A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION 4, OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION TO ESTABLISH LEGISLATIVE TERM LIMITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that at least fifteen 2 states have legislative term limits, which range from six to 3 twelve years. Although the backing for enacting legislative term limits does have merit in certain circumstances, to promote 4 5 fairness and equity between separate and co-equal branches of 6 government, any term limits for legislators should be longer 7 than the term limit of the governor of the applicable state. 8 Because the governor is subject to a term limit of two consecutive full terms, or eight years, enacting similar 9 10 legislative term limits for legislators in Hawaii would weaken 11 state legislators and strengthen the governor due to the 12 governor and the administration's broad constitutional, statutory, and rule-making powers. For example, the governor 13 14 already has widespread authority and discretion through the executive branch; the governor has considerable budget powers, 15 16 including restricting funds; and there is no elected state

1 treasurer, attorney general, or secretary of state, as is the 2 case in most states. To maintain a modicum of balance of powers 3 in Hawaii between the legislative and executive branch of 4 government, legislative term limits should be longer than the 5 governor's term limit.

6 The legislature further finds that of the fifteen states 7 that have legislative term limits, Arizona, Colorado, Florida, 8 Maine, Missouri, Montana, Ohio, and South Dakota have sixteen-9 year limits -- a maximum of eight years in their respective 10 house of representatives and eight years in their respective 11 senates.

12 The purpose of this Act is to propose an amendment to 13 article III, section 4, of the Hawaii State Constitution to 14 limit the number of years persons may serve in the legislature 15 to a maximum of sixteen years in the house of representatives or 16 senate, or both.

SECTION 2. Article III, section 4, of the Hawaii StateConstitution is amended to read as follows:

"ELECTION OF MEMBERS; TERM

20 Section 4. Each member of the legislature shall be elected
21 at an election. If more than one candidate has been nominated

1 for election to a seat in the legislature, the member occupying 2 that seat shall be elected at a general election. If a 3 candidate nominated for a seat at a primary election is 4 unopposed for that seat at the general election, the candidate 5 shall be deemed elected at the primary election. The term of 6 office of a member of the house of representatives shall be two 7 years and the term of office of a member of the senate shall be 8 four years. Members of the legislature shall be limited to 9 serving a total of sixteen years, regardless of whether the 10 years were served entirely in the house of representatives or in 11 the senate, or partially in both. The term of a member of the 12 legislature shall begin on the day of the general election at 13 which elected or if elected at a primary election, on the day of 14 the general election immediately following the primary election at which elected. For a member of the house of representatives, 15 16 the term shall end on the day of the general election 17 immediately following the day the member's term commences. For 18 a member of the senate, the term shall end on the day of the 19 second general election immediately following the day the 20 member's term commences."
