A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that cardiopulmonary
2	resuscitation (CPR) training and access to automated external
3	defibrillators (AEDs) are essential to school safety at sporting
4	events. Thirty-one states across the nation require coaches
5	receive CPR training. Unfortunately, Hawaii is not one of them.
6	Seventy per cent of students who experience cardiac arrest in a
7	school with an AED survive. This is a significant increase from
8	the average rate of survival. Every minute that passes without
9	AED intervention decreases the survival rate by ten per cent.
10	Further, schools should be equipped with other lifesaving
11	measures such as Narcan, EpiPens, and inhalers.
12	The purpose of this Act is to mandate that:
13	(1) Each sporting event of 25 or more participants have a
14	CPR trained coach or athletic trainer in attendance;
15	and
16	(2) All schools be equipped with AED devices, Narcan,

EpiPens, and inhalers.

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1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§30</u>	2A- Life-saving measures; CPR; requirements;
5	training.	(a) By the end of the 2025-2026 school year:
6	(1)	All public schools shall have a minimum of two
7		automated external defibrillators:
8		(A) One to be situated in a permanent location on
9		campus; and
10		(B) One to be utilized for organized sporting events
11		of 25 or more participants;
12	(2)	All public schools shall be equipped with Narcan,
13		EpiPens, and inhalers;
14	(3)	All public schools that have an athletic trainer shall
15		ensure that at every sporting event of 25 or more
16		participants, an additional automated external
17		defibrillator is available, and the athletic trainer
18		is trained and certified at all times in the use of
19		automated external defibrillators; and
20	(4)	All public schools that do not have an athletic
21		trainer shall ensure that at every sporting event of

1		25 or more participants, at all times at least two
2		faculty members of the school in attendance are
3		trained and certified in the use of automated external
4		defibrillators.
5	(b)	The department shall ensure that the automated
6	external	defibrillators are:
7	(1)	Maintained and regularly tested according to the
8		operation and maintenance guidelines set forth by the
9		manufacturer; and
10	(2)	Checked for readiness after each use and at least once
11		every thirty days if the automated external
12		defibrillator has not been used in the preceding
13		thirty days; provided that records of the checks shall
14		be maintained by the department and the individual
15		school.
16	(c)	Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, the
17	departmen	t shall offer a mandatory CPR training for athletic
18	trainers	and coaches at the beginning of each academic year.
19	(d)	For purposes of this section, "sporting event"
20	includes	competitions, scrimmages, and practices."

1	SECT	ION 3. Chapter 302D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 30	2D- Life-saving measures; CPR; requirements;
5	training.	(a) By the end of the 2025-2026 school year:
6	(1)	All charter schools shall have a minimum of two
7		automated external defibrillators:
8		(A) One to be situated in a permanent location on
9		campus; and
10		(B) One to be utilized for organized sporting events
11		of 25 or more participants;
12	(2)	All charter schools shall be equipped with Narcan,
13		EpiPens, and inhalers;
14	(3)	All charter schools that have an athletic trainer
15		shall ensure that at every sporting event of 25 or
16		more participants, an additional automated external
17		defibrillator is available and the athletic trainer is
18		trained and certified at all times in the use of
19		automated external defibrillators; and
20	(4)	All charter schools that do not have an athletic
21		trainer shall ensure that at every sporting event of

1		25 or more participants, at all times at least two
2		faculty members of the charter school in attendance
3		are trained and certified in the use of automated
4		external defibrillators.
5	(b)	Each charter school shall ensure that the automated
6	external	defibrillators are:
7	(1)	Maintained and regularly tested according to the
8		operation and maintenance guidelines set forth by the
9		manufacturer; and
10	(2)	Checked for readiness after each use and at least once
11		every thirty days if the automated external
12		defibrillator has not been used in the preceding
13		thirty days; provided that records of the checks shall
14		be maintained by the charter school.
15	(c)	Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, the school
16	shall off	er a mandatory CPR training for athletic trainers and
17	coaches a	t the beginning of each academic year.
18	(d)	For purposes of this section, "sporting event"
19	includes	competitions, scrimmages, and practices."

1	SECT	ION 4. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§30</u>	4A- Life-saving measures; requirements; training.
5	(a) By t	he end of the 2025-2026 school year:
6	(1)	All divisions and campuses of the University of Hawaii
7		system shall have an automated external defibrillator
8		situated in a permanent location on campus; and
9	(2)	The athletic department of the University of Hawaii,
10		with regard to each institution under the University
11		of Hawaii system, shall ensure that:
12		(A) There is an automated external defibrillator
13		available to the athletic trainer present at
14		every sporting event of 25 or more participants;
15		and
16		(B) At all times, every athletic trainer is trained
17		and certified in the use of automated external
18		defibrillators; and
19	<u>(3)</u>	All divisions and campuses of the University of Hawaii
20		system shall be equipped with Narcan, EpiPens, and
21		inhalers.

1	(b)	The University of Hawaii and each institution under
2	the Unive	ersity of Hawaii system shall ensure that the automated
3	external	defibrillator is:
4	(1)	Maintained and regularly tested according to the
5		operation and maintenance guidelines set forth by the
6		manufacturer; and
7	(2)	Checked for readiness after each use and at least once
8		every thirty days if the automated external
9		defibrillator has not been used in the preceding
10		thirty days; provided that records of the checks shall
11		be maintained by the University of Hawaii.
12	(C)	Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, the
13	Universit	y of Hawaii shall offer a mandatory CPR training for
14	athletic	trainers and coaches at the beginning of each academic
15	year.	
16	<u>(d)</u>	For purposes of this section, "sporting event"
17	includes	competitions, scrimmages, and practices."
18	SECT	TION 5. Section 663-1.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended b	y amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
20	"(e)	Any person who in good faith, without remuneration or
21	expectati	on of remuneration, attempts to resuscitate a person in

1 immediate danger of loss of life when administering any 2 automated external defibrillator, regardless of where the 3 automated external defibrillator that is used is located, shall 4 not be liable for any civil damages resulting from any act or 5 omission except as may result from the person's gross negligence 6 or wanton acts or omissions[-]; provided that an athletic trainer or faculty member who administers an automated external 7 8 defibrillator, Narcan, EpiPen, or inhaler pursuant to section 9 302A- , 302-D , or 304A- , shall be considered to be doing so 10 without remuneration or expectation of remuneration. 11 Any person, including an employer, who provides for an 12 automated external defibrillator or an automated external 13 defibrillator training program shall not be vicariously liable 14 for any civil damages resulting from any act or omission of the 15 persons or employees who, in good faith and without remuneration 16 or the expectation of remuneration, attempt to resuscitate a 17 person in immediate danger of loss of life by administering an 18 automated external defibrillator, except as may result from a 19 person's or employer's gross negligence or wanton acts or 20 omissions."

- 1 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 5 2026-2027 for the purchase of automated external defibrillators, 6 Narcan, EpiPens, inhalers, and mandatory CPR training. 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 8 education for the purposes of this Act. 9 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the 12 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 13 2026-2027 for the purchase of automated external defibrillators, 14 Narcan, EpiPens, inhalers, and mandatory CPR training. 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the charter 16 school administrative office for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
