
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 421J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3 and to read as follows:

4 "§421J- Application fees for improvements prohibited.
5 Except as otherwise authorized under this chapter, no
6 association shall require a unit owner to pay a filing fee,
7 application fee, or other similar fee, when applying to improve,
8 alter, repair, or renovate a portion of the unit owner's unit or
9 other real property, including an exterior portion of the unit."

10 SECTION 2. Chapter 514B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
12 and to read as follows:

13 "§514B- Application fees for improvements prohibited.
14 Except as otherwise authorized under this chapter, no
15 association shall require a unit owner to pay a filing fee,
16 application fee, or other similar fee, when applying to improve,




1 alter, repair, or renovate a portion of the unit owner's unit or
2 other real property, including an exterior portion of the unit."

3 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
5 begun before its effective date.

6 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
