### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that multiple federally qualified health centers and native Hawaiian health care systems 2 in the State offer traditional healing practices. For example, 3 Waimanalo Health Center integrates traditional healing practices 5 such as lomilomi massage and la'au lapa'au along with western 6 health care services. A patient on blood pressure medication may work concurrently with a traditional healer to make 7 lifestyle changes such as diet, exercise, meditation, and 8 9 growing herbs for their own treatment to support or reduce 10 dependence on the medication. The Kokua Kalihi Valley Health Center provides an eight-week birthing education series focused 11 12 on reclaiming ancestral practices and the cultivation of 13 connection as ways to nurture healthy, happy births. The center 14 also integrates several traditional healing practices such as 15 lomilomi, 'ai pono, la'au lapa'au, and ho'oponopono.

The legislature further finds that currently only two

providers voluntarily cover traditional native Hawaiian healing

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- 1 and cultural practices in collaboration with certain community
- 2 health centers, native Hawaiian health care systems, and
- 3 cultural practitioners.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to require coverage of
- 5 traditional native Hawaiian healing and cultural practices when
- 6 those services are provided at federally qualified health
- 7 centers or native Hawaiian health care systems.
- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by adding a new section to part I of article 10A to be
- 10 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 11 "§431:10A- Traditional native Hawaiian healing and
- 12 cultural practices; coverage; requirements. (a) Every
- 13 individual or group policy of accident and health or sickness
- 14 insurance issued or renewed in this State on or after January 1,
- 15 2026, shall provide coverage for traditional native Hawaiian
- 16 healing and cultural practices provided at a federally qualified
- 17 health center or native Hawaiian health care system for the
- 18 policyholder and any dependent of the policyholder who is
- 19 covered by the policy.
- **20** (b) Coverage under this section shall be subject to
- 21 copayment, deductible, and coinsurance provisions of the policy



1	that are no less favorable than the copayment, deductible, and		
2	coinsurance provisions for substantially all other medical		
3	services covered by the policy.		
4	(c) Coverage for services required by this section shall		
5	include reimbursement to providers who provide traditional		
6	native Hawaiian healing and cultural practices at a federally		
7	qualified health center or native Hawaiian health care system.		
8	(d) If the coverage required by this section is provided		
9	by an out-of-network provider, the insurer shall cover the		
10	coverage without imposing any cost-sharing requirement on the		
11	policyholder if:		
12	(1) There is no in-network provider to furnish the		
13	coverage that meets the requirements for network		
14	adequacy under section 431:26-103; or		
15	(2) An in-network provider is unable or unwilling to		
16	provide the coverage in a timely manner.		
17	(e) Every insurer shall provide notice to its		
18	policyholders regarding the coverage required by this section.		
19	The notice shall be in writing and prominently positioned in any		
20	literature or correspondence sent to policyholders and shall be		
21	transmitted to policyholders beginning with calendar year 2026		

- 1 when annual information is made available to policyholders or in
- 2 any other mailing to policyholders, but in no case later than
- 3 December 31, 2026.
- 4 (f) This section shall not require a policy of accident
- 5 and health or sickness insurance to cover traditional native
- 6 Hawaiian healing and cultural practices provided outside of a
- 7 federally qualified health center or native Hawaiian health care
- 8 system.
- 9 (g) This section shall not apply to limited benefit health
- 10 insurance as provided in section 431:10A-607.
- (h) For purposes of this section:
- "Federally qualified health center" has the same meaning as
- 13 defined in section 1905(1) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
- 14 1396 et seq.).
- 15 "Native Hawaiian health care system" means the Native
- 16 Hawaiian Health Care Systems Program administered by the United
- 17 States Health Resources and Services Administration and funded
- 18 under the federal Native Hawaiian Health Care Act of 1988 (42
- 19 U.S.C. 11701 et. seq.). "Native Hawaiian health care system"
- 20 includes native Hawaiian health centers and Papa Ola Lokahi.

1	"Traditional native Hawaiian healing and cultural

4	SECTION 3. Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
5	amended by adding a new section article 1 to be appropriately			
6	designated and to read as follows:			
7	"§432:1- Traditional native Hawaiian healing and			
8	cultural practices; coverage; requirements. (a) Every			
9	individual or group hospital or medical service plan contract			
10	issued or renewed in this State on or after January 1, 2026,			
11	shall provide coverage for traditional native Hawaiian healing			
12	and cultural practices provided at a federally qualified health			
13	center or native Hawaiian health care system for the subscriber			
14	or member and any dependent of the subscriber or member who is			
15	covered by the policy.			
16	(b) Coverage under this section shall be subject to			
17	copayment, deductible, and coinsurance provisions of the policy			
18	that are no less favorable than the copayment, deductible, and			
19	coinsurance provisions for substantially all other medical			
20	services covered by the plan contract.			

1	<u>(c)</u>	Coverage for services required by this section shall
2	<u>include r</u>	eimbursement to providers who provide traditional
3	native Ha	waiian healing and cultural practices at a federally
4	qualified	health center or native Hawaiian health care system.
5	<u>(d)</u>	If the coverage required by this section is provided
6	by an out	-of-network provider, the mutual benefit society shall
7	cover the	coverage without imposing any cost-sharing requirement
8	on the su	bscriber or member if:
9	<u>(1)</u>	There is no in-network provider to furnish the
10		coverage that meets the requirements for network
11		adequacy under section 431:26-103; or
12	(2)	An in-network provider is unable or unwilling to
13		provide the coverage in a timely manner.
14	(e)	Every mutual benefit society shall provide notice to
15	its subsc	ribers and members regarding the coverage required by
16	this sect	ion. The notice shall be in writing and prominently
17	positione	d in any literature or correspondence sent to
18	subscribe	rs and members and shall be transmitted to subscribers
19	and membe	rs beginning with calendar year 2026 when annual
20	informati	on is made available to subscribers and members or in

- 2 later than December 31, 2026.
- 3 (f) This section shall not require an individual or group
- 4 hospital or medical service plan contract to cover traditional
- 5 native Hawaiian healing and cultural practices provided outside
- 6 of a federally qualified health center or native Hawaiian health
- 7 care system.
- **8** (g) For purposes of this section:
- 9 "Federally qualified health center" has the same meaning as
- 10 defined in section 1905(1) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
- 11 1396 et seq.).
- "Native Hawaiian health care system" means the Native
- 13 Hawaiian Health Care Systems Program administered by the United
- 14 States Health Resources and Services Administration and funded
- 15 under the federal Native Hawaiian Health Care Act of 1988 (42
- 16 U.S.C. 11701 et. seq.). "Native Hawaiian health care system"

- 20 massage, ai pono, and laau lapaaau."
- 21 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.



- 1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2026,
- 2 and shall apply to all plans, policies, contracts, and
- 3 agreements of health insurance issued or renewed by a health
- 4 insurer or mutual benefit society on or after January 1, 2026.
