1150—don't weaken it.

As someone who mentors two high school students who happen to be transgender, they see and hear all of the hostile, false rhetoric about gender-affirming care. They see legislation in GOP states attacking their existence and calling them slurs. The misinformation has a strong effect on their mental health as they know that gender-affirming care is primarily about just fitting into society with the acceptance of their preferred name and pronouns. For a small percentage, it may mean access to a puberty blocker, which is safe and reversible to provide additional time to show continued persistence in their identity. These blockers are the same medications commonly used to treat cis-gender kids. These kids, who their families affirm, were thriving just a couple of years ago, and many still are, but a good number are also scared of the hostile laws happening in the US, and their school work and just having fun with friends are being affected for which I can see with my mentees. Yesterday, I joined a Pflag meeting in one of these GOP states, and the parents are terrified and searching for access to continued care out of state for their adolescents and trying to find a way to move to a state that would be welcoming. When my child first came out as trans, one of the first thoughts that I had was to be thankful that we live in Hawai`i, where so many people are open, accepting, and kind. In the years since he came out, we have witnessed firsthand the aloha that has been shown to him by our friends, everyone at his school, his doctors, and even people we don't know, many of whom also have friends or family who identify outside of the binary definition of male and female.

When the President signed the executive order mandating that the federal government only recognize male and female genders, it was done as a show of force to create fear in a marginalized group who already experiences fear more regularly and at higher levels than the general population. My child was scared. My husband and I were scared. And my first thought was how grateful I am that my child chose to go to college in Hawai`i, as opposed to going to the mainland. Adolescents often make impulsive decisions without fully understanding the consequences. In no other area of medicine do we allow minors to make permanent, body-altering decisions without strict safeguards. SB1150 effectively allows minors to dictate their own medical treatment without sufficient oversight, placing ideology over the best interests of vulnerable youth.

5. Legal and Ethical Concerns

By shielding medical providers from accountability, this bill creates a legal gray area where medical malpractice and unethical practices may go unchecked. Patients deserve comprehensive assessments and alternative treatments, not rushed medical interventions that may do more harm than good.

The interference with natural biological functions, the serious potential side effects, and the often-irreversible nature of the physical changes made mean that a high bar would have to be reached to justify them."

3. Protects Dangerous and Unethical Medical Practices from Legal Scrutiny

Why should Hawaii be a dumping ground for discredited doctors? If a physician loses their medical license elsewhere for causing harm to patients, Hawaii should not turn a blind eye and allow them to continue practicing here. 4. Promotes Irreversible Medical Procedures on Children Without Sufficient Safeguards

I am a mother and grandmother as well as a current Educator with two Bachelor degrees so I am very familiar with children of all grade levels. I have a great deal of experience with CHILDREN, and one thing I know about CHILDREN is they don't know what they want, By passing this Bill to give them this supposed Right, YOU will set them up to always be labeled as outcasts in our society, to feel like a failure because they didn't fully understand the choice they were making, and to struggle for the rest of their lives to love themselves because the government said they should make their own choices as a CHILD and be allowed/forced to experience lifelong consequences. Do you enjoy seeing people suffer? Are you trying to provide an income for all the people who will make money off of these choices? My name is Haylin Dennison, and I am submitting testimony in strong support of SB1150, which safeguards access to gender-affirming care. I testify today as a mother, a mental health specialist, and a healthcare provider who has witnessed firsthand the life-saving impact of gender-affirming care on transgender and non-binary youth.

A Mother's Perspective

I am the proud mother of a transgender child. Like many parents, I once struggled to understand what my child was experiencing. I was raised in a deeply conservative Christian household, and when my child came out, I had to get education regarding gender diversity because I was never exposed to this information. My only regret is not being supportive earlier, so my child could have suffered less. My love for my child is unwavering, and I did what every parent should— I listened, I learned, and I sought the best possible care for him.

When my child was struggling with their identity, they were also struggling with depression. The statistics tell us that transgender youth face alarmingly high rates of anxiety, depression, and suicidality, but what those numbers don't show is the very real and deeply personal journey families go through to ensure their children are supported.

A Mental Health Specialist's Perspective

As a licensed therapist specializing in youth mental health, I see the impact of gender-affirming care every day in my clinic. I am the founder of Spill The Tea Café, a nonprofit mental health center serving LGBTQ+ youth, where hundreds of young people and their families seek support.

The data is undeniable: gender-affirming care saves lives. Studies from the Trevor Project, the National Institutes of Health, and major medical associations confirm that gender-affirming medical care, including hormone therapy and puberty blockers, significantly reduces suicide rates, depression, and self-harm in transgender youth. Yet, we continue to see legislation across the country aimed at restricting access to this essential care—care

that is supported by the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American Medical Association, and the American Psychiatric Association.

Without gender-affirming care, I have seen young people become hopeless, withdrawn, and suicidal. With it, I have seen them thrive—excelling in school, developing confidence, and stepping into their futures with joy and purpose. When we deny them care, we are denying them the right to a healthy, happy life.

A Healthcare Provider's Perspective

As a provider, I believe it is our ethical duty to follow science and evidence-based best practices in patient care. Gender-affirming care is not experimental. It is well-researched, widely accepted, and medically necessary for those who seek it. It is provided in a slow, careful, thoughtful, and individualized manner by trained professionals who work closely with families and patients to ensure informed decision-making.

Legislation that restricts or bans gender-affirming care places unjust burdens on families, creates barriers to critical services, and interferes with the sacred doctor-patient relationship. We do not legislate against life-saving care for any other group of patients—why should transgender individuals be treated differently?

SB1150 ensures that transgender individuals in Hawai'i can access the care they need without fear of discrimination, harassment, or legislative interference. It affirms that medical decisions should be made by patients, families, and their healthcare providers—not by politicians. It upholds Hawai'i's longstanding values of aloha, inclusion, and dignity for all.

I urge you to pass SB1150 and stand on the right side of history. Protecting access to gender-affirming care is not just a policy decision—it is a moral imperative. Our children's lives depend on it.

I grew up, live and work in this Aloha state. Today, I am writing in **strong support** of SB1150 SD1, a crucial bill that would protect patients, providers, and families from out-of-state persecution, professional discipline, and family separation when gender-affirming care is received or provided in Hawai'i.

We all want the best medical care for our loved ones. SB1150 SD1 does not dictate what parents must do for their children. Instead, it provides robust protections for families to access essential health care, including gender-affirming care. This protection counteracts restrictive interstate legal systems that target transgender individuals and their families. If a parent struggles to understand their child's gender identity, education and compassionate dialogue can bridge that gap, fostering support and understanding.

Misinformation often fuels fear. Many people do not realize what gender-affirming care entails. It is not a rushed process—it involves thoughtful, individualized care plans guided by medical professionals. A patient navigator works with families, offering tailored options like gender-affirming psychotherapy. Before puberty blockers or hormone therapy are considered, there are extensive conversations, evaluations, and informed consent. Tragically, in states like Texas, children are often denied these vital discussions altogether.

Research strongly supports the benefits of gender-affirming care. A study published by Stanford Medicine in 2022 analyzed data from the 2015 U.S. Transgender Survey, which included responses from 27,715 transgender individuals nationwide. The study examined the mental health outcomes of 21,598 participants who expressed a desire for hormone therapy. The results were clear:

- Compared to those who wanted but never received hormone therapy, participants who
 underwent treatment experienced significantly lower rates of severe psychological
 distress and suicidal ideation.
- The odds of severe psychological distress dropped by 222% for those who started hormones in early adolescence, 153% for late adolescence, and 81% for adulthood.
- Suicidal ideation was reduced by 135% in early adolescence, 62% in late adolescence, and 21% in adulthood.
- Additionally, those who began hormones in their teenage years showed lower odds of binge drinking and illicit drug use compared to those who started as adults.

This study highlights the life-saving impact of gender-affirming care. As Dr. Jack Turban, lead author of the study, emphasized: "We are adding to the evidence base that shows why gender-affirming care is beneficial from a mental health perspective." Erin Digitale, Better Mental Health Found Among Transgender People Who Started Hormones as Teens, Stanford Medicine (January 12, 2022), https://med.stanford.edu/news/all-news/2022/01/mental-health-hormone-treatment-transgender-people.html

Opponents of SB1150 SD1 argue that it is an overreach and endangers children. In reality, the bill protects families from discrimination and ensures that children can grow up with a lower risk of binge drinking, drug use, and severe mental distress. Denying this care, based solely on personal beliefs about gender identity, endangers lives—not the other way around.

Acceptance and competent care are not dangerous. Hate is. We need a robust commitment and clear mechanisms to resist discrimination and misinformation.

Critics often point to detransitioners to justify restricting gender-affirming care. However, this underscores the need for comprehensive evaluations by doctors and mental health professionals. SB1150 SD1 ensures confidential communication between patients and their providers, shielding sensitive medical information from interference by other states. It also protects medical professionals from criminal or professional repercussions simply for offering evidence-based care. Without these protections, providers may hesitate to deliver medically necessary services, placing transgender and gender-diverse individuals at even greater risk.

Hawai'i must prevent any gaps in protection that could jeopardize the safety and privacy of those seeking care in our state.

I respectfully urge you to pass SB1150 SD1 and stand firmly in support of gender-affirming care, parental rights, civil rights, and the protection of all families in Hawai'i. Let us continue to foster a community where everyone can live authentically and access the care they deserve. This is the Aloha way.

I have read the opposition testimony to this bill and admittedly, it is mostly brief and filled with blatant misunderstandings. Admittedly, before I loved someone who felt this way I did not understand it either.

There are many additional reasons to support this bill:

My name is Gail Pressnall, a resident of Kailua Kona, Hawaii, Senate District 3. Recently I have become aware of SB1150 being considered tomorrow, February 26, by the committees on JDC/WAM and have some very serious concerns about the substance of the bill.

I firmly believe that expanding the scope of defined essential health care services to include 'gender affirming care' is morally wrong; to pass a law that undermines the right of a parent of any state to guide and direct their own minor children in making such a drastic and irreversible decision is even worse. SB1150 encourages parties who very well may not hold the welfare of a child above the promotion of their own ideological agenda to have access and control that they never should be able to approach. Exempting such parties from possible prosecution opens the door to all sorts of abuses, not the least of which are sexual exploitation and human trafficking.

I have an adoptive grandson in another state who, though an adult, is on the autistic scale and limited in his decision-making ability. Recently, in the midst of frustration about his lifelong difficulty with socializing, he was directed to an LGBTQ counsellor who (predictably) suggested that re=orientation of his gender was the answer to his problems. After a few months of counselling he was persuaded to undergo sex-change surgery. He is not a happy person and is now trapped in a decision that was strongly impressed upon him. As wrong as his case is, it is immeasurably worse to surrender a minor child to the care and influence of individuals with such narrow and radical agendas.

I am strongly opposed to this bill due to the profound and often irreversible consequences of these interventions—on minors who lack the maturity and cognitive development to fully comprehend the lifelong impact of these decisions.

Medical transitioning of children leading sterility is grossly immoral. Puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, and surgical interventions can permanently impair reproductive capacity, robbing young individuals of the ability to have biological children later in life. For example, the use of puberty blockers like GnRH agonists, followed by cross-sex hormones, has been shown to halt the development of reproductive organs, leading to sterility in many cases. This is not a hypothetical risk—it is a documented outcome that fundamentally alters a person's future options before they are old enough to weigh such a loss responsibly.

Children, by virtue of their age and developmental stage, are not equipped to make life-altering decisions of this magnitude. Neuroscience consistently demonstrates that the frontal lobe—the part of the brain responsible for impulse control, long-term planning, and rational decision-making—does not fully mature until the mid-20s. This biological reality renders minors particularly vulnerable to external influences, including peer pressure and societal trends, which can amplify feelings of gender dysphoria without allowing space for natural resolution. Studies suggest that 80-95% of children with gender dysphoria desist by adolescence or adulthood if allowed to progress through puberty without intervention. Hastening them toward irreversible treatments risks cementing a choice they may later regret.

The voices of detransitioners—individuals who transitioned and later returned to living as their biological sex—underscore this danger. Many report profound regret over the permanent changes to their bodies, including sterility, loss of sexual function, and chronic health issues stemming from hormone use or surgery. A growing number of these individuals, such as Chloe Cole and Keira Bell, have publicly shared how they felt rushed into decisions as minors, influenced by well-meaning but misguided adults, only to realize later that their dysphoria was a symptom of broader emotional or psychological struggles. Their stories highlight a critical oversight in pro-transition policies: the failure to prioritize long-term well-being over short-term affirmation.

I implore you to consider the ethical implications of endorsing a policy that could lead to irreversible harm for Hawaii's children. Instead of fast-tracking medical interventions, we should focus on comprehensive mental health support, allowing minors the time and space to explore

their identities without permanent consequences. The state has a duty to protect its most vulnerable citizens, not to facilitate decisions they cannot fully consent to or reverse.

Please reject this bill and prioritize the health, fertility, and future autonomy of Hawaii's youth.


