Chair Elefante, Vice Chair Wakai, and members of the Committee:

The Department of Law Enforcement (DLE) strongly supports Senate Bill 308. This bill expands the existing ban on pistols with detachable magazines exceeding tenround capacity to include all firearms with detachable magazines that can hold more than ten rounds of ammunition. This expansion strengthens Hawaii's commitment to reasonable firearm regulations and enhanced public safety.

The DLE supports this measure as it addresses a critical gap in current firearms legislation. While existing law restricts high-capacity magazines for pistols, other firearms with similar capabilities have remained outside these restrictions. This bill creates consistency in firearms regulation and eliminates potential loopholes that could be exploited to circumvent the intent of the original magazine capacity restrictions.

From a law enforcement perspective, limiting magazine capacity across all firearm types can help reduce the potential for mass casualty incidents. High-capacity magazines enable sustained firing without reloading, which can increase casualties in shooting

incidents. This legislation aligns with established public safety practices while respecting the rights of responsible firearm owners to maintain firearms with standard-capacity magazines.

The implementation of this expanded restriction will enhance DLE's ability to enforce magazine capacity laws uniformly across all firearm types, creating a more effective and equitable regulatory framework.

Honorable Chair Elefante, Vice-Chair Wakai, and Members of the Committees on Public Safety and Intergovernmental and Military Affairs The County of Hawai'i, Office of the Prosecuting Attorney submits the following comments regarding Senate Bill No. 308.

This bill was drafted with the intention to amend Section 134-8 of Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") to ban all detachable magazines having a capacity greater than ten-rounds.

Our Office recommends deferring this measure due to the ongoing legal proceedings in the Supreme Court of the United States and the 9th Circuit Court. There are several significant cases currently under review, including pending decisions and petitions for writs of certiorari, which directly concern the constitutionality of state regulations on firearms and accessories. The outcomes of these cases could have an impact on how state-level firearm regulations are shaped and enforced, and it would be important to wait for these decisions before advancing further legislation on the matter.

We fully recognize and share the public's concern regarding gun violence and agree that it is crucial that we take steps to address this issue and ensure the safety of our citizens. However, we believe that a large portion of firearms-related offenses are committed by individuals who have a history of violent behavior or have already been prohibited from owning firearms. These repeat offenders often contribute significantly to the problem, and we believe that focusing on these offenders would be a more effective approach to reducing gun violence.

According to Hawai'i Police Department ("HPD"), a total of 196 criminal investigations were initiated under violations of HRS Section 134-7 (Ownership, possession, control prohibited) between 2022 and 2024 resulting in 315 offenses charged.

House Bill No. 137 (Relating to Firearms), which has yet to be set for a hearing within the Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs Committee, requires that felons in violation of the prohibition against owning, possessing, or controlling a firearm or ammunition be subject to a mandatory prison term. Currently, a felon found in possession of a firearm or ammunition is eligible for probation unless his new offense is committed within a limited, defined look-back period.

The County of Hawai'i, Office of the Prosecuting Attorney remains committed to pursuing justice with integrity and commitment. For the foregoing reasons, the County of Hawai'i, Office of the Prosecuting Attorney respectfully submits these comments regarding Senate Bill No. 308. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this matter.

Aloha, Chair Elefante, Vice Chair Wakai, and Committee Members:

My name is Erica Yamauchi, and I live in the Kaimukī area. As a gun violence survivor, business owner, mother of two children in our public schools, and adjunct faculty member at the University of Hawai'i, I'm writing today in strong support of Senate Bill 308.

Hawai'i has a 10-round magazine limit on magazines capable of being used in a pistol. We appreciate that this bill expands the current law to apply to high-capacity magazines (more than 10 rounds) that work with any kind of firearm, including long guns.

This is important because we know that, when shooters use a high-capacity magazine:

- Nearly 5x as many people are shot,
- Nearly 2x as many people are killed, and
- Nearly 10x as many people are injured.

Our lower incidence of gun violence historically here in the islands hasn't been by accident, but due to sound public policy and commonsense gun safety laws.

On behalf of our three local groups on Hawai'i Island, Kaua'i and O'ahu, and our 2,000+ supporters across the islands, I urge you to pass this bill.



## A Just Peace and Open and Affirming Congregation

#### Testimony of the Church of the Crossroads IN SUPPORT OF SB 308

The Church of the Crossroads was founded in 1922 as Hawaii's first intentionally multiracial church. We are a Just Peace Church of approximately 180 members. We have voted unanimously to support a ban on all assault weapons and large capacity magazines, and ask for your support in accomplishing this ban.

Hawai'i is the only state in the nation with an assault weapons ban that fails to ban assault rifles, assault shotguns and large magazines for those weapons. Our current law only applies to assault pistols/revolvers, and large detachable ammunition magazines (more than 10 rounds) for pistols. We need to restrict ALL weapons to only 10 rounds (maximum) to help avoid the risk of mass shootings with LCMs.

Hawai'i is not immune to mass shootings, as we know from our tragic history in that regard. Our schools drill our students each year on how to try to survive an active shooter situation. Yet our laws have gaping loopholes that facilitate gun violence.

Thoughts and prayers are not enough to combat gun violence. Action is needed. The legislature must do its part by enacting safer gun laws that can reduce future risks of gun violence.

The 1994 federal Assault Weapons Ban prohibited a wide range of assault weapons and high-capacity magazines. It resulted in fewer mass shootings. Sadly, it was allowed to expire in 2004 and Congress has failed to re-enact it. Hawai'i can and should expand our own assault weapons law to fill this void.

Banning assault weapons and large capacity magazines is important because these weapons are uniquely designed to be capable of mass violence. Their potential for mass murder far outweighs any plausible use for hunting, recreation or self-defense. The rate of public mass shootings has tripled since 2011. The US now has more mass shootings each year than there are days in the year. We should do our best to prevent another mass shooting here. The sooner this ban is created, the sooner we can start reducing the needless spread of assault rifles and large capacity magazines in Hawai'i.

Dear Chair Elefante, Vice Chair Wakai, and members,

In furtherance of Brady's goal to reduce firearm violence across Hawaii, the Hawaii Chapter of the Brady Campaign to Prevent Gun Violence is proud to offer its strong endorsement of SB 308.

For decades, Hawaii leaders have prioritized the safety and well-being of the people of Hawaii by enacting and implementing proactive, research-informed policy solutions that prevent gun violence, save lives, and spare entire communities from loss, trauma and cycles of violence. However, the data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as of 2024 is disturbing:

- Every year, 34 people in Hawaii die by firearm suicide.
- Every year, 15 people in Hawaii are victims of firearm homicide.
- On average, 55 people in Hawaii are killed by gun violence each year and an average of 30 of those deaths occur in Honolulu County.
- Every 7 days, someone in Hawaii is shot and killed.

Since the US Supreme Court has eased the way for more firearms to be carried in our public places, there has been an increase of gun-related violence in Hawaii. **SB 308** is an important step in the right direction to protect our citizens. Prohibiting firearms or rifles with the capacity to fire ammunition of 50-caliber or higher (with certain exclusions) is critical. These are military grade firearms that have no place in civilian life.

Brady Hawaii strongly supports passage of **SB 308** but hopes that some of the remaining loopholes can be remedied in further drafts.

Everytown for Gun Safety, and the Hawai'i Chapters of Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America, and Students Demand Action for Gun Sense in America are writing in support of SB 308.

Everytown for Gun Safety is the nation's largest gun violence prevention organization, with nearly 11 million supporters including moms, mayors, students, gun owners, faith leaders, educators, and more. We fight to advance gun safety policies at every level of government, including state legislatures. Moms Demand Action and Students Demand Action for Gun Sense in America are grassroots movements working towards common-sense public safety measures. With an established chapter in every state of the country, we campaign for effective solutions to lax gun laws and loopholes that jeopardize our communities.

High capacity magazines enable a shooter to fire many bullets without pausing to reload. Hawaii already acknowledges that giving shooters the ability to unload dozens of rounds in seconds is an abhorrent danger. This state currently has a 10 round magazine limit on magazines that are capable of being used with a pistol, but the law does not explicitly apply to magazines that can be used with a rifle or shotgun. This bill brings helpful clarity and uniformity to the magazine rules Hawaii has embraced.

Shootings involving high-capacity magazines have more fatalities and wounds than those that do not. In mass shootings with four or more people killed between 2015 and 2022, high-capacity magazines led to more than twice as many people killed, and nearly 10 times as many people wounded per incident on average. A 2021 study found that the federal prohibition on assault weapons and high-capacity magazines was associated with a significant decrease in public mass shootings and related casualties, preventing at least 11 public mass shootings during the 10 years it was in effect. The researchers also estimated that had the law remained in effect from 2005 through 2019, it would have prevented 30 mass shootings that resulted in the death of 339 people and wounded 1,139 more.<sup>1</sup>

Civilians should not be able to purchase high-capacity magazines for any firearm, and the public agrees – in a 2024 survey of registered voters across O'ahu and the neighbor islands, 80% said high-capacity magazines that exceed 10 rounds should be banned, including 65% of gun owners.

For these reasons listed above, Everytown for Gun Safety, Moms Demand Action, and Students Demand Action strongly support SB 308.

My name is Christopher D. Thomas, a former Captain in the United States Air Force Judge Advocate General (JAG) Corps. During my active-duty service from 2001 to 2007, I served as a felony-level prosecuting attorney and defense counsel, providing legal services to members of the Pacific Air Forces in Hawai'i, Guam, Japan, and Korea. Following my military service my law practice concentrates, in part, on mental health law and treatment. I am also a parent to school-aged children, an avid hunter, and a registered State of Hawaii gun owner. I am a member of the Giffords Gun Owners for Safety advocacy organization.

I am writing to express my strong support for SB308 and the common-sense effect of the law in advancing the safety of the citizens of Hawaii. As you know, Hawai'i is currently the only State in the Union with a magazine capacity-limiting law that is confined to handgun calibers, but does not extend to rifle calibers. It is counter-intuitive to gun safety and responsible gun laws to limit smaller calibers (less lethal), but to currently allow larger rifle calibers (which are much more lethal). Your proposed legislation would merely extend magazine capacity limits beyond those already enacted into Law.

As you likely know, large-capacity ammunition magazines are historically prevalent in many high-profile mass shootings in the United States. Because shooters with such magazines can fire at large numbers of people without taking the time to reload, those in the line of fire do not have a chance to escape, law enforcement does not have the chance to intervene, and the number of humans shot in a short interval of time increases dramatically. Hawaii's current law, if applied to these past incidences, would not have prevented the impact of **rifle-related** mass shootings involving large capacity magazines. SB308 can fix this. There is statistical proof of the effect of common-sense gun safety legislation: during the 10-year period the federal assault weapons and large-capacity magazine safety law was in effect, mass shooting fatalities were **70% less likely to occur** compared to the periods before and after the ban. As a sport-shooter and hunter, I have engaged in both activities with both high capacity magazines and magazines limited to a few rounds. A high capacity magazine is not necessary to enjoy responsible gun ownership and use; high-capacity magazines are best designed to kill as many humans as possible in a short period of time. Ban them now, before they are used for their designed purpose, in Hawaii.

Gun safety in our communities is reliant upon commonsense regulations that are proven to reverse the current nation-wide epidemic of violence using firearms. SB308 is an overdue extension of already available and accepted protocols of safe gun ownership and use. I urge you to vote in favor.

My name is Agustin Cabrera and I am a State Legislative Manager with Giffords, the gun violence prevention organization founded by former Congresswoman Gabby Giffords. I write to you today in support of SB308 which would expand Hawaii's existing ban on pistols with a detachable magazine with over a ten-round capacity to any firearm with a detachable magazine with over a ten-round capacity.

Fourteen states and the District of Columbia have enacted laws that generally ban the sale, manufacture, and other commerce or conduct with large-capacity ammunition magazines. Those states are: California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Hawaii, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Washington. Four of these states (DE, RI, OR, and WA) enacted these laws in 2022 and Illinois did so in January 2023.

Large-capacity ammunition magazines are a common thread in many high-profile mass shootings in the United States. Because shooters with such magazines can fire at large numbers of people without taking the time to reload, those in the line of fire do not have a chance to escape, law enforcement does not have the chance to intervene, and the number of lives shattered by acts of gun violence increases dramatically. Banning such destructive magazines is an important and life-saving step towards a stronger gun violence prevention framework for Hawaii.

#### High capacity magazines are destructive and lead to a higher number of injuries and death

Large-capacity magazines (LCMs or LCAMs) have been used to perpetrate devastation on a massive scale in many high-profile mass shootings. Large-capacity magazines significantly increase a shooter's ability to injure and kill large numbers of people quickly because they enable the individual to fire repeatedly without needing to reload. The shooter in the 2017 Las Vegas massacre was able to fire 100 rounds in just 10 seconds—without having to pause and reload—because he used a large-capacity magazine, bump stock, and an assault rifle in his attack which killed 50 and injured hundreds.<sup>1</sup>

## A growing body of research shows that banning high-capacity magazines can help to prevent gun violence

Studies have found that the, now expired, federal ban on large-capacity magazines helped to prevent violence and the use of high-capacity magazines in crime during the 10 years in which it was in effect. During the 10-year period the federal assault weapons and large-capacity magazine ban was in effect, mass shooting fatalities were 70% less likely to occur compared to the periods before and after the ban.<sup>2</sup>

At the state level, research has also shown that states with large-capacity magazine bans experience 48% fewer mass shootings—and 61% fewer domestic violence-related mass shootings—compared to states without such laws.<sup>3</sup>

Alarmingly, data suggests that the use of firearms with large-capacity magazines in crime has substantially increased since the expiration of the federal assault weapons and large-capacity magazine ban in 2004. Estimates also suggest that nearly 40% of crime guns used in serious violent crimes, including murders of law enforcement officers, are equipped with high-capacity magazines.<sup>4</sup> Similarly, since the end of the federal ban, the Los Angeles Police Department has recovered significantly greater numbers of large-capacity ammunition magazines, from 38 in 2003 to anywhere from 151 to 940 each year between 2004 and 2010.<sup>5</sup>

The evidence is clear: banning large capacity magazines can and will save lives in Hawaii. The devastation they are capable of, and their prevalence in mass shootings across the country demonstrate the urgency in which we must act. We urge the committee to support SB308.

"Hawaii Statute defines the militia as "every resident able-bodied citizen of the United States who is seventeen years old or older and under forty-six years of age and all other able-bodied residents of that age who have declared their intention to become citizens of the United States," and further defines an "unorganized militia" consisting of "those members of the militia who are not members of national guard, the naval militia, or the state defense force." Women are not excluded. Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) Section 121-1."

From what I understand and what I have taught many citizens, should there be a need for assistance due to lack of military personnel, they would be called upon to help protect their state and/or country. Should this bill be passed, you, as our legislature, are setting up law-abiding Hawaii residence to fail should any of them be called to assist. To defend our nation, people need to have the right tools to do as we need them to do.

I strongly oppose bill SB308. I do not want my kids, nieces or nephews, brothers and sisters, and family and friends to not have the tools they need to protect themselves, their ohana, and the state and country we love.

I've been fortunate to call Hawai'i home for the past few years. My fiancé, who is Native Hawaiian, is applying to JABSOM this cycle, with hopes of returning to Kaua'i to serve the community where he was raised. I rise today in support of SB 308 because I care about the well-being of our community.

Gun violence is a public health crisis, and high-capacity magazines (HCMs) are a clear risk factor for the deadliest shootings. Research has consistently shown that restrictions on HCMs can significantly reduce both the frequency and lethality of mass shootings. A review of mass shootings between 2015 and 2022 found that mass shootings involving high-capacity magazines resulted in six times as many people shot per incident compared to those without.

When more bullets can be fired without reloading, more lives are lost.

Hawai'i has some of the strongest gun laws in the country but our current law expressly bans high-capacity magazines that can be used with pistols. Functionally, however, many such magazines are also compatible with rifles. Our state already recognizes the danger that high-capacity magazines pose, and our law should explicitly prohibit magazines that hold more than ten rounds for use in any firearm. SB 308 is a helpful clarification that reiterates Hawaii's current and strong opposition to high-capacity magazines.

Mass shootings may be rare in Hawai'i, but the impact of a single incident would be devastating. We should not wait for tragedy to act. The evidence and the public pressure are clear. This bill would ensure our laws are aligned with what we know keeps communities safe.

I am testifying in support of SB 308 to expand the ban on high capacity magazines. I am here as a mother, grandmother, retired educator and as a concerned citizen. Hawaii's current gun laws restricting assault style pistols are a step in the right direction however as Americans, we cannot deny that many of our mass shootings and those that occur in schools have been with assault style weapons that go beyond pistols. While Hawaii has not had a mass shooting we are seeing gun incidents on the rise. Assault style weapons are weapons made for war and should not be in the hands of American citizens. Realizing that life in America can be a place where people feel marginalized, ignored and hopeless, acts of violence for attention and revenge are not a rare occurrence.

My own experience as an educator dealing with school shootings as well as "intruder drills" began in 1999 with Columbine. Schools began to secure campuses and allot time to practice for a violent intruder. I was teaching in a school in the Midwest that was enclosed and my classroom had no windows so while I was in disbelief and shock, I felt that I might have a chance if I could get to my doors early enough to lock us all inside. Twenty years ago I moved to Hawaii and began teaching at a new school on an open campus in a classroom that was full of windows overlooking the lush greenery and beautiful Koolau mountains. As I practiced these "intruder drills" with my students I questioned how I would be able to protect them in this environment. I was told to lock the doors, barricade my students behind desks and try to cover the windows with whatever I had available.

One year, the school I taught at went into a full lockdown with an armed individual on our school campus. We barricaded ourselves behind desks, in full view of windows, and locked the doors. We were locked inside for hours and students were forced to use trash cans to relieve themselves. We tried creative ways to get lunches to them so they could eat while under lockdown. I remember feeling vulnerable and a great deal of responsibility to care for my students. I also remember the anxiety in the classroom during the lockdown. The safety and mental health of our keiki and those who work on school campuses who fear they may be murdered in a school shooting needs to be a primary concern. A ban on all assault style weapons is necessary. It would at least give teachers, staff and students a few extra minutes to protect themselves.

Over twenty five years ago, I started teaching students about how to keep safe from a school shooting and now in 2025 my youngest grandson came home and told us at the dinner table that they had an "intruder drill". So many years have passed and we are still at the same

place. While I know that there are responsible gun owners who defend the 2nd Amendment, I am saddened that we are willing to sacrifice the lives of so many of our most valuable citizens for those who feel it is their right to carry a military style assault weapon. Being able to live without the fear of being murdered at a mass shooting by an assault weapon should also be an American right. I urge you to support SB 308.

- Under existing Hawaii firearm laws, each magazine could be considered a separate offense, potentially leading to multiple felony charges for a law-abiding gun owner.
- This excessive punishment is disproportionate and targets responsible citizens instead of criminals.

#### 4. Magazines Can Be Permanently Modified

- Many firearm owners would be willing to permanently modify their magazines to hold 10 rounds or fewer, yet the bill does not clearly address whether such modifications would be legally acceptable.
- Clarification is needed on whether modification would prevent criminal liability.

#### 5. Does Not Address Crime or Public Safety

- Criminals, by definition, do not follow gun laws. Restricting magazine capacity does
   not deter violent crime, as seen in other jurisdictions with similar bans.

Dear Chair Elefante, Vice Chair Wakai, and Members of the Committee,

I am submitting this testimony in **strong opposition** to **S.B. 308**, which seeks to expand Hawaii's current ban on detachable magazines over ten rounds from applying only to pistols to **all firearms**, including rifles and shotguns. I respectfully urge the Committee to **immediately defer this bill** for the following reasons:

## **Key Concerns with S.B. 308:**

- 1. Criminalization of Law-Abiding Citizens Without a Grandfather Clause
  This bill would immediately make tens of thousands of legally owned rifle and
  shotgun magazines illegal overnight with no provision for current owners. There is
  no grandfather clause, no buyback program, and no clear compliance process, meaning
  responsible gun owners would suddenly face legal jeopardy for possessing magazines
  that were previously lawful.
- 2. No Evidence That Magazine Bans Reduce Crime
  There is no data to support the claim that banning magazines over ten rounds
  reduces violent crime. Most criminals do not comply with magazine bans, and this
  measure only affects law-abiding citizens who use these magazines for lawful purposes.
- 3. Conflict with U.S. Supreme Court Rulings
  The Supreme Court's decisions in District of Columbia v. Heller (2008) and New York
  State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen (2022) reaffirmed that firearm restrictions
  must be consistent with historical firearm regulations and cannot impose undue
  burdens on lawful gun ownership. High-capacity magazines are in common use across
  the United States, making a ban legally vulnerable under Second Amendment
  protections. Similar laws in California, Illinois, and New Jersey are already facing
  legal challenges, with courts questioning their constitutionality.
- 4. Hawaii's Existing 10-Round Pistol Magazine Ban is Already Being Challenged Hawaii's ban on pistol magazines exceeding ten rounds is currently being challenged in the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals, with plaintiffs arguing that such restrictions violate the Second Amendment. Expanding this restriction to all firearms will likely compound the legal vulnerabilities and increase the risk of costly litigation for the state. Courts have already questioned whether magazine capacity restrictions align with the historical tradition of firearm regulation, making the expansion of such a ban legally precarious.

- 5. This Bill Has Been Introduced Repeatedly Without Justification S.B. 308 is not a new proposal; similar bills have been introduced multiple times over the past decade. Despite these efforts, Hawaii has not seen these magazines or firearms commonly used in crimes throughout the state. The continued push for this ban, despite a lack of supporting crime data, raises concerns about whether this legislation is addressing an actual issue or simply targeting law-abiding firearm owners
- 6. **Disproportionate Impact on Competitive Shooters and Hunters**Many firearms used for **hunting, sport shooting, and competitive events** come standard with magazines over **ten rounds**. Restricting these magazines would:
  - o Prevent residents from competing in **national and international shooting sports**.
  - Limit the effectiveness of self-defense firearms, as standard-capacity magazines often hold more than ten rounds.
  - Place Hawaii at a disadvantage compared to other states that allow standardcapacity magazines for lawful activities.
- 7. Enforcement Challenges and Widespread Non-Compliance
  Other states with similar bans, such as California and New York, have seen extremely
  low compliance rates, with law enforcement struggling to enforce magazine restrictions.
  Determining whether a magazine is legal (e.g., permanently modified or not) creates
  burdensome enforcement issues and diverts resources away from addressing actual
  violent crime.

### **Conclusion:**

S.B. 308 is an unnecessary and unconstitutional restriction that punishes law-abiding gun owners without addressing any real public safety concerns. Given the lack of crime data supporting this ban, the constitutional challenges it is likely to face, and the undue burden it places on law-abiding citizens, I respectfully urge the Committee to immediately defer S.B. 308. Hawaii should focus on enforcing existing laws and addressing actual causes of violent crime, rather than penalizing responsible firearm owners for possessing common, standard-capacity magazines.

I stand in **STRONG OPPOSITION** to this bill. On its face it is a violation of the Second Amendment. Similar magazine bans have already been struck down in courts around the country, and current Hawaii law covering just pistol magazines is being challenged in court. There is also a case pending before SCOTUS dealing with the issue as well (**Ocean State Tactical LLC v. Rhode Island**), which given past rulings will likely be found unconstitutional.

This ban would (and currently is) a violation of the **Caetano decision** which helped to legalize tasers, stating that Arms that are in common use for lawful purposes are covered under the Second Amendment. At the time of the Caetano Decision it was stated that there were an estimated 200,000 tasers in use throughout the United States. I can guarantee you there are at least that many 10+ magazines in the State of Hawaii alone, and would be on the government to prove otherwise. The current ban on 10 round pistol magazines is already facing a lawsuit, and could easily be amended to cover all magazines should this bill go through.

Those calling for this bill say it will save lives or prevent criminals from acquiring them, this is at best a falsehood and at worse a fantasy. One of the deadliest school shootings in the United States (**Virginia Tech**) was done with the shooter using 10 round magazines, and one of the more notorious (**Parkland**) was done with the shooter using 10 round magazines, despite having legal access to higher capacity magazines.

Honolulu Police Department has even admitted in past testimony that such laws would only be used to punish offenders after the fact, and failed to provide information on how many were charged with violating the current pistol magazine laws or even how many unlawful magazines had been recovered. Such charges are usually one of the first ones tossed out by State Prosecutors as part of a plea deal to offenders, assuming they are even charged in the first place.

This bill would not stop anyone who wants to get a 10+ round magazine from getting one, just as the current law doesn't stop these magazines from coming in. I myself have received 'high capacity pistol magazines' in the mail after purchasing a pistol online, this was after specifically requesting they not ship the magazines. I surrendered those magazines to the gun store since they could not be modified to be 10 round magazines through means available to me. I have also legally purchased rifle magazines online from a reseller who I found out after the fact openly flaunts against magazine capacity restrictions and says he will ship anywhere without regard to laws and even taunts law enforcement to come after him. There are many such persons out there, while perhaps less brazen, who similarly view defiance of such laws as a moral obligation.

All such laws do is hinder the law abiding citizen, and make formerly law abiding citizens into criminals overnight, and put them at risk. With a recent killing spree involving a bulldozer, a man defending his family and home retrieved his own pistol and shot at the attacker. He had to retreat back into his home to fetch another magazine, giving the attacker more time to kill and hurt more innocent people. When the need to use a gun for self defense arises, many do not have the time to 'arm up' like some cheesy action movie from the 80s where one can put on a bandolier of magazines to meet the threat.

The intent of SB308 is to reduce the lethality of rifles and prevent mass casualties by banning higher capacity rifle magazines, this approach is fundamentally flawed. Banning higher capacity rifle magazines would not address the root causes of violence, infringes on the rights of law-abiding citizens, and fails to achieve reduction in gun violence. The proposed higher capacity rifle magazine ban in SB308 is not needed for our state and should not advance for Senate vote.

First, it is important to understand that banning higher capacity rifle magazines would not effectively prevent violent crimes. Proponents of the rifle magazine ban argue that limiting the capacity of magazines would reduce the number of rounds a shooter can fire in a brief period, thereby providing more opportunities for intervention. However, this line of thinking fails to acknowledge that individuals intent on causing harm can easily adapt. Shooters could simply carry multiple smaller magazines and swap them out quickly, rendering the higher capacity magazine ban ineffective. As a retired Navy officer this fact is true as a magazine change can be done VERY rapidly. Furthermore, most gun owners do not use rifles or magazines in the commission of crimes. Limiting rifle magazine size based on the actions of a few individuals unfairly punishes responsible gun owners who use their rifles for legal purposes, such as hunting, sport shooting, or self-defense.

Additionally, banning high-capacity magazines would be an infringement on the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens. The right to bear arms is enshrined in the U.S. Constitution, and it extends to owning the tools necessary for self-defense, hunting, and recreation. High-capacity magazines are a legitimate part of many firearms, especially semi-automatic rifles, which are popular among gun owners. These magazines enable users to engage in sporting activities and are particularly useful for those who rely on them for personal defense in situations where multiple threats may be present. Restricting access to these higher capacity magazines limits an individual's ability to adequately defend themselves or participate in legitimate activities. With the current political climate, restricting higher capacity rifle magazines will be quickly overruled by higher courts to include the US Supreme Court.

Moreover, a higher capacity rifle magazine ban overlooks the broader issue of gun violence. Mass shootings, while tragic, make up a small fraction of overall gun-related violence. The real issue lies in addressing the root causes of violence, such as mental health, poverty, and social alienation, rather than imposing blanket restrictions that do little to address these factors. Studies have shown that magazine capacity does not significantly reduce casualties in mass

shootings. In fact, the 1994 Federal Assault Weapons Ban, which included a provision limiting magazine capacity, had little to no measurable effect on the frequency or lethality of mass shootings. The ban was allowed to expire in 2004, and research indicated that there was no meaningful change in gun violence rates during or after the ban's implementation. Lastly, a 2019 Rand study could find NO correlation between high-capacity magazine bans such as those proposed on rifles in SB 308 to reductions in firearm homicides or injuries.

Finally, banning higher-capacity rifle magazines would create unnecessary obstacles for law-abiding gun owners without improving public safety. Instead of focusing on symbolic measures that may not work, Hawaii should prioritize more effective strategies, such as better background checks, improved mental health care, and addressing the root causes of violence. Efforts to criminalize specific types of firearms accessories such as higher capacity magazines are unlikely to have the desired impact on reducing gun violence and will only serve to alienate responsible gun owners.

In conclusion, banning higher capacity rifle magazine is a bad idea because SB308 fails to address the real causes of violence, infringe on individual rights, and would have negligible effect on mass shooting outcomes. A more comprehensive and balanced approach is needed to tackle the complex issue of gun violence in our society. **Vote no to SB308**.

Hi my name is Andrew Ken Wong and I've been living in Hawaii for 36 years on the island of Oahu. I would ask that members of this hearing understand that this bill does more harm to the community and the law enforcement who protects it. Let me start with the estimated population as of 2024 for the state of Hawaii which is 1,446,146. The estimated police force (patrol officers, sheriffs, supervisors, and detectives) is about 3,000 as of 2024. Now throw in the fact this state gets visitors all year round which as of reported in 2023 totals up to 9,657,607. Why am I bringing up these numbers? In the case of Deshaney v. Winnebago County Department of Social Services (1989) it was ruled that the STATE was not obligated to protect a child from his abusive father and in the case of Warren v. District of Columbia (1981) it was ruled the police was not obligated to protect a woman from her husband who had violated a restraining order. Another case I would like to point out is CASTLE ROCK v. GONZALES [04-278], 545 U.S. 748 (2005) which again the police was not obligated to arrest a husband who violated a restraining order. (a) Within 30 days of the date of this order, the Attorney General shall examine all orders, regulations, guidance, plans, international agreements, and other actions of executive departments and agencies (agencies) to assess any ongoing infringements of the Second Amendment rights of our citizens, and present a proposed plan of action to the President, through the Domestic Policy Advisor, to protect the Second Amendment rights of all Americans.
- (b) In developing such proposed plan of action, the Attorney General shall review, at a minimum:
- (i) All Presidential and agencies' actions from January 2021 through January 2025 that purport to promote safety but may have impinged on the Second Amendment rights of lawabiding citizens;
- (ii) Rules promulgated by the Department of Justice, including by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, from January 2021 through January 2025 pertaining to firearms and/or Federal firearms licensees;
- (iii) Agencies' plans, orders, and actions regarding the so-called "enhanced regulatory enforcement policy" pertaining to firearms and/or Federal firearms licensees;
  - (iv) Reports and related documents issued by the White House Office of Gun Violence

#### Prevention;

- (v) The positions taken by the United States in any and all ongoing and potential litigation that affects or could affect the ability of Americans to exercise their Second Amendment rights;
  - (vi) Agencies' classifications of firearms and ammunition; and
  - (vii) The processing of applications to make, manufacture, transfer, or export firearms.
- Sec. 3. Implementation. Upon submission of the proposed plan of action described in section 2 of this order, the Attorney General shall work with the Domestic Policy Advisor to finalize the plan of action and establish a process for implementation.
- Sec. 4. General Provisions. (a) Nothing in this order shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:
- (i) the authority granted by law to an executive department, agency, or the head thereof; or
- (ii) the functions of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.
- (b) This order shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.
- (c) This order is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against the United States, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.

### **Points of Interest**

- Standard capacity magazines are very popular in the recreational shooting community. Each year, firearms sales within the recreational shooting community account for the majority of sales across the country. 80% of firearms sales dollars are assigned to non-hunting purposes each year, whereas only about 20% are assigned to hunting. Firearm sales are very important, as they actively contribute to the <a href="Merican System of Conservation Funding">American System of Conservation Funding</a> through taxes. These taxes are used to fund state fish and wildlife management agencies, making the recreational shooting community a driving force for state-level conservation efforts nationwide.
- In 2012, H.B. 2640 was passed in Arizona which prevents the Arizona Game and Fish Commission from being able to limit or restrict magazine capacity limits for authorized firearms.
- In 2013, New York State adopted Senate Bill 2230 which instituted a seven-round limit, and although 10 round magazines were allowed to be bought, sold, and possessed, magazines could not be loaded with more than seven rounds. A federal judge subsequently ruled that New York's seven-round limit was unconstitutional.
- In 2016, California Governor Jerry Brown signed <u>S.1446</u>, which severely restricts standard capacity magazines. Under this law, anyone possessing a magazine with a carrying capacity larger than 10 rounds, no matter the caliber, was required to dispose of the magazine by July 1, 2017.
  - This law has subsequently been found unconstitutional and is the focus of ongoing legal cases challenging the validity of the California ban. In 2019, the United States District Court of San Diego found the ban unconstitutional, and this decision was later upheld on appeal by the Ninth Circuit Court.
- A 2022 Ballot Initiative, <u>Measure 114</u>, was voted on by Oregon voters during the November 8th Election. The measure was approved; however, two lawsuits have been filed arguing that the initiative is unconstitutional, and Judge Robert Raschio placed an injunction on the law going into effect.

I am writing today in strong opposition to SB308. This bill is an direct infringement of all firearm owners 2nd amendment rights. A magazine has been determined by courts to be an integral piece of equipment necessary for the functioning of a firearm and is a protected piece of "arms." This would make it necessary for the item to be protected under the 2nd amendment of the United States of Americas Constitution and the Hawaii State Constitution. The ability for the free people to keep and bear arms is an inalienable right. This is not a privilege and cannot be taken away by a government for the law abiding citizens of this nation.

I will also encourage you to educate yourselves of the harm you will be placing law abiding firearms owners in by passing such a bill. First of all a firearm is not something purchased to simply hunt. They can be used for hunting and that's a great purpose for one but the founding of this nation proves that they are useful to protect and prevent harm to those looking to do good. Just like the men in my family who fought in the revolutionary war to defend their homes and their families. This is the same reason our police officers carry firearms, as does our military forces. Citizens have the same rights to protection of their lives and firearms have been used millions of times to prevent deadly force against law abiding citizens, including in Hawaii this past few years. Just recently a young man in the mainland brought a firearm to a small airport and attempted to hijack a small plane but was met by a pilot who had a firearm and was able to disarm him and hold him until police intervened. No shots were fired and a good guy with a gun prevented something worse from taking place. No magazine capacity limit would have prevented that criminal from obtaining or owning a magazine that has capacity for more than 10 rounds. But the law abiding citizen, who is a pilot, very likely would choose adhere to the laws. A law like this would have given the upper hand to the criminal and not the good civilian pilot by limiting the law abiding citizens capacity for ammunition. A woman alone in her home with just her children being attacked by multiple home invaders is better off with a higher capacity of ammunition if, God forbid, she were fighting for her life and safety. One would hope she had a phone in the room and was able to contact law enforcement but that simply may not be the case. These parts are designed for use in a firearm. A firearm in it of itself is an inanimate object that has No ability to cause harm to anyone on its own. The firearm does not decide to be violent or assault someone. The person holding the tool is solely responsible for any action taken with it. The magazine is an easily obtained, non federally regulated party that can easily be mailed or flown into the state without anyone noticing. It's currently illegal to have pistol magazines with a higher capacity. I would bet that law enforcement in the state has seen multitudes of incidents with criminals using higher capacity magazines in crimes. The reason being is because they are

easy to get and hide and laws are not followed by criminals. These laws ONLY put law abiding citizens in danger and only limit capacity for law abiding individuals.

I personally own many magazines that are standard capacity. The financial burden this state will put on my family to make us all less safe is unwarranted and not fair and makes me truly worried and causes duress and infringes on my daily pursuit of happiness. Every year my wife and I consider moving when these bills are submitted because they make us feel less safe, at risk for legal action if we make a mistake following the confusing bills. Bills like this literally take money from our pockets in order to jump through the legal hoops we as law abiding citizens are forced to adhere to in order to appease those in power. The possession of a standard capacity magazine is my right to own as an American citizen and is protected by the 2nd Amendment of the United States Constitution. I have never caused harm or committed a crime with a firearm and should not be treated as a criminal. This bill will only make the ownership of my legally possessed standard capacity magazines a crime and will not make anyone safer.

I teach firearm safety, am a competition shooter, a hunter and a rancher. I use firearms for work, recreationally, to feed and to protect my family. I am an educated gun owner and feel like I am under attack by a politically driven arm of the government. Anti gun activist groups spend millions of dollars and speak with Hawaii politicians and those from other states, donate money and help create bills like this. The author of this bill has proven a grave lack of knowledge of firearms in the past and is involved with some of these organizations and is actively looking to infringe on the 2nd amendment. This is conspiracy, this is wrong and investigations into political donations should be done to all Hawaii politicians working with organizations to infringe upon the constitutional rights of American Citizens.

I would like to encourage you to take a deeper look at this and think critically for a moment. A 10 round magazine is smaller than a 30, 45, or 100rd AR15 magazine. They can be more easily concealed on someone's person. A back pant pocket can carry at least one on each side. If wearing cargo pants/ shorts they can have 4-6 on each lower leg pocket. Traditional upper side pant or shorts pockets could hold another 2-3 or more each depending on how deep the pocket is. They can fit within all jacket pockets and lead to a person concealing more ammunition. Standard capacity 30rd AR15 magazines would protude out and be seen if carried the same way. Another factor to consider is that I and anyone who practices can change a magazine out in less than one second. Think about that for a minute. One second to have another 10 rounds. So it takes me longer to fire 10 rounds than it does to change to another magazine. What does this prevent? This bill is for feelings and based on fear but isn't logic based. Is there any proof in any single study showing that limiting magazine capacity causes less injury by firearms? Will limiting capacity reduce suicide? Will limiting capacity stop an active shooter from attempting an evil act of violence? I'd argue that an evil criminal would simply just keep their standard capacity magazines and choose to use them because they obviously do not care about laws. Another point to consider beyond concealment of the magazines is the fact that a larger standard capacity magazine sticks out further down on the AR15 making a shooters profile smaller when laying down. The gunman who shot at President Trump would have had a lower profile when

shooting and be more concealed against law enforcement with a 10 round magazine than the 30 round or larger magazines. This makes the shooter safer, litteraly making it harder to stop them. If a target is smaller, would it then be logical to say it would be harder to aim and hit that target? Let me help you with the answer. As an experienced trained shooter, the answer is yes; it would be harder to stop someone with a smaller profile than someone who would be forced to stick out more when shooting from a position laying down.

The idea of this bill is that it makes firearms less dangerous for the community. I would argue that facts and reason proves that is factually incorrect and as shown above, in some cases would do the exact opposite. I would encourage the senate to look to data. Has any state with magazine capacity limits prevented harm by enacting such bills into law? The answer is No. There are arguably millions of standard capacity magazines in Hawaii currently as most firearms owners choose to have many for just a single registered firearm. Most, nearly all are used safety and have not caused a public health crisis. The cost burdon placed upon those who would change the magazines to only accept 10 rounds would be immense and is rediculous to think this won't negatively affect all those forced to do so. This state is extremely safe and law abiding firearm owners only add to that and are not the problem. Our government should convict and punish criminals who cause harm or attempt to cause harm. If they use a firearm in a crime then use the law to punish The Criminals and not punish law abiding citizens for others actions.

These parts are not the problem. The problem is within society and not those who function as good people amongst our communities. This is a waste of resources and will not make anyone safer. This will make criminals out of law abiding citizens and I believe that is the true intention of this bill and the many firearms bills being heard in Hawaii year after year. There are several cases pending across the nation and will reach the desk of the Supreme Court. In order to not waste millions of Hawaii tax dollars, this state should wait to find the results of those hearings before enacting bills like this into law. For example, the mass shooting in Aurora, Colorado, in 2012 involved the use of high-capacity magazines, yet the shooter had already switched to smaller magazines when apprehended, showing that the capacity did not prevent the crime. Moreover, research from the RAND Corporation indicates there is no conclusive evidence that such bans reduce mass shootings or gun violence.

### Self-Defense Implications:

In real-world defensive scenarios, especially in environments where immediate help might not be available, such as in many parts of Hawaii where response times can be longer due to geography, having more than 10 rounds can be crucial. Limiting magazines to 10 rounds could put citizens at a disadvantage when facing multiple threats or when under immediate danger with no time for reloads.

### Practicality and Law Enforcement:

Law enforcement officers often carry firearms with magazines that exceed 10 rounds for good reason—to ensure they have adequate ammunition in high-stress, life-threatening situations. If such capacity is necessary for trained professionals, why should civilians, who are also responsible for their safety, be restricted? This discrepancy sends a confusing message about the utility and necessity of such magazines.

## **Enforcement Challenges:**

Enforcing a 10-round magazine limit would place an undue burden on law enforcement and the judicial system. It would require distinguishing between legal and illegal magazines, leading to potential overreach in enforcement and costly legal battles over what many would argue are constitutionally protected items.

### Impact on Competitive Shooting and Recreation:

Many shooting sports and competitions require firearms with higher capacity magazines. This bill would limit the ability of residents to participate in these activities, which are not only recreational but also contribute to the local economy through events, tourism, and related commerce.

In conclusion, the 10-round magazine ban proposed in SB308 is not only a violation of Second Amendment rights but also an ineffective measure against crime. As a concerned citizen and advocate for individual liberties, I strongly oppose the provisions in SB308 that seek to expand the ban on pistols with detachable magazines of over ten rounds to include all firearms with such magazines. This bill **infringes on the fundamental right to self-defense**, a **right enshrined in the United States Constitution**, and fails to address the root causes of violence in our society.

The right to bear arms is a core principle of a free society. The Second Amendment of the United States Constitution explicitly protects the right of the people to keep and bear arms, and this includes the right to possess firearms with magazines that suit an individual's needs for self-defense. Limiting magazine capacity effectively reduces an individual's ability to defend themselves, particularly in situations where they may be facing multiple attackers or in life-threatening emergencies. It is not the government's role to dictate or limit how an individual may defend themselves.

While proponents of the bill argue that magazine restrictions are a reasonable safety measure, the reality is that **law-abiding citizens who follow the law will be disproportionately impacted**. Criminals, by contrast, will continue to access high-capacity magazines through illegal means, rendering the law ineffective in addressing crime. **Limiting magazine capacity punishes responsible gun owners rather than preventing the actions of those who would misuse firearms**.

There is no credible evidence to suggest that restricting magazine capacity will significantly reduce crime or mass shootings. Studies from both criminologists and law enforcement agencies have shown that restrictions on magazine size do not directly correlate with lower rates of violent crime or mass shootings. In fact, many high-profile mass shootings have been carried out with firearms that had magazines with fewer than ten rounds.

Supporters of the bill might argue that limiting magazine capacity reduces the potential for mass casualties by forcing a shooter to reload more often. However, this overlooks the fact that the vast majority of firearm owners use large-capacity magazines responsibly. The goal should be to address the causes of violence—such as mental health issues and criminal behavior—rather than imposing arbitrary restrictions on lawful firearms ownership. Magazine

restrictions do not address the root causes of gun violence and will have little impact on reducing overall crime rates.

SB308 represents an overreach of government authority into the lives of law-abiding citizens. It seeks to criminalize the possession of magazines that are entirely legal and constitutionally protected under the Second Amendment. Furthermore, this bill **disregards the principle of due process by penalizing individuals who legally acquired their magazines under existing laws**. By imposing retrospective restrictions on previously legal items, the bill creates uncertainty and undermines trust in the legal system.

This kind of legislation sets a **dangerous precedent for further encroachments** on personal freedoms. If the government can restrict or confiscate legally purchased property—such as detachable magazines—what's next? The imposition of arbitrary restrictions on other forms of property or rights is a troubling prospect for any free society. Protecting the integrity of individual rights requires that we be vigilant against such erosion of freedoms, no matter how well-intentioned.

While SB308 may seem like a narrow regulation, it could easily be the first step toward broader, more intrusive gun control measures. We have seen throughout history how the gradual imposition of restrictions on rights can snowball into widespread government control. For example, in places like California, small regulatory changes have led to the complete dismantling of individual gun rights over time. What starts as a restriction on magazine capacity today could easily expand to restrictions on firearm types, ownership, and other aspects of personal liberty tomorrow.

A government that controls the capacity of magazines can also control the types of firearms one may own, the types of ammunition one can purchase, and many other aspects of an individual's rights. This slippery slope undermines the foundational principles of freedom and self-determination that our country was built upon.

While many proponents of SB308 claim that magazine restrictions will reduce crime, the evidence supporting this assertion is weak. Research on magazine capacity bans, such as the 1994 Federal Assault Weapons Ban, shows little to no effect on overall crime rates or mass shooting fatalities. Moreover, the laws have proven difficult to enforce, disproportionately affecting law-abiding gun owners without addressing the root causes of gun violence.

Instead of focusing on magazine restrictions, we should look to effective policies that tackle the underlying causes of violence, such as better mental health care, stricter enforcement of existing laws, and community-based prevention programs. These approaches have shown far more promise in reducing crime and improving safety than laws that target legal, responsible gun ownership.

I urge the legislature to reject SB308 and focus on more effective solutions that respect the rights of all citizens.

### 2/7/2025

- Section 1. Purpose. The Second Amendment is an indispensable safeguard of security and liberty. It has preserved the right of the American people to protect ourselves, our families, and our freedoms since the founding of our great Nation. Because it is foundational to maintaining all other rights held by Americans, the right to keep and bear arms must not be infringed.
- Sec. 2. Plan of Action. (a) Within 30 days of the date of this order, the Attorney General shall examine all orders, regulations, guidance, plans, international agreements, and other actions of executive departments and agencies (agencies) to assess any ongoing infringements of the Second Amendment rights of our citizens, and present a proposed plan of action to the President, through the Domestic Policy Advisor, to protect the Second Amendment rights of all Americans.
- (b) In developing such proposed plan of action, the Attorney General shall review, at a minimum:
- (i) All Presidential and agencies' actions from January 2021 through January 2025 that purport to promote safety but may have impinged on the Second Amendment rights of lawabiding citizens;
  - (ii) Rules promulgated by the Department of Justice, including by the Bureau of Alcohol,

Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, from January 2021 through January 2025 pertaining to firearms and/or Federal firearms licensees;

- (iii) Agencies' plans, orders, and actions regarding the so-called "enhanced regulatory enforcement policy" pertaining to firearms and/or Federal firearms licensees;
- (iv) Reports and related documents issued by the White House Office of Gun Violence Prevention;
- (v) The positions taken by the United States in any and all ongoing and potential litigation that affects or could affect the ability of Americans to exercise their Second Amendment rights;
  - (vi) Agencies' classifications of firearms and ammunition; and
  - (vii) The processing of applications to make, manufacture, transfer, or export firearms.
- Sec. 3. Implementation. Upon submission of the proposed plan of action described in section 2 of this order, the Attorney General shall work with the Domestic Policy Advisor to finalize the plan of action and establish a process for implementation.
- Sec. 4. General Provisions. (a) Nothing in this order shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:
- (i) the authority granted by law to an executive department, agency, or the head thereof; or
- (ii) the functions of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.
- (b) This order shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.
- (c) This order is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against the United States, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.

### **Public Harm Imposed by SB308**

SB308 focuses on artificial firearm magazine capacity restrictions that is repeated within the House Chamber's HB893. SB308 also seeks to injure firearm owners with malicious modification requirements in the same manner that HB893 seeks to injure firearm owners via firearm magazine modifications. Provisions in Section 2 of SB308 seeks to ban standard-capacity ammunition magazines and magazine tubes designed for rifles and shotguns. SB308 negligently instructs firearm owners to modify detachable ammunition magazines to accept no more than ten rounds for rifles in addition to pistols and certain shotguns that use detachable magazines. Modifying an ammunition magazine against original manufacture specifications not only can void a warranty, but it can also cause the firearm to malfunction during its firing cycle. Firearm ammunition misfeed and other dangers can pose a risk to the firearm owner whenever they operate their firearms using modified magazines. Such ill-advisement shows that magazine capacity reductions to not constitute valid public safety, but in reality, magnifies a definitive public harm.

### **Focus on Stopping Current Criminal Activity**

**SB308** doesn't have a measurable effect on criminals seeking to commit public harm. The measure won't magically stop a violent criminal from using a firearm magazine in excess of ten rounds. Moreover, the negligent suggestion to modify firearm magazines contradicts the very tenants of public safety, prompting the need to halt **SB308** in the interest of public securing public safety and reduce unnecessary injury.

#### **Unconstitutionality and Second Amendment Violation**

The Second Amendment guarantees that "the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed." The Supreme Court's decision in *Bruen* established a clear standard for evaluating firearm regulations: any restriction must be "consistent with the Nation's historical tradition of firearm regulation." This means that unless a law is grounded in historical precedent from the time of the Founding, it is unconstitutional.

#### 1. No Historical Basis for Banning Commonly Owned Firearms

- The firearms targeted in this proposal—semi-automatic rifles, shotguns, and .50 caliber rifles—are in common use by civilians for lawful purposes, including self-defense, hunting, and sport shooting.
- District of Columbia v. Heller (2008) held that banning firearms in "common use" violates the Second Amendment. The *Bruen* decision reaffirmed this principle, making it clear that broad bans on commonly owned firearms are unconstitutional.

#### 2. Unlawful Expansion of Magazine Restrictions

- High-capacity magazines are widely owned and used for self-defense, home protection, and competitive shooting.
- There is no historical tradition of restricting magazine capacity; therefore, such restrictions fail the *Bruen* test.
- Recent federal court decisions, such as *Duncan v. Bonta* (2023), have found that bans on high-capacity magazines violate the Second Amendment under *Bruen*.

#### **Supreme Court Precedent: Bruen and Its Impact**

In *Bruen*, the Supreme Court struck down New York's restrictive concealed carry law, ruling that gun regulations must be historically justified. The decision emphasized that modern firearm restrictions must align with historical traditions of gun ownership. The proposed prohibitions do not meet this requirement because:

- There is no historical tradition of banning entire categories of commonly used firearms.
- There is no precedent for restricting magazine capacities based on arbitrary limits.
- Firearm restrictions must be evaluated based on whether they respect the individual right to self-defense—a right that these bans severely infringe upon.

#### Conclusion

This proposal is a direct assault on the constitutional rights of law-abiding citizens and contradicts clear Supreme Court precedent. As the ban expired in 2004, crime did not see a noticeable spike, further demonstrating the limited impact such restrictions have on overall safety.

### • The Ineffectiveness of Capacity Limits in Reducing Violence

There is no definitive evidence to show that limiting magazine capacity significantly reduces firearm-related deaths or violent crime rates. Studies conducted in jurisdictions that have implemented magazine bans have failed to demonstrate a clear link between these restrictions and a decrease in gun violence. When similar legislation has been passed, violent crime rates have not substantially decreased, suggesting that magazine size is not a major factor in the outcome of violent encounters.

#### • Historical Context and Real-World Examples

History shows that bans on certain firearms or accessories rarely yield the intended results. The 1994 Federal Assault Weapons Ban, for example, did not significantly reduce mass shootings or gun violence. During and after the ban, incidents of mass shootings continued, suggesting that restricting magazine capacities was an ineffective measure. As the ban expired in 2004, crime did not see a noticeable spike, further demonstrating the limited impact such restrictions have on overall safety.

#### • Legal Challenges and Fees

Hawaii has a terrible track record of winning Second Amendment lawsuits. If passed, and signed into law, a lawsuit will likely be filed which will take years of litigation thousands of dollars in taxpayer money in attorney's fees. In the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals (which Hawaii is a part of) the State of Washington's ban on magazine capacity was declared unconstitutional.

In closing, we should be focusing on bigger issues that is affecting our State and Community. As a former constituent of Rhoads and a current consituent of Moriwaki, I know very well that your respective districts have bigger and more pressing issues to focus on such as homelessness, cost of living/affordable housing, mental health and prosecution for repeat offenders. Aloha, as a mother of children ages 6 months to 26 years, I strongly oppose SB 308. Most of these bills are aimed at criminalizing law abiding citizens, such as myself, while doing NOTHING to stop the real criminals! I want my children to grow up in a state that protects our constitution, and our rights. I want my children to come back to Hawaii after college, to become contributing members of society, and not have to move out of state because of unconstitutional practices by our government. We are supposed to be a government OF the people, FOR the people. But you are NOT listening to the majority of your people.

One's right to self-defense does not stop applying if a certain number of people attack them. Three or four assailants are not unheard-of during home invasions. In historical cases of terrorism or violence based on politics or cultural hatred, like lynchings, over a dozen assailants is common. My family and people like myself have been refugees and victims of violence due to political upheaval, organized crime, and intolerance going back as many generations as we have history. I am not so privileged to think violent mobs, possibly identified by the color of their shirts, robes or hats, could never "happen here".

My family possesses several firearms to provide a plausible defense against targeted or random violence. Gun violence is extremely bad, but the *credible potential* of just gun use is one of the cornerstones of our stable society; **would-be criminals must have reason to expect effective opposition**, from law enforcement or from their would-be victims. I would much rather my family's personal deterrence be theoretical and ambiguous rather than on public record, but certain legislators and special interests draft bills every year that'd make my wife and I felons for possessing what we already asked for and received permission to own, so what option do I have? We have gone through the legal process to acquire our firearms in Hawaii; we took approved training, had our backgrounds checked, submitted our medical records for the perusal of local authorities, had our fingerprints taken, paid for the process, waited a certain amount of time to get permits to acquire, ordered the firearms, and then registered them with the police department. And we do nothing with those firearms that is not legal; we can only have them in very particular places, and they can essentially only be loaded on our property or at a shooting range.

SB308 would declare, that despite going through all legally required steps to acquire and keep firearms in our home, steps which are beyond those in any other state, we would now not be able to own the magazines some of our firearms were designed to use.

Cases of defensive gun use where more than 10 rounds are fired are thankfully rare, but they do happen, and a cursory web search finds recent examples. But moreover, the credible potential of effective defense against mob violence goes a long way in ensuring that actual defensive use is not required. This bill would maintain exceptions for law enforcement, and local police recognize the value of standard capacity magazines; does that alone not demonstrate plausible legal use cases for over 10 rounds in a firearm?

In practice, this bill states that legally-possessed long guns (those with barrels over 16 inches) in our own homes couldn't have any more rounds in them than easily concealable handguns. However, we would still be able to have as many legally-owned firearms in our house as we want; we could have a dozen guns each with a 10-round magazine in them, but we couldn't have a single gun with an 11-round magazine. Is that logical? What is this bill seeking to achieve, what would it incentivize?

For the role of self-defense in a neighborhood, smaller calibers like 5.7x28 should be encouraged; these are not highly energetic rounds, but they are viable for self-defense and offer reduced over-penetration risk. Their lack of power is made up for with low recoil and larger magazine capacities, commonly up to 50 rounds. A law limiting capacity to ten rounds incentivizes larger, more powerful calibers that are more prone to overpenetration. If one can only have 10 rounds for self-defense, it's logical for them to select 10 big rounds; but if one's neighbors were ever defending themselves, it's logical to prefer they use smaller rounds.

This bill would also add thousands of magazines to an outstanding grey area of what exactly counts as a legal reduced-capacity magazine. We still don't know what "not readily restorable" means exactly, despite the language having been applied to pistol magazines for 30-some years. Does filling a 20-round magazine with enough epoxy so it only can fit 10 rounds keep us from being felons? What about using hot glue? Bubble gum? What about putting a nut and bolt through the side of it? Or a rivet? This sort of ambiguity weighs most heavily on the minds of those of those who society has the least reason to worry about. I would be personally compelled to modify over a dozen magazines; how would I be able to determine whether my modifications were non-readily-restorable enough to keep me from being tried as a felon?

Firearms are serialized, their purchases are controlled, and bureaucracies track them on the national and local levels, yet they still routinely end up in the hands of those who can't legally hold them. The magazines that this bill seeks to ban are sold with zero legal oversight in most of the country, so it would be trivial for the criminally-minded to get them in the mail. The enforcement of this law is likely to only manifest as additional legal charges after another crime has been committed; any illegal magazines are likely to be found along with ammunition and a (likely illegally-possessed) gun in a location where it'd be illegal to possess either. So what is this law expecting to accomplish? Is it worth limiting the self-defense capacity of the people who fulfill every legal requirement to keep firearms in their own homes, to enable prosecutors to add "magazine possession" charges to what would already be gun and ammo possession charges?

Please don't advance SB308, and rather spend the legislature's time on bills that benefit our community.
