A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that vulnerable
- 2 populations in Hawaii, including individuals experiencing
- 3 homelessness, children, and those in need of mental health or
- 4 social services, face significant challenges that hinder their
- 5 well-being and stability. These issues have become exacerbated
- 6 by a rising demand for services, stagnant government contract
- 7 funding, and increasing operational costs, including significant
- 8 insurance hikes following the 2023 Maui wildfires.
- 9 The legislature further finds that community-based
- 10 organizations are vital partners in delivering critical services
- 11 on behalf of the department of human services and that, by
- 12 strengthening collaborations with service providers, the
- 13 department can enhance program delivery and improve access to
- 14 essential services such as administering benefits, providing
- 15 work-training and employment support, strengthening child care
- 16 programs, addressing homelessness, and reducing the harmful
- 17 effects of a punitive incarceration system, among other

- 1 services. Additionally, families in Hawaii depend on this
- 2 network of community-based organizations as a human services
- 3 safety net.
- 4 The legislature also finds that the department of human
- 5 services contracts with community-based organizations to provide
- 6 critical services, but contract rates have not increased in many
- 7 years and fail to cover full program costs. Community-based
- 8 organizations have attempted to fill the gap between funding
- 9 levels and demand for services through their own fundraising
- 10 efforts but are finding the growing gap insurmountable. If the
- 11 gap between funding levels and demand for services is not
- 12 mitigated by increased state funding, community-based
- 13 organizations will have to decline contracts or reduce the
- 14 amount of services provided, despite the community need; some
- 15 will be unable to sustain operations. According to a 2022
- 16 survey of Hawaii community-based nonprofit organizations,
- 17 ninety-one per cent had government contract budgets that fell
- 18 below the full operating costs required to provide the
- 19 contracted services. Of those, seventy-nine per cent always or
- 20 often had to cut administrative costs.
