A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHER RETENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds the State needs to
2	provide monetary incentives to recruit teachers and promote
3	longevity in the field. Further, general education teachers who
4	teach special education inclusion classes alongside special
5	education teachers should be entitled to the same pay
6	differential. The purpose of this Act is to:
7	(1) Establish the Onipa'a Teacher Bonus Program which
8	provides monetary awards to licensed and certified
9	teachers who practice in the State for an extended
10	period of time; and
11	(2) Ensure that general education teachers teaching
12	special education inclusion classes are equitably
13	compensated.
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
16	and to read as follows:



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1	" <u>§</u> 30	2A- Onipa'a Teacher Bonus Program. (a) The department		
2	shall est	ablish a teacher bonus program which provides bonuses		
3	to teache	ers in the department of education who exemplify high		
4	teacher s	tandards and accomplished teaching through means deemed		
5	appropria	te by the board of education. Each school must submit		
6	a report concerning the use of money distributed by the			
7	department. The department must provide a summary of the			
8	reports to the board and the legislature.			
9	(b)	The program shall be outlined by the following		
10	provision	<u>s:</u>		
11	(1)	Beginning after the effective date of this Act, a		
12		teacher that is considered a full-time employee of the		
13		department and teaches for two school years in such		
14		school shall be eligible to apply for the bonuses		
15		pursuant in this section;		
16	(2)	The department shall award bonuses to any eligible		
17		teacher who applies and meets the requirements of this		
18		section;		
19	(3)	The department shall develop and administer the Onipa'a		
20		Teacher Bonus Program. The program shall consist of a		
21		series of bonuses available to eligible teachers who		



1		meet the qualifications of this section. Such bonuses
2		include the "Ola Professional Performance" bonus and
3		the "Ola Loa Longevity" bonuses;
4	(4)	The department shall maintain the records related to
5		the program and any teacher receiving a bonus pursuant
6		to the program, including tracking teacher
7		demographics, the number of years a teacher has
8		taught, the annual income a teacher receives from
9		teaching, the school and location a teacher teaches
10		at, and any other information the department may
11		require. The department shall share such information
12		except as aggregate data that does not include
13		personally identifiable information for any particular
14		teacher;
15	(5)	The board may adopt and promulgate rules and
16		regulations to carry out this section;
17	(6)	The "Ola Professional Performance" bonus awards shall
18		be awarded to an eligible teacher who has been
19		practicing within the State for at least two school
20		years; provided that, this award shall total no more
21		than two thousand five hundred dollars; and



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1	<u>(7)</u> The	e "Ola Loa Longevity" bonus awards shall be awarded		
2	to	an eligible teacher who has been practicing within		
3	the	e State for at least five school years. The teacher		
4	sha	all be eligible for receiving this bonus award on a		
5	re	curring basis every five years; provided that, each		
6	is	sued award shall total no more than five thousand		
7	do	llars.		
8	(c) As	used in this section:		
9	"Bonus"	means a non-base, building payment that is in		
10	addition to a teacher's regular salary and that is awarded based			
11	<u>on outstandi</u>	ng service and awarded to a full-time teacher who		
12	satisfies the	e licensing and certification as outlined in chapter		
13	302A-805, Hav	waii Revised Statutes.		
14	"Departr	ment" means the department of education.		
15	"Board"	means the board of education."		
16	SECTION	3. Section 302A-630, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended to re	ead as follows:		
18	"§302A-6	630 [+]Teachers; additional benefits or credits.[+]		
19	(a) Teachers	s with special assignments, where their		
20	responsibilit	ties are greater, may be provided additional		
21	benefits by t	the department.		



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(b) Teachers in Hawaiian language medium education whose
 responsibilities are greater or unique and require additional
 language skills may be provided additional benefits by the
 department.

5 (c) In determining additional benefits for vocational
6 agriculture and technical school teachers, the department may
7 allow credit for practical experience.

8 (d) In determining additional benefits for teachers,
9 staff, and administrators in Hawaiian language medium education,
10 the department may allow credit for practical experience.

11 (e) In determining additional benefits for special

12 education teachers, the department shall include general

13 education teachers who teach special education inclusion classes

14 as equally qualified for the additional benefits."

15 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the 18 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 19 2026-2027 for the funding of the Onipa'a Teacher Bonus Program. 20 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 21 of education for the purposes of this Act.



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SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
