### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 286-301, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) The examiner of drivers, upon receipt of the
4	application by any individual who is a resident or a temporary
5	resident of [ <del>this</del> ] <u>the</u> State, shall issue an identification
6	card, free of charge, to that individual [upon receipt of any
7	appropriate fee established pursuant to section 286-309]."
8	SECTION 2. Section 286-301.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
10	"(b) Every application under this section shall be <u>free of</u>
11	charge and made upon the form and in the manner required by
12	section 286-303 [and shall be accompanied by the fee established
13	for compliant identification cards pursuant to section
14	<del>286-309</del> ]."
15	SECTION 3. Section 286-301.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

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1 "(b) Every application under this section shall be free of charge and made upon the form, and in the manner, required by 2 section 286-303 [and be accompanied by the fee established for 3 4 non-limited purpose identification cards pursuant to section 286-309]. The examiner of drivers shall not: 5 Require any applicant under this section to furnish 6 (1) 7 information regarding the applicant's eligibility or 8 ineligibility for a social security number; or 9 Disclose the identity of any applicant who does not (2) 10 provide a social security card or social security number." 11 12 SECTION 4. Section 286-303, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 14 "(b) Application for renewal of an identification card 15 issued after November 1, 1998, for an individual eighty years of 16 age or older may be done by mailing in or electronically 17 submitting a completed application [and fee], if there is no 18 change in name and citizenship status. The director shall adopt rules to allow for renewal by mail or electronic methods for 19 20 individuals with physical or intellectual disabilities for whom 21 application in person presents a serious burden. For an

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individual who has a letter from a licensed primary care 1 provider certifying that a severe disability causes the 2 3 individual to be homebound, the director shall adopt rules allowing for application for renewal of an identification card 4 under this section by means other than in-person appearance. A 5 non-compliant identification card shall be issued in accordance 6 7 with section 286-301.5 for renewal applications not made in 8 person."

9 SECTION 5. Section 286-306, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 11 "(a) Every identification card issued under this part, 12 whether an original or a renewal, shall bear an expiration date that shall be the date and month of the individual's birthday 13 14 eight years after the year of issuance; provided that if the 15 individual is a legal nonimmigrant, the certificate shall bear an expiration date that is the same as the expiration date on 16 the individual's arrival-departure record, CBP Form I-94. A 17 18 cardholder may renew the cardholder's identification card, free of charge, within six months before the day on which it expires 19 20 by filing an application in accordance with section 286-303 [and

14	SECT	ION 6. Section 286-308, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
16	"(a)	A cardholder who, after receiving an identification
17	card, has	a change in one or more of the following:
18	(1)	Name, legally changed by marriage, divorce, adoption,
19		legitimization, order of the lieutenant governor, or
20		other legal means;
21	(2)	Citizenship status;



1 (3) Address; or

2 Individual in charge of the cardholder (in the case of (4) 3 a minor or incompetent individual), within thirty days after the change, shall report the change, 4 5 submit supporting documents, and present the cardholder's 6 identification card to the examiner. The examiner of drivers, 7 upon being furnished with satisfactory proof as to the change, [and receiving payment of the fee,] shall cancel the 8 9 identification card and issue a new identification card, free of 10 charge, bearing the new name, citizenship status, or address of 11 the cardholder, making appropriate notation of the facts upon

12 the records of the examiner."

13 SECTION 7. Section 286-309, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows:

15 "§286-309 Rules. For the purpose of carrying out this 16 part, the director, pursuant to chapter 91, shall adopt rules 17 [including rules assessing reasonable fees] for the services 18 provided under this part. The rules shall[÷

19 (1) Authorize] <u>authorize</u> the examiner of drivers to waive 20 any fee in cases of extreme hardship and provide criteria for 21 determining whether a waiver is warranted[<del>; and</del>

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1	(2) Direct the examiner of drivers to waive all fees for
2	the issuance of an original or renewal-identification card for
3	any individual who is homeless; provided the individual's
4	homeless status is corroborated by a verification letter issued
5	by a homeless service provider.], except that no fee shall be
6	charged in connection with the issuance or renewal of any civil
7	identification card under this part."
8	SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
10	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
11	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
12	year 2026-2027 for the costs related to civil identification
13	card issuance; provided that no funds shall be made available
14	under this Act unless matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by
15	the counties.
16	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
17	of transportation for the purposes of this Act.
18	SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
