A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 321-225, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 The advisory committee shall be composed of twenty 4 three nonvoting ex-officio members, who shall be the 5 director of transportation, the adjutant general, and the 6 administrator of the state health planning and development agency, or the designated representatives thereof, and seventeen 7 8 members representing all counties of the State who shall be 9 appointed by the governor subject to section 26-34 as follows: 10 Five members who shall be physicians experienced in 11 the conduct and delivery of emergency medical 12 services; provided that at least two shall be engaged in the practice of emergency medicine and be board-13 14 eligible or board-certified by the American Board of Emergency Medicine, and provided further that at least 15 16 one physician shall be engaged in the practice of

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1		pediatrics and be board-eligible or board-certified by
2		the American Board of Pediatrics;
3	(2)	Four members who shall be consumers of health care and
4		who shall have no connection with or relationship to
5		the health care system of the State and who shall be
6		representative of all counties;
7	(3)	Four members of allied health professions related to
8		emergency medical services; and
9	(4)	Four members, one from each county, who shall be
10		mobile intensive care technicians or emergency medical
11		technicians engaged in the practice of pre-hospital
12		emergency medical service.
13	The member	rs of the advisory committee shall serve without
14	compensation, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses	
15	incurred in the performance of their duties, including travel	
16	expenses. The chairperson of the advisory committee shall be	
17	elected by the members from among their numbers. [A majority of	
18	the members of the advisory committee] A total of seven members	
19	of the advisory committee, who have been appointed by the	
20	governor and whose terms have not expired, shall constitute a	
21	quorum for the conduct of business of the advisory committee. A	
22	majority vote of the members present at a meeting at which a	

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1	quorum is established shall be necessary to validate any action
2	of the committee."
3	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
