#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRIC BICYCLES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds electric bicycles are SECTION 1.
- 2 widely available and becoming a more prevalent means of personal
- transportation. However, the growing adoption of electric 3
- bicycles on public roads, bike paths, and urban environments has 4
- introduced new safety concerns, including risks to riders, 5
- pedestrians, and other road users, which necessitate clear and 6
- 7 comprehensive safety regulations. Existing traffic and bicycle
- 8 laws do not adequately address the unique characteristics and
- risks associated with electric bicycles. The legislature 9
- 10 further finds that electric micro mobility devices are also
- 11 growing in popularity. Despite this, existing law is silent as
- 12 to the regulations of these mobility devices.
- 13 The legislature believes that ensuring the safety of
- electric bicycle riders and electric micro mobility devices and 14
- 15 the public requires the implementation of updated regulations
- 16 governing electric bicycles. Additionally, public awareness of



1 any new regulations for electric bicycles is necessary for compliance with the regulations. 2 3 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to: Update and enhance the State's laws relating to 4 (1)5 electric bicycles; and 6 (2) Define and regulate electric micro mobility devices. 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by adding seven new sections to part XIII to be 9 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 10 "\$291C-A Electric bicycles; labeling. Manufacturers and 11 distributors of electric bicycles shall apply a label that is 12 permanently affixed, in a prominent location, to each electric bicycle. The label shall contain the classification number, top 13 14 assisted speed, and motor wattage of the electric bicycle. 15 §291C-B Electric bicycle regulations; signage; public 16 information. (a) Distributors of electric bicycles shall place 17 a sign at or near the point of sale with wording substantially 18 similar to the following in all capital letters and printed in 19 not less than fourteen-point font: 20 "THE SALE AND OPERATION OF ELECTRIC BICYCLES ARE SUBJECT TO

CHAPTER 291C, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES, INCLUDING SECTION

4	(b) Distributors of electric bicycles shall provide to the		
5	purchaser of an electric bicycle a booklet or pamphlet detailing		
6	the associated state laws regulating the use of electric

8	§291C-C Electric bicycles; tampering restriction. No		
9	person shall tamper with or modify an electric bicycle so as to		
10	change the motor-powered speed capability or engagement of an		
11	electric bicycle or the label indicating the classification		
12	number required by section 291C-A.		
13	§291C-D Electric bicycles; Consumer Product Safety		
14	Commission compliance. Electric bicycles shall comply with the		
15	equipment and manufacturing requirements for bicycles adopted by		
16	the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission pursuant to		
17	title 16 Code of Federal Regulations part 1512.		
18	<u>\$291C-E</u> <u>Electric bicycles; motor disengagement.</u> An		
19	electric bicycle shall operate in a manner so that the electric		
20	motor is disengaged or ceases to function when the rider stops		
21	pedaling or when the brakes are applied.		

l	§291C-F Infrastructure use by electric bicycles. (a) An
2	electric bicycle may be ridden in places where bicycles are
3	allowed, including but not limited to streets, highways, alleys,
4	roadways, sidewalks, or public paths set aside for the exclusive
5	use of bicycles.
6	(b) Following notice and a public hearing, a county may
7	prohibit the operation of a class 1 electric bicycle, class 2
8	electric bicycle, or class 3 electric bicycle on places
9	described in subsection (a) if the county finds that a
10	restriction is needed for safety reasons or compliance with
11	other laws or legal obligations.
12	§291C-G Class 3 electric bicycles; additional regulations.
13	(a) A person under fifteen years of age may ride as a passenger
14	on a class 3 electric bicycle that is designed to accommodate
15	passengers.
16	(b) All operators and passengers of class 3 electric
17	bicycles shall wear a properly fitted and fastened bicycle
18	helmet that meets the standards provided by either the United
19	States Consumer Product Safety Commission or the American
20	Society for Testing and Materials, or standards subsequently
21	established by those entities.

19	motorized and used for personal transportation, such as one-			
20	wheels and electric skateboards. "Electric micro mobility

- 10 State. No person under [sixteen] eighteen years of age shall
- 11 operate an electric foot scooter or electric micro mobility
- 12 device unless the person wears a safety helmet securely fastened
- 13 with a chin strap. The safety helmet shall meet the
- 14 specifications of and requirements for a bicycle helmet as set
- 15 out in section 291C-150.
- (e) No person shall operate an electric foot scooter or
- 17 electric micro mobility device that is carrying any other
- 18 person, nor shall any person other than the operator ride upon
- 19 an electric foot scooter.
- 20 (f) No person operating an electric foot scooter or
- 21 electric micro mobility device shall carry any package, bundle,



- 1 or article that prevents the use of both hands in the control
- 2 and operation of the electric foot scooter.
- 3 (g) Any electric foot scooter or electric micro mobility
- 4 device used from thirty minutes after sunset until thirty
- 5 minutes before sunrise shall meet the specifications of and
- 6 requirements for lamps and other equipment on bicycles as set
- 7 out in section 291C-147; provided that in lieu of the
- 8 requirement of section 291C-147(b), every electric foot scooter
- 9 or electric micro mobility device shall be equipped with a
- 10 lighted lamp that is visible from the rear.
- 11 (h) No person shall operate an electric foot scooter or
- 12 electric micro mobility device at a speed other than is
- 13 reasonable and prudent and having regard to the actual and
- 14 potential hazards and conditions then existing; provided that no
- 15 person shall operate an electric foot scooter or electric micro
- 16 mobility device at a speed greater than fifteen miles per hour.
- 17 (i) Any person who operates an electric foot scooter or
- 18 electric micro mobility device recklessly in disregard of the
- 19 safety of persons or property shall be assessed penalties as set
- 20 forth in section 291C-161(b).

Section 291C-150, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 4 5 [No] Except as required in section 291C-G, no person under [sixteen] eighteen years of age shall operate a bicycle 6 7 upon a street, bikeway, or any other public property unless that person is wearing a properly fitted and fastened bicycle helmet 8 9 that has been tested by a nationally recognized agency such as 10 the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the National Safety Council, or the Children's Safety Network, and is 11 designed to fit the user and protect against head trauma. 12 requirement also applies to a person who rides upon a bicycle 13 14 while in a restraining seat that is attached to the bicycle or 15 who rides in a trailer towed by the bicycle. (b) A person who provides bicycles for hire shall not rent 16 17 a bicycle to any person unless every person who is under age 18 [sixteen] eighteen is wearing a bicycle helmet, as required in 19 subsection (a), while operating the rented bicycle, occupying a 20 restraining seat that is attached to the rented bicycle, or 21 riding in a trailer towed by the rented bicycle."

- 1 SECTION 12. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 3 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 4 the new sections in this Act.
- 5 SECTION 13. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

#### Report Title:

Electric Bicycles; Regulations; Registration; Electric Micro Mobility Devices; Minimum Age to Operate

#### Description:

Establishes additional regulations for the registration and use of electric bicycles. Amends the definition of electric bicycles subject to various state laws and classifies electric bicycles by top assisted speed. Defines "electric micro mobility device" and requires the same regulations as electric foot scooters to apply to electric micro mobility devices. Prohibits anyone under fifteen from operating a class 3 electric bicycle. Increasing the age for those required to wear a helmet when operating a bicycle. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
