A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding two new sections to part II, subpart C, to be
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§302A- Cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated
5	external defibrillators; training. (a) Beginning with the
6	2025-2026 school year, the department of education shall
7	establish a cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated external
8	defibrillator training program using a program that:
9	(1) Has been developed by the American Heart Association
10	or American Red Cross or is a nationally recognized
11	cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated external
12	defibrillator training program; and
13	(2) Is based on the most current, national, evidence-
14	based, emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for
15	the performance of cardiopulmonary resuscitation and
16	the use of an automated external defibrillator.

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1	(b)	The cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated
2	external	defibrillator training program shall:
3	(1)	Be conducted in all public middle, intermediate, and
4		high schools in the State and made available to all
5	••	students in grades six through twelve; and
6	(2)	Be incorporated as an activity within the school's
7		existing health or physical education curriculum.
8	(c)	The training program shall include hands-on practicing
9	of cardion	oulmonary resuscitation and automated external
10	defibrilla	ator use.
11	(d)	All courses taught pursuant to this section that
12	result in	certification shall be taught by a certified
13	cardiopulm	monary resuscitation or automated external
14	defibrilla	ator instructor; provided that a certified
15	cardiopulm	monary resuscitation or automated external
16	defibrilla	ator instructor shall not be required to facilitate or
17	oversee th	ne instruction of any course taught pursuant to this
18	section th	nat does not result in certification.
19	<u>(e)</u>	A public middle, intermediate, or high school may
20	waive the	requirement for instruction pursuant to this section
21	for any st	udent who is unable to participate in hands-on

- 3 (f) Neither the department nor any of its agencies,
- 4 boards, members, personnel, designees, agents, contractors, or
- 5 volunteers shall be liable in civil damages to any party for any

- 7 participation in, or implementation of the components of the
- 8 training program or protocol required by this section unless
- 9 that act or omission amounts to gross negligence, wilful and
- 10 wanton conduct, or intentional wrongdoing.

- 12 (a) Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, each public
- 13 elementary, middle, intermediate, and high school in the State
- 14 shall establish a cardiac emergency response plan that
- 15 establishes specific steps necessary to reduce death from
- 16 cardiac arrest.
- 17 (b) The cardiac emergency response plan shall include
- 18 evidence-based standards and core elements that are nationally
- 19 recognized, evidence-based standards and core elements or have
- 20 been developed by the American Heart Association. The cardiac

13		school nurses, coaches, and athletic trainers;

15		(B) The training shall follow evidence-based
6		guidelines established by the American Heart

9	(5)	Practice drills, including the use of applicable
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U	•	equipment; and

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1	(6)	The appropriate use of school personnel to respond to
2		incidents involving an individual experiencing sudden
3		cardiac arrest or a similar life-threating cardiac
4		emergency while on school grounds.
5	(C)	The cardiac emergency response plan shall be provided
6	to all te	achers and shall be prominently placed at appropriate
7	locations	throughout the school campus.
8	(d)	School officials shall work directly with local
9	emergency	service providers to integrate the cardiac emergency
10	plan with	the appropriate emergency medical service."

Description:

Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, requires the Department of Education to establish a cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated external defibrillator training program for public school students in grades six through twelve as part of existing health or physical education curriculum. Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, requires the establishment of a cardiac emergency response plan in all public elementary, middle, intermediate, and high schools in the State.

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
