A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HATE CRIMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that comprehensive data
- 2 collection and timely reporting are essential to effectively
- 3 address hate crimes and protect communities from bias-motivated
- 4 violence. Amending Hawaii's existing hate crimes law to mandate
- 5 the collection of data of all reported possible hate crimes will
- 6 improve transparency, enhance accountability, and provide
- 7 policymakers and law enforcement with critical tools to address
- 8 these crimes.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to require the reporting of all
- 10 reported possible hate crimes to appropriate authorities and to
- 11 ensure the consistent documentation and analysis of such
- 12 incidents.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 846-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended as follows:
- 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 16 and to read:



1 ""Reported hate crime" means any reported incident, 2 regardless of whether it results in criminal charges, where 3 there is evidence or indication that bias or prejudice may have 4 been a motivating factor." 5 2. By amending the definition of "hate crime data" to 6 read: 7 ""Hate crime data" means information, incident reports, records, and statistics relating to hate crimes[7] and reported 8 9 hate crimes, collected by the attorney general." SECTION 3. Section 846-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 11 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 12 The department of the attorney general shall be 13 responsible for the collection, storage, dissemination, and 14 analysis of all hate crime data and reported hate crimes from all agencies that have primary investigative, action, or program 15 16 responsibility for adult or juvenile offenses, including the 17 county police departments, the county prosecutors, the family 18 courts, and the departments or agencies responsible for 19 administering any correctional facilities. 20 (b) The attorney general shall develop the system and the

4	SECTION 4.	Section 846-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
5	amended to read as follows:

7	enforcement tra	aining. (a) Agencies that have investigative,	
8	detention, cust	codial, adjudicative, or program responsibility	
9	for adult or ju	venile offenses shall cooperate with the attorney	
10	general in esta	ablishing the hate crime reporting system by:	
11	(1) Provi	ding information in the agency files that can be	
12	inclu	ided pursuant to the format approved by the	
13	attor	rney general; provided that the information shall	
14	inclu	ide the following:	
15	<u>(A)</u>	The nature of the offense, including specific	
16		evidence or indicators of bias;	
17	(B)	The demographic information of the victim or	
18		victims and suspect or suspects, if known;	
19	(C)	The location and date of the incident;	
20	(D)	The status of the investigation and any resulting	
21		criminal charges or resolutions; and	

1		(E) Any other information deemed necessary by the
2		attorney general;
3	(2)	Maintaining procedures internally consistent with
4	•	uniform procedures and guidelines provided by the
5		attorney general;
6	(3)	Reporting information to the attorney general that is
7		timely, complete, and accurate after the occurrence of
8		an event over which the agency had direct
9		responsibility; and
10	(4)	Maintaining procedures for the periodic checking of
11		information to minimize the possibility of storing and
12		maintaining inaccurate information.
13	(b)	Law enforcement officers shall receive annual training
14	to identify, investigate, and document hate crimes and possible	
15	hate crimes, including guidance on recognizing bias indicators	
16	and interacting with impacted communities.	
17	(c)	Failure to comply with the reporting requirements of
18	this section may result in administrative penalties as	
19	determined by the attorney general."	
20	SECTION 5. The attorney general shall establish or update	
21	guidelines, protocols, and training materials for the reporting	

- 1 and investigation of hate crimes and possible hate crimes within
- 2 ninety days of the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 3
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Hate Crimes; Reporting; Agencies; Training; Attorney General

Description:

Defines "reported hate crime". Requires reporting of all possible reported hate crimes to appropriate authorities, including consistent documentation and analysis of such incidents. Requires law enforcement officers to receive annual training to identify, investigate, and document hate crimes and possible hate crimes. Requires the Attorney General to establish or update guidelines, protocols, and training materials for the reporting and investigation of hate crimes and possible hate crimes.

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
