

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 706-606.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. 18	of the cla	ass C felony offenses enumerated above, or any felony
19	conviction	n of another jurisdiction, shall be sentenced to a
20	mandatory	minimum period of imprisonment without possibility of
21	parole as	provided in subsection (2)."

1	2.	By amending subsection (5) to read:
2	"(5)	Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, any
3	person co	nvicted of any of the following misdemeanor offenses:
4	(a)	Section 707-712 relating to assault in the third
5		degree;
6	(b)	Section 707-717 relating to terroristic threatening in
7		the second degree;
8	(c)	Section 707-733 relating to sexual assault in the
9		fourth degree;
10	(d)	Section [ $\frac{708-822}{708-823}$ ] relating to criminal
11		property damage in the [third] fourth degree;
12	(e)	Section 708-832 relating to theft in the third degree;

14	(f)	Section 708-833.5(2) relating to misdemeanor

16	and who h	as been convicted of any of the offenses enumerated
17	above on	at least three prior and separate occasions within
18	three yea	rs of the date of the commission of the present
19	offense,	shall be sentenced to no less than nine months of
20	imprisonm	ent. Whenever a court sentences a defendant under this
21	subsection	n for an offense under section 707-733, the court shall

- 1 order the defendant to participate in a sex offender assessment
- 2 and, if recommended based on the assessment, participate in the
- 3 sex offender treatment program established by chapter 353E."
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 708-813, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by amending subsection (4) to read as follows:
- 6 "(4) Criminal trespass in the first degree [is] shall be a
- 7 [misdemeanor.] class C felony."
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 708-814, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by amending subsection (3) to read as follows:
- "(3) Criminal trespass in the second degree [is] shall be
- 11 a [petty] misdemeanor."
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 708-821, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows:
- "(2) Criminal property damage in the second degree [is]
- 15 shall be a class [C] B felony."
- 16 SECTION 5. Section 708-822, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows:
- "(2) Criminal property damage in the third degree [is]
- 19 shall be a [misdemeanor.] class C felony."
- 20 SECTION 6. Section 708-823, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows:



- 1 "(2) Criminal property damage in the fourth degree [is]
- 2 shall be a [petty] misdemeanor."
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
