
A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION 4, OF THE
CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO ESTABLISH TERM
LIMITS FOR LEGISLATORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, according to a 2023
2 Pew Research study, a vast majority of Americans support term
3 limits for legislators. Concern regarding career politicians
4 and the recent issues of public corruption have many residents
5 worried about the status of legislative term limits. While the
6 residents have often called for legislative reform, one measure
7 that has consistently not been adopted is term limits for
8 legislators.

9 The legislature also finds that at least fifteen states
10 have limits on the number of years a person may serve as a
11 member of the legislature during the person's lifetime, which
12 range from eight to twelve years. Given the legislature's part-
13 time nature and the differences between the house of
14 representatives and the senate, the twelve-year term limit
15 between the two chambers would be most equitable.



1 The purpose of this Act is to propose an amendment to
2 article III, section 4, of the Constitution of the State of
3 Hawaii to limit the terms of members of the legislature to a
4 maximum of twelve years in the house of representatives or
5 senate, or both, for terms beginning on or after the general
6 election of 2026.

7 SECTION 2. Article III, section 4, of the Constitution of
8 the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:

9 **"ELECTION OF MEMBERS; TERM**

10 **Section 4.** Each member of the legislature shall be elected
11 at an election. If more than one candidate has been nominated
12 for election to a seat in the legislature, the member occupying
13 that seat shall be elected at a general election. If a
14 candidate nominated for a seat at a primary election is
15 unopposed for that seat at the general election, the candidate
16 shall be deemed elected at the primary election. The term of
17 office of a member of the house of representatives shall be two
18 years and the term of office of a member of the senate shall be
19 four years [-]; provided that for terms beginning on or after
20 the general election of 2026, no member of the legislature shall
21 serve for more than twelve years total between the house of



1 representatives or senate, or both. The term of a member of the
2 legislature shall begin on the day of the general election at
3 which elected or if elected at a primary election, on the day of
4 the general election immediately following the primary election
5 at which elected. For a member of the house of representatives,
6 the term shall end on the day of the general election
7 immediately following the day the member's term commences. For
8 a member of the senate, the term shall end on the day of the
9 second general election immediately following the day the
10 member's term commences."

11 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
12 be as follows:

13 "Shall a member of the Hawaii state legislature be limited
14 to serving no more than twelve years in the Hawaii state
15 house of representatives or senate, or both, for terms
16 beginning on or after the general election of 2026?"

17 SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is
18 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
19 underscored.



1 SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon
2 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
3 the State of Hawaii.
