#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 356D-6.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[4]§356D-6.7[4] Closed to the public. (a) Any area
4 within a housing project or on a parcel owned by the authority
5 that is not a public street, road, highway, sidewalk, or county
6 or state bus stop, shall be closed to the public where signs are
7 displayed that read: "Closed to the Public - No Trespassing", or
8 a substantially similar message; provided that the signs:

9 (1) Contain letters no less than two inches in height; and
10 (2) Are placed at reasonable intervals no less than three
11 signs to a mile along the boundary line of the areas
12 that are closed to the public and at all entrances to
13 the property, in a manner and position to be clearly
14 noticeable from outside the boundary line.

15 (b) Any authority office or facility shall be closed to
16 the public during non-business hours where signs are displayed
17 that read: "Closed to the Public - No Trespassing", or a

18 substantially similar message, and include hours of operation.

DEPARTMENT: Human Services

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY.

PURPOSE: To expressly provide conditions under which Hawaii Public Housing Authority (HPHA) parcels and administrative offices and facilities may be closed to the public so that violations of section 356D-6.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), may be prosecuted as criminal trespass in the second degree pursuant to section 708-814, HRS.

MEANS: Amend section 356D-6.7, HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: Clarifying the conditions under which HPHA properties may be closed to the public will allow prosecution of trespassers pursuant to section 708-814, HRS. Clarifying what property is closed to members of the public will assist to deter late night gatherings that disturb the community.

> <u>Impact on the public:</u> Discouraging trespassing on certain HPHA properties should benefit the public.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This bill will assist the HPHA in enforcing violations of a written prohibition to enter a housing project, HPHA parcel, or administrative office and facility based on an unlawful act.
