A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DANGEROUS DRUGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 712-1243, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"\$712-1243 Promoting a dangerous drug in the third degree.
4	(1) A person commits the offense of promoting a dangerous drug
5	in the third degree if the person knowingly possesses any
6	dangerous drug in any amount.
7	(2) Promoting a dangerous drug in the third degree is a.
8	class C felony[-]; provided that, notwithstanding sections
9	706-660 and 706-669 and any other law to the contrary:
10	(a) If a person is convicted pursuant to this section and
11	methamphetamine or fentanyl is the drug upon which the
12	conviction is predicated, the mandatory minimum term
13	of imprisonment shall be not less than one year and
14	not greater than two years;
15	(b) If a person has one prior conviction for
16	methamphetamine or fentanyl possession pursuant to
17	this section; promoting a dangerous drug in the first

1		degree pursuant to section 712-1241 and
2		methamphetamine or fentanyl was the drug upon which
3		the conviction was predicated; or section 712-1240.8,
4		as that section was in effect prior to July 1, 2016,

7		years;
8	<u>(c)</u>	If a person has two prior convictions for
9		methamphetamine or fentanyl possession pursuant to
10		this section; promoting a dangerous drug in the first
11		degree pursuant to section 712-1241 and
12		methamphetamine or fentanyl was the drug upon which
13		the conviction was predicated; or section 712-1240.8,
14		as that section was in effect prior to July 1, 2016,
15		the mandatory minimum term of imprisonment shall be
16		not less than five years and not greater than eight
17		years; and
18	<u>(d)</u>	If a person has three or more prior convictions for
19		methamphetamine or fentanyl possession pursuant to
20		this section; promoting a dangerous drug in the first
21		degree pursuant to section 712-1241 and

1	methamphetamine or fentanyl was the drug upon which		
2	the conviction was predicated; or section 712-1240.8,		
3	as that section was in effect prior to July 1, 2016,		
4	the mandatory minimum term of imprisonment shall be		
5	ten years."		
6	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that		
7	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
8	begun before its effective date.		
9	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
10	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Sentencing; Mandatory Minimum; Promoting Dangerous Drugs; Methamphetamine; Fentanyl

Description:

Establishes a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment for promoting a dangerous drug in the third degree if the conviction is predicated on the possession of methamphetamine or fentanyl, and progressive mandatory minimum terms of imprisonment if the person has prior convictions predicated on the trafficking of methamphetamine or the possession of methamphetamine or fentanyl.
