### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL BUS SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is an ongoing
- 2 historical bus driver shortage resulting in the elimination of
- 3 nearly eighty bus routes across the State. Amid driver
- 4 shortage, the department of education suspended a total of one
- 5 hundred and eight routes in Central Oahu and East Hawaii Island.
- 6 The suspension affected approximately 3,720 students. In
- 7 response, the governor expedited the approval of an emergency
- 8 proclamation to temporarily relax rules around the types of
- 9 vehicles that can be used to safely transport students to and
- 10 from school, and regulations around the required driver
- 11 certifications. The proclamation was signed on August 2, 2024,
- 12 and will expire on March 25, 2025. It is essential for the
- 13 governor's emergency proclamation to be codified to allow for
- 14 greater flexibility of school buses services and access for all
- 15 students.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to:

1	(1)	Authorize the department of education to create a
2		staggered school hours program to obtain available
3		school bus services;
4	(2)	Authorize the use of motorcoaches, small buses, and
5		vans for school bus services, provided certain
6		conditions are met;
7	(3)	Appropriate funds to the department of education for
8		the purchase of motorcoaches, small buses, and vans
9		for school bus drivers; and
10	(4)	Appropriate funds to the department of education to
11		incentivize obtaining a commercial driver's license,
12		to increase the number of persons eligible to become
13		school bus drivers.
14	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
16	and to rea	ad as follows:
17	" <u>§30</u> 2	2A- School bus services; staggered school hours
18	program.	The department may institute a staggered school hours
19	program i	n public schools to obtain available school bus
20	services.	n

1	SECT	ION 3. Section 286-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b)	A person operating the following category or
4	combinati	on of categories of motor vehicles shall be examined as
5	provided	in section 286-108 and duly licensed by the examiner of
6	drivers:	
7	(1)	Mopeds;
8	(2)	Motorcycles, except for autocycles as described in
9		paragraph (2) of the definition of "motorcycle" in
10		section 286-2, and motor scooters;
11	(3)	Passenger cars of any gross vehicle weight rating,
12		buses designed to transport fifteen or fewer
13		occupants, trucks and vans having a gross vehicle
14		weight rating of eighteen thousand pounds or less, and
15		autocycles as described in paragraph (2) of the
16		definition of "motorcycle" in section 286-2; and
17	(4)	All of the motor vehicles in category (3) and any
18		vehicle that is not a commercial motor vehicle.
19	A sc	hool bus, small bus, motorcoach, or van operator shall
20	be proper	ly licensed to operate the category of vehicles that
21	the operator operates as a school bus, small bus, motorcoach, or	

- 1 van and shall comply with the standards of the department of
- 2 transportation as provided by rules adopted pursuant to section
- **3** 286-181."
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 286-181, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended as follows:
- 6 1. By amending subsections (b) through (e) to read:
- 7 "(b) The department of transportation shall grant
- 8 exemptions for the use of vehicles other than school vehicles,
- 9 including motorcoaches, small buses, and vans, when the
- 10 department finds that compliance with this section is:
- 11 (1) Impractical due to the unavailability of school
- vehicles; or
- 13 (2) Impractical due to economic factors.
- 14 No exemption shall be granted for the qualifications of
- 15 individuals driving a bus as defined in section 286-2 and such
- 16 individuals shall meet school vehicle driver qualifications.
- 17 (c) The exemptions in subsection (b) shall be granted:
- 18 (1) To the department of education to administer to public
- schools based on criteria developed by the departments
- of transportation and education; provided that the
- 21 department of education shall submit a report to the

1		department of transportation at the end of each school
2		year on the extent to which these exemptions were
3		utilized;
4	(2)	To a board of independent schools, which is registered
5		with the department of commerce and consumer affairs,
6		to administer to private schools utilizing criteria
7		developed by the departments of transportation and
8		education; provided that the board shall submit a
9		report to the department of transportation at the end
10		of each school year on the extent to which these
11		exemptions were utilized;
12	(3)	[Only for] For the transport of pupils to and from
13		school functions or school-related activities [but
14		<pre>not], for transportation to and from a school[;], and</pre>
15		for transportation to and from designated drop off
16		locations and pick up locations established by the
17		department of education, in consultation with the
18		department of transportation;
19	(4)	Only when each pupil being transported has obtained a
20		written statement from the pupil's parent or legal

guardian waiving the State's liability; and



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1	(5) In accordance with the procedures and criteria
2	established by rules of the department of
3	transportation.
4	(d) [The] Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
5	department of transportation may grant exemptions for the use of
6	vehicles other than school vehicles [for the transportation of
7	students requiring special education and services], including
8	the use of motorcoaches, small buses, and vans, for school bus
9	services when the department of transportation finds that
10	compliance with this section is impossible or impractical;
11	provided that an adult staff chaperone provided by the
12	department of education escorts students being transported
13	between designated off-campus and designated on-campus
14	<u>locations;</u> provided <u>further</u> that no exemption shall be granted
15	for the qualifications of individuals driving a bus as defined
16	in section 286-2 and such individuals shall meet school vehicle
17	driver qualifications[-]; provided further that the use of
18	vehicles other than school vehicles shall meet any applicable
19	state and federal regulations.

1 (e) The department of transportation shall adopt safety 2 rules and standards relating to school vehicles, equipment, and 3 drivers, including but not limited to: (1) School vehicle and school vehicle equipment design, 4 5 construction, and identification; 6 (2) School vehicle driver qualification and training as 7 required by law; 8 (3) School vehicle operation; 9 (4)School vehicle maintenance and maintenance records: 10 (5) Special school vehicle safety inspections; 11 (6) Criteria for passenger loading and unloading safety 12 areas; and 13 (7) Procedures and criteria for the granting of exemptions 14 permitted under subsections (b), (c), and (d); 15 provided that the rules and standards shall permit the use of 16 small buses [or], vans [weighing less than ten thousand pounds], 17 or motorcoaches for the transportation of pupils of a public or 18 private day care center, child care facility, headstart program, 19 [and] preschool, kindergarten, elementary, or secondary school, 20 including any special school for children in the State with an 21 accompanying adult staff chaperone escort provided by the

5	2.	By amending subsection (i) to read:	
6	"(i)	As used in subsection (b), a school vehicle is	
7	unavailable when it:		
8	(1)	Is being used during a specific time for contracted	
9		school-related transportation to and from school or	
10		related destinations;	
11	(2)	Fails that day's inspection and has not been repaired;	
12	(3)	Is already in transportation service; or	
13	(4)	Is committed for transportation service[; or	
14	<del>(5)</del>	Does not meet the requests of a school for a	
15		motorcoach with undercarriage storage compartments and	
16		public address system; provided that the use of the	
17		motorcoach shall be used solely for the transportation	
18		of middle, intermediate, or high school student groups	
19		to and from school-related events or activities. As	
20		used in this paragraph, "motorcoach" means a vehicle	
21		that carries more than twenty-five passengers, has a	

1	gross vehicle weight rating of at least 26,000 pounds
2	and is no more than fifteen years old]."
3	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
6	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
7	year 2026-2027 for the department of education to purchase
8	motorcoaches, small buses, and vans for school bus services.
9	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
10	of education for the purposes of this Act.
11	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
13	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
14	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
15	year 2026-2027 for the department of education to incentivize
16	obtaining a commercial driver's license.
17	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
18	of education for the purposes of this Act.
19	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

#### Report Title:

DOT; DOE; School Bus Services; Staggered School Hours; Appropriation

#### Description:

Authorizes the Department of Education to use alternative vehicles for student transportation under certain conditions. Allows the Department of Education to institute a staggered school hours program in public schools. Appropriates funds for the purchase of alternative vehicles and individuals to obtain CDL licensure. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

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
