A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, on August 8, 2023,
- 2 the historic town of Lahaina suffered a devastating fire. A
- 3 confluence of environmental and geographic factors, combined
- 4 with preparedness and response conditions, enabled the fire to
- 5 rapidly intensify into an urban conflagration resulting in heavy
- 6 loss of life, widespread destruction of homes and businesses,
- 7 and catastrophic impacts on the community.
- 8 The legislature further finds that, in the aftermath of the
- 9 Lahaina fire, several independent initiatives were launched to
- 10 investigate and identify the cause of the fire, identify
- 11 preventative action to reduce the risk of fires throughout the
- 12 State, and further reforms to bolster fire preparedness. One
- 13 such initiative, the interim working groups established by the
- 14 house of representatives, identified the need for staff
- 15 specifically dedicated to wildland fire prevention and proposed
- 16 the establishment of the office of the state fire marshal to
- 17 serve as the staff dedicated to such wildland fire prevention.

1 The legislature also finds that, in response to that 2 proposal, Act 209, Session Laws of Hawaii 2024, was enacted to 3 establish the office of the state fire marshal, determine the 4 duties and jurisdiction of the state fire marshal, and fund the 5 office, including the salary for one full-time equivalent 6 permanent state fire marshal, for fiscal year 2024-2025. The legislature finds that, subsequent to the regular 7 8 session of 2024, another initiative, the Lahaina Fire Incident 9 Analysis Report by the Fire Safety Research Institute, 10 independently identified the need for a state-funded 11 organization with the sole responsibility for wildfire 12 readiness, such as a state fire marshal. The Lahaina Fire 13 Incident Analysis Report also contemplates greater 14 responsibilities for the state fire marshal. The legislature 15 believes that the compensation for the state fire marshal should 16 be commensurate with the greater responsibilities contemplated 17 in the Lahaina Fire Incident Analysis Report. 18 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate 19 funds to supplement the salary for the state fire marshal. SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 20 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
- 2 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 3 year 2026-2027 to supplement the salary of the one full-time
- 4 equivalent (1.00 FTE) permanent state fire marshal.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 6 of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
