A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that community health
- 2 workers connect rural, underserved communities with programs and
- 3 services that impact social determinants of health and address
- 4 factors such as access to health care, prevention, outreach, and
- 5 training. Community health workers often serve in rural,
- 6 underserved communities and spend a significant portion of their
- 7 time doing telehealth and behavioral health, outreach such as
- 8 assisting individuals to apply for medical insurance, providing
- 9 health education resources, and locating work opportunities.
- 10 Community health workers may also serve as translators,
- 11 assisting their communities to navigate health care and social
- 12 service systems.
- The legislature further finds that there is a great need
- 14 for community health workers, especially in rural and
- 15 underserved communities that do not have reliable access to
- 16 health education resources or job opportunities. As a critical
- 17 intermediary between residents and health care and social



- 1 services, community health workers have a unique understanding
- 2 of their community needs and accessibility to services.
- 3 Establishing a pilot program for community health workers with
- 4 clear parameters, including major responsibilities and scope of
- 5 work, will allow community health workers to continue their
- 6 valuable work in communities statewide.
- 7 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish a three-
- 8 year rural community health worker pilot program to provide
- 9 outreach, education, training, and navigation to individuals
- 10 residing in rural communities and address social determinants of
- 11 health.
- 12 SECTION 2. (a) The department of health shall establish
- 13 and administer a three-year rural community health worker pilot
- 14 program for community health workers to provide outreach,
- 15 education, training, and navigation to individuals residing in
- 16 the State's rural communities and address social determinants of
- 17 health.
- 18 (b) Community health workers participating in the rural
- 19 community health worker pilot program may provide health
- 20 education and outreach, individual support and assistance,

3	(c)	Serv	vices offered by community health workers pursuant

6			institutions, and policymakers; and

8		(A)	Maintenance of accurate records of educational
9			activities and individual interactions; and
10		(B)	Submission of periodic reports on rural community
11			health trends, needs, and program effectiveness
12			to relevant health authorities or agencies.
13	(d)	The c	department of health shall enter into a contract
14	with a nor	nprofi	t organization to recruit, train, assign, and
15	supervise	commu	nity health workers and oversee the pilot
16	program.	The r	nonprofit organization contracted under this
17	subsection	n shal	l have:
18	(1)	A his	story of providing community empowerment, capacity
19		builo	ling, collaborative partnerships, and health
20		educa	tion to the State's rural communities;

1	(2)	The knowledge and experience necessary to provide
2		community health worker services to program
3		participants;
4	(3)	The capacity to provide culturally competent training
5		and services; and
6	(4)	A board of directors and staff team consisting of a
7		majority of residents who currently reside in a rural
8		community in the State.
9	(e)	Existing department of health personnel may be
10	assigned	to fulfill administrative and fiscal responsibilities
11	of the ru	ral community health worker pilot program.
12	(f)	The department of health, in conjunction with the
13	nonprofit	organization contracted under subsection (d), shall
14	submit in	terim reports on the development and administration of
15	the rural	community health worker pilot program, including any
16	proposed .	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
17	days prio	r to the convening of the regular sessions of 2026,
18	2027, and	2028. Each interim report shall include a record of
19	pilot pro	gram activities and accomplishments, including:
20	(1)	Outreach and training of community health workers; and

1	(2)	Serv	ices provided to program participants by a			
2		comm	nunity health worker.			
3	(g)	The	department of health shall submit a final report			
4	on the ru	ıral c	community health worker pilot program, including			
5	any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than					
6	twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of					
7	2029. The final report shall include:					
8	(1)	A re	cord of pilot program activities and			
9		acco	mplishments, including:			
10		(A)	Outreach and training of community health			
11			workers; and			
12		(B)	Services provided to program participants by a			
13			community health worker; and			
14	(2)	A re	commendation on whether to extend the pilot			
15		prog	ram beyond three years.			
16	(h) As used in this section:					
17	"Community health worker" means a frontline health worker					
18	who is a	trust	ed member of the community in which the community			
19	health worker lives, is from the community, or who has an					
20	unusually close understanding of the community served that					
21	enables the community health worker to:					

- 1 (1) Build trusted relationships;
- 2 (2) Serve as a liaison between health care and social
- 3 services and the community;
- 4 (3) Facilitate access to services; and
- 5 (4) Improve the quality and cultural competence of service
- 6 delivery.
- 7 "Program participant" means a resident of a rural community
- 8 in the State who requests services by a community health worker
- 9 through the rural community health worker pilot program.
- 10 "Rural" means an area that is currently served by a
- 11 critical access hospital as defined in section 346-1, Hawaii
- 12 Revised Statutes.
- 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
- 16 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 17 year 2026-2027 for the rural community health worker pilot
- 18 program established pursuant to section 2 of this Act.
- 19 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 20 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
