A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OCEAN RECREATION MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 land and natural resources division of boating and ocean 3 recreation is responsible for ocean recreation management in

4 state ocean waters. Under the existing ocean recreation

5 management areas system, the division has the authority to

6 designate areas around each island as an ocean recreation

7 management area, which then allows the division to further

8 designate zones and subzones within each area in which specific

9 ocean recreation activities may occur to increase user safety

10 and reduce user conflicts. However, the current ocean

11 recreation management areas system is a patchwork of designated

and non-designated areas around each island, which prevents user

13 safety measures around some portions of each island.

14 The purpose of this Act is to provide better management 15

tools to the division of boating and ocean recreation by:

(1) Creating a uniform designation of ocean recreation

1	(2) Prohibiting commercial activity in ocean recreation
2	management areas, except by a commercial use permit.
3	SECTION 2. Section 200-38, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"§200-38 Ocean recreation management areas. (a) All
6	waters of the State within three thousand feet seaward of the
7	base line of the territorial sea are designated as ocean
8	recreation management areas. Within each ocean recreation
9	management area, the department may designate zones where
10	specific recreational and commercial ocean activities may occur
11	(b) Unless otherwise provided by this chapter or rules
12	adopted by the department, no commercial activity, except for
13	commercial activity originating from a commercial harbor under
14	the jurisdiction of the department of transportation, may be
15	conducted in an ocean recreation management area without a
16	commercial use permit from the department.
17	(c) Any person who holds a valid commercial use permit as
18	of July 1, 2025, may continue to renew the commercial use
19	permit; provided that the department may terminate a commercial
20	use permit for cause or may deny renewal or reissuance if the
21	commercial use permit:

1	(1) Has been terminated or denied renewal for cause; or
2	(2) Is not renewed before its expiration date, including
3	any applicable extensions of the expiration date.
4	$[\frac{a}{a}]$ Motwithstanding any other law to the contrary, no
5	commercial operator shall operate a thrill craft, engage in
6	parasailing, water sledding, or commercial high speed boating,
7	operate a motorized vessel towing a person engaged in
8	parasailing, or operate a motor vessel towing a person engaged
9	in water sledding during all weekends and state and federal
10	holidays on Oahu in Maunalua Bay from Kawaihoa (Portlock) Point
11	to Wailupe Peninsula and commercial zones a, b, and c.
12	[(b)] <u>(e)</u> Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,
13	all commercial ocean recreation activities shall be prohibited
14	on all Sundays on Oahu in Maunalua Bay.
15	$[\frac{(c)}{(c)}]$ Motwithstanding any other law to the contrary,
16	no person shall operate a thrill craft, engage in parasailing,
17	operate a motorized vessel towing a person engaged in
18	parasailing, engage in commercial water sledding or commercial
19	high speed boating, or operate a commercial motor vessel towing
20	a person engaged in water sledding between December 15 and May

- 1 15 of each year in the waters of west and south Maui from Pu`u
- 2 Ola`i to Hawea Point.
- $3 \qquad [\frac{d}{d}]$ (g) The department may adopt rules pursuant to
- 4 chapter 91 to further implement this section."

- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
