A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE ANALYST.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that numerous states 2 incorporate fiscal notes into their legislative process, which 3 increase public transparency by disclosing the potential financial impact a measure would have on the state and local 4 5 government. The Council of State Governments reports that forty-four states include "projected future cost" in their bill 6 7 notes. Some states require fiscal notes in their house rules, 8 while others require them in statute. In contrast, Hawaii does 9 not require fiscal notes to accompany measures during the legislative process. Therefore, representatives and senators 10 11 are forced to vote on measures without knowing the financial 12 impact of their decisions. The purpose of this Act is to require the office of legislative analyst to produce fiscal 13 notes on all fiscal bills. 14

15 SECTION 2. Section 21F-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows:



1	"[{] §21F-6[}] Office of the legislative analyst
2	established. (a) There is established the office of the
3	legislative analyst [to be administered by the committee]. The
4	[committee] legislature, by a majority vote of each house in
5	joint session, shall appoint a legislative analyst who shall
6	serve for a period of four years. The [committee, by a three-
7	fourths vote of its members, $[$ legislature, by a majority vote of
8	each house in joint session, may remove the legislative analyst
9	from office, but only for cause. [The committee shall fix the
10	salary of the legislative analyst.] The salary of the
11	legislative analyst shall be the same as the salary of the
12	director of the legislative reference bureau.
13	(b) The legislative analyst may employ [other clerical and
14	technical employees] a first assistant and other employees as
15	may be necessary to carry out the functions of the office. The
16	legislative analyst, first assistant and other [clerical and
17	technical] employees shall be entitled to participate in any
18	employee benefit program plan or privilege generally available
19	to state employees."

6	(8)	To recommend to the legislature changes in the mix of
7		revenue sources for programs, in the percentage of
8		state expenditures devoted to major programs, and in
9		the role of the legislature in overseeing state
10		government expenditures and revenue projections $[-]$;

12	(9)	To prepare a fiscal note to accompany each fiscal bill
13		before the measure is recommended for passage by each
14		house committee or senate committee of the legislature
15		to which the measure is referred.
16	(b)	In performing the duties under subsection (a), the
17	legislati	ve analyst shall consider, among other things:
18	(1)	The relative dependence on state tax revenues, federal
19		funds, and user fees to support state-funded programs,
20		and whether the existing mix of revenue sources is
21		appropriate, given the purposes of the programs;



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1 (2) The relative percentages of state expenditures that 2 are devoted to major programs such as education, assistance to local government, aid to individuals, 3 4 state agencies and institutions, and debt service; and 5 (3) The role of the legislature in overseeing state government expenditures, including legislative 6 7 appropriation of money from the general fund, legislative appropriation of money from funds other 8 9 than the general fund, state agency receipt of money into revolving and other dedicated funds and 10 11 expenditure of money from these funds, and state agency expenditure of federal funds." 12 SECTION 4. Section 21F-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows: 14 15 "[**+**]**§21F-8[+**] Agencies to cooperate. (a) All departments, agencies, and education institutions of the 16 executive and judicial branches, the office of Hawaiian affairs, 17 and the University of Hawaii shall comply with requests of the 18 19 office of the legislative analyst for information, data, estimates, and statistics on the funding revenue operations, and 20 other affairs of the department, agency, education institution, 21



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1	the office of Hawaiian affairs, or University of Hawaii. The		
2	comptroller, the director of finance, the director of taxation,		
3	the administrative director of the courts, the administrator of		
4	the office of Hawaiian affairs, and the president of the		
5	University of Hawaii shall provide the office of the legislative		
6	analyst with full and free access to information, data,		
7	estimates, and statistics in the possession of their respective		
8	departments on the state budget, revenue, expenditures, and tax		
9	revenue and expenditures.		
10	(b) All departments, agencies, and education institutions		
11	of the executive and judicial branches, the office of Hawaiian		
12	affairs, the University of Hawaii, and county departments and		
12 13	affairs, the University of Hawaii, and county departments and agencies shall promptly provide any information requested by the

3	(1)	Cite the effect of the measure in dollar amounts;	
4	(2)	Cite the statutory provisions affected;	
5	(3)	Estimate the increase or decrease in revenues or	
6		expenditures by the state or counties;	
7	(4)	Include the costs which may be absorbed without	
8		additional funds;	
9	(5)	Include the assumptions used in determining the cost	
10		estimates; and	
11	(6)	Specify any long-range implication.	
12	(d)	A fiscal note may comment on technical or mechanical	
13	defects i	n the bill but shall express no opinions concerning the	
14	merits of	the proposal.	
15	(c)	A copy of the fiscal note shall be delivered to the	
16	<u>chair of</u>	the senate committee on ways and means, the chair of	
17	the house	committee on finance, the chairs of the standing	
18	committees to which the bill has been referred, and to the first		
19	primary i	ntroducer of the bill. No committee shall make a	
20	decision	regarding disposition of a fiscal bill without having	



1 received a completed fiscal note for review and informed 2 decision making. 3 (d) Any fiscal note produced by the office of the 4 legislative analyst for a measure up for consideration shall be 5 a legislative document attached as an addendum to the measure's standing committee report and shall be made available to the 6 7 public." 8 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 9 or so 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 11 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2026-2027 for the operations of the office of the 12 13 legislative analyst, including the payment of salaries of the legislative analyst, first assistant, and other employees as may 14 15 be necessary, and the purchase of necessary equipment. The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of 16 the legislative analyst for the purposes of this Act. 17 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 18 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 20 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025. 21
