A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAUMA-INFORMED CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that children and
- 2 families who are referred to the department of human services
- 3 child welfare services branch have undergone a significant
- 4 amount of trauma.
- 5 The malama ohana working group created by Act 86, Session
- 6 Laws of Hawaii 2023, has submitted a report to the legislature
- 7 that provides recommendations to create transformative changes
- 8 to the State's existing child welfare system. Among the
- 9 recommendations, the malama ohana working group has put forward
- 10 a call for all child welfare services branch staff in the
- 11 department of human services to receive comprehensive trauma-
- 12 informed care training as part of developing a trauma-informed
- 13 organization.
- 14 The legislature also finds that, in order for an
- 15 organization to fully adopt a trauma-informed approach, there
- 16 must be policies and practices that address the needs of staff,
- 17 including training on the impacts of vicarious trauma, secondary

- 3 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 4 (1) Direct the office of wellness and resilience to
 5 collaborate with the department of human services to,
 6 either directly or by contract, design, administer,
 7 and implement a program for trauma-informed
 8 organizational assessments and a training curriculum
 9 for the department of human services child welfare
- 11 (2) Appropriate funds for the program.

- SECTION 2. (a) The office of wellness and resilience, in collaboration with the department of human services, shall design, administer, and implement a trauma-informed care organizational assessment and training program, either directly or by contract.
- 17 (b) The trauma-informed organizational assessment and
 18 training curriculum for the department of human services child
 19 welfare services branch staff shall specifically include:
- (1) An evidence-based assessment tool to help child
 welfare services branch staff assess their current

3	(2)	An evidence-based assessment tool to measure the						
4		degree to which child welfare services branch staff						
5		address worker well-being, including the effects of						
6		vicarious trauma, secondary traumatic stress, and

8	(3)	A training curriculum that establishes a cohort of						
9		trained trainers, as well as a branch-wide trauma-						
10		informed care curriculum accompanied by ongoing						
11		technical assistance;						
12	(4)	Specialized trauma-informed supervisor training and						
13		technical assistance to ensure that implementation of						
14		the curriculum is sustainable; and						
15	(5)	A child welfare services expert to consult on the						
16		implementation of the assessment findings.						
17	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general							
18	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so						
19	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and						
20	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal						
21	year 2026	-2027 for the office of wellness and resilience to,

- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 6 wellness and resilience for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
