A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A STATE HOTEL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a hotel owned,
- 2 operated, and managed by the State has the potential to offer
- 3 numerous benefits for the people and economy of Hawaii. For
- 4 instance, a state hotel could create workforce development
- 5 opportunities for local residents and better allow the State to
- 6 promote regenerative tourism for visitors.
- 7 The legislature further finds that a state hotel could also
- 8 support local students' career development through hospitality,
- 9 regenerative tourism practices, sustainable development, and
- 10 business management programs. By providing local students
- 11 valuable opportunities to gain professional experience in one of
- 12 Hawaii's leading industries, there may be less of a need to
- 13 search outside the State to recruit upper-level management and
- 14 top leadership in the tourism industry.
- 15 The legislature also finds that a state hotel could
- 16 accommodate visitors and guests to university of Hawaii
- 17 campuses, improve the recruitment of students to the university



- 1 of Hawaii, and help generate additional revenue for the
- 2 university of Hawaii system. Moreover, there is also the
- 3 potential for state hotels to eventually expand to more islands
- 4 in the State.
- 5 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to require the Hawaii
- 6 tourism authority and school of travel industry management at
- 7 the university of Hawaii at Manoa to jointly perform a study
- 8 regarding the design, construction or purchase, and operations
- 9 and management of a state hotel.
- 10 SECTION 2. (a) The Hawaii tourism authority and school of
- 11 travel industry management at the university of Hawaii at Manoa
- 12 shall jointly perform a study regarding the design, construction
- 13 or purchase, and operations and management of a state hotel,
- 14 including:
- 15 (1) Consideration of the staffing and financial resources
- required to own, operate, and manage a state hotel;
- **17** and
- 18 (2) Consideration of whether it is more cost-effective and
- feasible to construct a new hotel or purchase an
- existing hotel.

- 1 (b) The Hawaii tourism authority and school of travel
- 2 industry management at the university of Hawaii at Manoa shall
- 3 submit the study required in subsection (a) to the legislature
- 4 no later than twenty days before the convening of the regular
- 5 session of 2027.
- 6 (c) As used in this Act, "state hotel" means a hotel
- 7 owned, operated, and managed by the State.
- 8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
- 11 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 12 year 2026-2027 for the Hawaii tourism authority to jointly
- 13 perform a study with the school of travel industry management at
- 14 the university of Hawaii at Manoa regarding the design,
- 15 construction or purchase, and operations and management of a
- 16 state hotel.
- 17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 18 tourism authority for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and

- 1 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 2 year 2026-2027 for the school of travel industry management at
- 3 the university of Hawaii at Manoa to jointly perform a study
- 4 with the Hawaii tourism authority regarding the design,
- 5 construction or purchase, and operations and management of a
- 6 state hotel.
- 7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the university
- 8 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000;
- 10 provided that sections 3 and 4 of this Act shall take effect on
- 11 July 1, 2025.
