A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII RELIEF FUNDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that ensuring student well-being by providing student aid in direct response to an emergency or disaster is a matter of statewide concern.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 304A-2153, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "\$304A-2153 University of Hawaii tuition and fees special
- 7 fund. (a) There is established the [University] university of
- 8 Hawaii tuition and fees special fund into which shall be
- 9 deposited all revenue collected by the university for regular,
- 10 summer, and continuing education credit tuition, tuition-related
- 11 course and fee charges, and any other charges to students,
- 12 except as provided by law. Moneys deposited into the fund shall
- 13 be expended to maintain or improve the university's programs and
- 14 operations and shall not be:
- 15 (1) Used as a justification for reducing any budget
- 16 request or allotment to the university unless the
- 17 university requests such a reduction;

- (2) Transferred unless otherwise authorized by the
 legislature; and
- 3 (3) Restricted by the governor or the director of finance4 without the prior approval of the legislature.
- Any rule, policy, or action of any agency or individual in contravention of this subsection shall be void as against public policy.
- 8 Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the board of 9 regents may authorize expenditures of up to \$3,000,000 annually, 10 excluding in-kind services, from this fund for the purposes of 11 promoting alumni relations and generating private donations for **12** deposit into the University of Hawaii Foundation for the **13** purposes of the university. Any expenditure authorized pursuant to this subsection shall be for a public purpose and shall not 14 be subject to chapters 42F, 103, 103D, and 103F. The university 15 shall submit a comprehensive report to the legislature detailing 16 17 the use of any funds authorized by the board under this

4	regents may authorize expenditures of up to

9	university shall submit a comprehensive report to the

- 6 identification number UOH900 ([University] university of Hawaii,
- 7 system wide support)."
- 8 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
