# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that existing law
specifies the circumstances under which an employees' retirement
system retirant may be reemployed without the suspension of the
retirant's benefits and provides remedies for the employees'
retirement system if a retirant is reemployed in violation of
chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and any administrative rule
adopted thereunder.

8 The legislature further finds that there is a labor 9 shortage that makes it difficult to fill investigator positions 10 in the department of the attorney general, law enforcement 11 officer positions that may be stationed at public schools as 12 school resource officers, as well as excluded management 13 positions in the department of agriculture and other state 14 departments.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establishadditional categories of retirants who may be employed without

#### Report Title:

DLE; ATG; Retirees; ERS; EUTF; Benefits; School Resource Officers; Investigators; Counties; Report

#### Description:

Allows a retirant to be employed without reenrollment in the Employees' Retirement System and without loss or interruption of benefits under the System or the Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund if the retirant is employed in a position needed for succession planning, as a law enforcement officer stationed at a public school as a resource officer, as an investigator, or in a management position excluded from collective bargaining, subject to certain conditions. Requires the director of human resources of the appropriate state jurisdiction or the human resources management chief executive of each county to include in their annual reports to the Legislature details on the employment of retirants as school resource officers or investigators.
