I write today in strong support of SCR112 SD1, which requests the City and County of Honolulu to light up Honolulu Hale in purple on August 7th of each year to honor National Purple Heart Day.

As a Ranger in the United States Army, I have been deployed to combat zones. I have seen things, realities of war and sacrifice that have left a permanent impression on me. These experiences have deepened my respect for the courage and resilience of our service members, especially those who have borne the wounds of battle. I know what it means to walk beside soldiers who carry not only their gear, but their weight of pain and loss. Some have returned home changed forever, others have not returned at all.
