A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that drowning is the 2 leading cause of death for children aged one to fifteen in the 3 State and disproportionately affects individuals under the age 4 of twenty-five. This preventable tragedy represents a 5 significant public health concern and underscores the urgent 6 need for action to address water safety in our island state. 7 Hawaii's resident drowning rate is the second highest in the nation, highlighting a critical gap in water safety education 8 9 and resources. Less than two per cent of Hawaii's second 10 graders possess basic skills necessary to avoid or recover from 11 drowning, further emphasizing the importance of implementing 12 comprehensive water safety measures. Low-income students have 13 even lower percentages, and Native Hawaiians and Pacific 14 Islanders are disproportionately affected by drowning. This 15 disparity underscores the necessity for equitable, culturally 16 responsive interventions that address the specific needs of 17 these communities. Also, teaching students how to safely access

 behaviors and dispositions that are reminiscent of Hawaii's
 unique context, and to honor the qualities and values of the
 indigenous language and culture of Hawaii."

6 The legislature further finds that evidence-based 7 approaches demonstrate that drowning is preventable. Research 8 shows that one month of formal swimming lessons can reduce the 9 risk of drowning in children by eighty-eight per cent. The 10 legislature recognizes the importance of investing in water 11 safety education and ensuring equitable access to lifesaving 12 resources in order to reduce health disparities and promote a 13 culture of water safety. In an effort to increase water safety 14 awareness across the State, the legislature enacted Act 24, 15 Session Laws of Hawaii 2024, to designate May 15 of each year as Water Safety Day. Expanding access to swimming lessons and 16 17 water safety education is a proven strategy to protect Hawaii's 18 youth and reduce drowning incidents statewide.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require, and
appropriate funds to, the department of education to establish a
standards-based water safety education pilot program. This Act

8	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
9	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and		
10	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
11	year 2026-2027 for the department of education to establish the		
12	standards-based water safety education pilot program required		
13	under this Act.		
14	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
15	of education for the purposes of this Act.		
16	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
