# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOCIAL SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the monthly needs 2 allowance afforded to individuals living in certain long-term 3 care facilities and monthly state supplemental payment to specified care providers was recently increased by \$25 and \$132, 4 5 respectively. However, the state supplemental payment is administered by the Social Security Administration, which issues 6 7 one monthly payment to the recipient or representative payee 8 that includes the state supplemental payment and supplemental 9 security income. Therefore, due to the ceiling limit, the \$25 10 needs allowance increase is being deducted from the \$132 state supplemental payment increase, which was not the intent of the 11 12 legislature when it passed Acts 18 and 20, Session Laws of Hawaii 2024. 13

14 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to clarify that the 15 monthly needs allowance afforded to individuals living in 16 certain long-term care facilities is not intended to replace or 17 affect funds received as a state supplemental payment for

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1 domiciliary care and shall be supplemental to any funds provided 2 to a recipient as a state supplemental payment for domiciliary 3 care.

4 SECTION 2. Section 346-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 6 "(C) The director, pursuant to chapter 91, shall determine 7 the rate of payment for domiciliary care, including care 8 provided in licensed developmental disabilities domiciliary 9 homes, community care foster family homes, and certified adult 10 foster homes, to be provided to recipients who are eligible for 11 federal supplemental security income or public assistance, or 12 both. The director shall provide for level of care payment and 13 needs allowance as follows: 14 For adult residential care homes classified as (1)

14(1)For addit residential care nomes classified as15facility type I, licensed developmental disabilities16domiciliary homes as defined under section 321-15.9,17community care foster family homes as defined under18section 321-481, and certified adult foster homes as19defined under section 321-11.2, the state supplemental20payment, which includes the care rate and needs21allowance, shall not exceed [\$784;] \$829; and

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1 (2) For adult residential care homes classified as 2 facility type II, the state supplemental payment, 3 which includes the care rate and needs allowance, 4 shall not exceed [<del>\$892.</del>] \$937. 5 If the operator does not provide the quality of care 6 consistent with the needs of the individual to the satisfaction 7 of the department, the department may remove the recipient to 8 another facility. 9 The department shall handle abusive practices under this 10 section in accordance with chapter 91. 11 Nothing in this subsection shall allow the director to 12 remove a recipient from an adult residential care home or other 13 similar institution if the recipient does not desire to be 14 removed and the operator is agreeable to the recipient 15 remaining, except where the recipient requires a higher level of 16 care than provided or where the recipient no longer requires any 17 domiciliary care." SECTION 3. Section 346D-4.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 19 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 20 "(c) The State's supplemental payment, as authorized by 21 section 346-53(c)(1) and (2), for a needs allowance under

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1 subsection (a) shall be increased by an amount necessary to
2 bring the allowance up to \$75 per month. The payment under this
3 section shall be afforded to an individual notwithstanding that
4 the individual is incapacitated; provided that the moneys may be
5 spent on behalf of the client, with a written accounting, by the
6 operator of the residence or facility."

7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
