## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NUISANCE ABATEMENT.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that law enforcement has
2	often used nuisance abatement laws to hold owners and landlords
3	accountable for allowing known criminal activities to occur on
4	their real property. However, the nuisance abatement law
5	currently does not give citizens who bring suit against a place
6	used for illegal gambling the same rights and protections of
7	victims of crime, and it does not provide the same rights and
8	protections provided to citizens who bring suit against a place
9	used for fireworks related offenses or drug offenses. Further,
10	the financial penalties for property owners are minimal and
11	discretionary, providing little incentive for property owners to
12	make sincere efforts to prevent illegal gambling activity on
13	their property.
14	The purpose of this Act is to:
15	(1) Impose a mandatory fine of \$5,000 per violation for
16	nuisance abatement laws related to gambling offenses;

1	(2) Authorize citizens who bring civil nuisance abatement
2	suits against places used for illegal gambling the
3	same rights and protections as those afforded to
4	victims and witnesses in criminal proceedings.
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 712, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately
7	designated and to read as follows:
8	"§712- Fines; gambling. In addition to any other
9	penalty that may be imposed for a violation of part III of this
10	chapter, the court shall impose a mandatory fine of \$5,000 per
11	violation upon any property owner found to have violated
12	nuisance abatement laws under part V of this chapter related to
13	gambling offenses."
14	SECTION 3. Section 712-1270.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"\$712-1270.3 Citizen's rights. Any citizen who brings a
17	nuisance abatement suit against a place used for the purpose of
18	committing:
19	(1) Fireworks related offenses contained in section 132D-
20	14(a)(1) or (3); [ <del>or</del> ]

1	(2) Drug offenses under part IV of this chapter or who
2	files a complaint with the local police or drug
3	nuisance abatement unit of the department of the
4	attorney general[
5	(3) Gambling offenses under part III of this chapter,
6	shall be entitled to the same rights and protections of victims
7	and witnesses in criminal proceedings in accordance with chapter
8	801D."
9	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
10	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
11	begun before its effective date.
12	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
