A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFENSE OF PROMOTING PORNOGRAPHY FOR MINORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the prevention of
- 2 sexual exploitation and abuse of children is a government
- 3 objective of paramount importance, and this objective extends to
- 4 blocking dissemination of pornographic materials to children.
- 5 To improve the ability to prosecute those who promote
- 6 pornography for minors, Act 244, Session Laws of Hawaii 2024,
- 7 specifically allowed the prosecution of the offense of promoting
- 8 pornography for minors through undercover operations.
- 9 The legislature further finds that large-scale undercover
- 10 operations have proven to be an effective tool in reducing and
- 11 combating offenders who solicit minors to engage in sexual
- 12 activities on the Internet. Expeditious charging is crucial
- 13 during these large-scale operations. Main charges brought from
- 14 these operations, the offenses of electronic enticement of a
- 15 child under sections 707-756 and 707-757, Hawaii Revised
- 16 Statutes, and the offense of commercial sexual exploitation of a
- 17 minor under section 712-1209.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, can be

- 1 instituted by written information. Another major charge
- 2 resulting from undercover operations, the offense of promoting
- 3 pornography for minors under section 712-1215, Hawaii Revised
- 4 Statutes, however, is included in the list of offenses that
- 5 cannot be instituted by written information under section 806-
- 6 83, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to enhance the
- 8 effectiveness of Act 244, Session Laws of Hawaii 2024, by
- 9 allowing the offense of promoting pornography for minors to be
- 10 instituted by written information.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 806-83, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) Criminal charges may be instituted by written
- 14 information for a felony when the charge is a class C felony,
- 15 except under:
- 16 (1) Section 159-28 (bribery related to the Hawaii Meat
- 17 Inspection Act);
- 18 (2) Section 161-28 (bribery related to the Hawaii Poultry
