## FINAL REPORT OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA SHARING WORKING GROUP

Pursuant to Act 157, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023

Submitted to the Thirty-Third State Legislature Regular Session of 2026

Act 157, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, established the Criminal Justice Data Sharing Working Group (working group) to address the complexities of statewide data sharing in the criminal justice system and to make recommendations for a statewide criminal justice data repository. The working group is required to provide the Legislature annual updates including recommendations for any legislative or administrative action the working group deems appropriate to address data sharing concerns or to enable the working group to carry out its purpose. A final report, including recommendations for further actions to be implemented over the following two years, shall be submitted no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2026, for a repository start date of July 1, 2028. The working group shall cease to exist on July 1, 2029.

#### I. The Role of the Criminal Justice Data Sharing Working Group

The working group is to make recommendations for a statewide criminal justice data repository to:

- (1) Facilitate collaborative decision-making, coordinated planning, and cooperative implementation among criminal justice agencies and relevant partners;
- (2) Support the fair, efficient, and effective operation of the criminal justice system;
- (3) Promote interoperability through the use of common elements;

- (4) Allow agencies to share appropriate information securely and efficiently; and
- (5) Support criminal justice and other purposes, including improved public safety and homeland security, while respecting the privacy of citizens.
