A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that existing law
- 2 specifies the circumstances under which an employees' retirement
- 3 system retirant may be reemployed without the suspension of the
- 4 retirant's benefits and provides remedies for the employees'
- 5 retirement system if a retirant is reemployed in violation of
- 6 chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and any administrative rule
- 7 adopted thereunder.
- 8 The legislature further finds that there is a labor
- 9 shortage that makes it difficult to fill investigator positions
- 10 in the department of the attorney general and law enforcement
- 11 officer positions that may be stationed at public schools as
- 12 school resource officers.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish
- 14 additional categories of retirants who may be employed without
- 15 reenrollment in the employees' retirement system and without
- 16 loss or interruption of benefits.

1 SECTION 2. Section 88-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By amending subsection (d) to read: "(d) A retirant may be employed without reenrollment in 4 the system and suffer no loss or interruption of benefits 5 provided by the system or under chapter 87A if the retirant is 6 7 employed: 8 (1) As an elective officer pursuant to section 88-42.6(c) or as a member of the legislature pursuant to section 9 10 88-73(d); 11 (2) As a juror or precinct official; 12 As a part-time or temporary employee excluded from (3) membership in the system pursuant to section 88-43, as 13 14 a session employee excluded from membership in the system pursuant to section 88-54.2, as the president 15 and chief executive officer of the Hawaii tourism 16 17 authority excluded from membership in the system 18 pursuant to section 201B-2, or as any other employee 19 expressly excluded by law from membership in the 20 system; provided that:

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1		(A)	The retirant was not employed by the State or a
2			county during the six calendar months [prior to]
3			before the first day of reemployment; and
4		(B)	No agreement was entered into between the State
5			or a county and the retirant, [prior to] before
6			the retirement of the retirant, for the return to
7			work by the retirant after retirement;
8	(4)	In a	position identified by the appropriate
9		juri	sdiction as a labor shortage or difficult-to-fill
10		posi	tion; provided that:
11		(A)	The retirant was not employed by the State or a
12			county during the twelve calendar months [prior
13			to] before the first day of reemployment;
14		(B)	No agreement was entered into between the State
15			or a county and the retirant, [prior to] before
16			the retirement of the retirant, for the return to
17			work by the retirant after retirement; and
18		(C)	Each employer shall contribute to the pension
19			accumulation fund the required percentage of the
20			rehired retirant's compensation to amortize the

1			system s unrunded actualial accided liability,
2			[or]
3	(5)	As a	teacher or an administrator in a teacher shortage
4		area	identified by the department of education or in a
5		char	ter school or as a mentor for new classroom
6		teac	hers; provided that:
7		(A)	The retirant was not employed by the State or a
8			county during the twelve calendar months [prior
9			to] before the first day of reemployment;
10		(B)	No agreement was entered into between the State
11			or a county and the retirant [prior to] before
12			the retirement of the retirant, for the return to
13			work by the retirant after retirement; and
14		(C)	The department of education or charter school
15			shall contribute to the pension accumulation fund
16			the required percentage of the rehired retirant's
17			compensation to amortize the system's unfunded
18			actuarial accrued liability[-];
19	(6)	<u>As a</u>	law enforcement officer identified by the
20		depa	rtment of law enforcement as a labor shortage or
21		diff	icult-to-fill position; provided that:

1		<u>(A)</u>	The retirant was not employed by the State or a
2			county during the six calendar months before the
3			first day of reemployment;
4		<u>(B)</u>	No agreement was entered into between the State
5			or a county and the retirant before the
6			retirement of the retirant, for the return to
7			work by the retirant after retirement;
8		<u>(C)</u>	The department of law enforcement shall
9			contribute to the pension accumulation fund the
10			required percentage of the rehired retirant's
11			compensation to amortize the system's unfunded
12			actuarial accrued liability; and
13		(D)	The retirant shall be stationed at a public
14			school as a resource officer; or
15	<u>(7)</u>	As a	n investigator identified by the department of the
16		<u>atto</u>	rney general as a labor shortage or difficult-to-
17		fill	position; provided that:
18		(A)	The retirant was not employed by the State or a
19			county during the six calendar months before the
20			first day of reemployment;

1	(B)	No agreement was entered into between the
2		retirant and the State or a county, before the
3		retirement of the retirant, for the return to
4		work by the retirant after retirement; and
5	<u>(C)</u>	The department of the attorney general shall
6		contribute to the pension accumulation fund the
7		required percentage of the rehired retirant's
8		compensation to amortize the system's unfunded
9		actuarial accrued liability."
10	2. By am	ending subsection (f) to read:
11	"(f) No	later than twenty days prior to the convening of
12	each regular l	egislative session, the director of human
13	resources of t	he appropriate state jurisdiction or the human
14	resources mana	gement chief executive of each county shall submit
15	an annual repo	rt to the legislature detailing the employment of
16	retirants unde	r [paragraphs (4) and (5) of subsection (d),]
17	subsection (d)	(4), (5) , (6) , and (7) , including the number and
18	positions of r	etirants."
19	SECTION 3	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
21	SECTION 4	. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Description:

Allows a retirant to be employed without reenrollment in the Employees' Retirement System and without loss or interruption of benefits under the System or the Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund if the retirant is employed as a law enforcement officer stationed at a public school as a resource officer or investigator identified by the Department of Law Enforcement or the Department of the Attorney General, respectively, as a labor shortage or difficult-to-fill position, subject to certain conditions. Requires the Director of Human resources of the appropriate state jurisdiction or the human resources management chief executive of each county to include in their annual reports to the Legislature details on the employment of retirants as school resource officers or investigators. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
