A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that cellphone use in
- 2 schools can be detrimental to student achievement and wellbeing.
- 3 Research has shown that allowing cellphones in the classroom
- 4 impacts student focus and engagement, leading to decreased
- 5 academic performance on tests and adversely impacting students'
- 6 long-term learning retention. Excessive cellphone use can also
- 7 distract students from in-person socialization, which is
- 8 critical for students' physical and mental wellbeing.
- 9 The legislature further finds that there is a growing
- 10 number of states that are banning or restricting cellphone use
- 11 in schools. At least nineteen states have passed laws or
- 12 enacted policies that ban or restrict students' use of
- 13 cellphones in schools statewide or have recommended that local
- 14 districts enact bans or restrictive policies. In Hawaii,
- 15 efforts to ban cellphones in schools have had a positive impact
- 16 on students, with teachers reporting fewer distractions in class
- 17 and more social interactions among students.



- 1 The legislature declares that banning the use of cell
- 2 phones and related devices, such as smart watches, earbuds,
- 3 AirPods, Bluetooth connected headphones, and smart glasses, by
- 4 students during school hours is a matter of statewide concern.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to require the board of
- 6 education to adopt a policy that bans the use of cell phones and
- 7 related devices, such as smart watches, earbuds, AirPods,
- 8 Bluetooth connected headphones, and smart glasses, by students
- 9 during school hours.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "§302A- Phone-and-related-devices-free, bell-to-bell
- 14 policy. The board shall establish a phone-and-related-devices-
- 15 free, bell-to-bell policy for public schools to be implemented
- 16 beginning with the 2025-2026 school year; provided that the
- 17 policy may be implemented in phases for each school level."
- 18 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
