### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Hawaii offers a unique opportunity for job
- 2 growth and economic development through its important geographic
- 3 location. In fiscal year 2022, the State received almost
- 4 \$9,000,000,000 in defense spending. Furthermore, the number of
- 5 defense-related jobs increased by about ten thousand jobs from
- 6 fiscal year 2018 to fiscal year 2022. Many of these jobs are in
- 7 the areas of information technology, cybersecurity,
- 8 intelligence, data science, and advanced manufacturing fields.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to build a local workforce to
- 10 meet this growing demand.
- 11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
- 14 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 15 2026-2027 for economic diversification to develop and increase
- 16 the defense-related workforce in the State.
