We met our VP of Clinical Product, Emaley McCulloch, when she was building a business within HTDC's manoa site, and without her, we would not be where we are today. 

This investment will help ensure that our workforce remains competitive, keeping talent and opportunity within the state rather than seeing it migrate elsewhere. It would also allow consultants like me to partner with HTDC to support smaller and newer businesses who would otherwise be unable to retain and afford my consulting services.

I strongly encourage the passage of SB989 to support small businesses in Hawai'i and strengthen our local economy through technology-driven solutions.
