

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many low-income
- 2 households struggle to purchase food due to Hawaii's high cost
- 3 of living and food prices. The supplemental nutrition
- 4 assistance program (SNAP), formerly known as the food stamp
- 5 program, is crucial to providing necessary food assistance to
- 6 some of Hawaii's most economically disadvantaged residents.
- 7 The legislature further finds that SNAP is the most
- 8 effective anti-hunger initiative in the country. In Hawaii,
- 9 SNAP supports over one hundred thirty thousand individuals,
- 10 bringing more than \$630,000,000 into the State's economy each
- 11 year. These benefits help economically vulnerable households
- 12 meet their basic nutritional needs without sacrificing their
- 13 financial security.
- The legislature additionally finds that a study co-authored
- 15 by the university of Hawaii economic research organization and
- 16 Hawaii Public Health Institute found that eliminating the net
- 17 income limit criteria for SNAP beneficiaries would provide an



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2 across the State and expand eligibility for thirteen thousand to 3 fourteen thousand more households, with each household receiving 4 an average of \$3,200 annually in food assistance. Subsequently, 5 in September 2024, Governor Josh Green announced that the State 6 would remove the net income limit criteria to strengthen 7 Hawaii's social welfare system for working-class families. The legislature also finds that SNAP access and 8 9 participation rates are hampered by understaffing at the 10 department of human services. Improvements to SNAP in the 11 State, including elimination of the net income limit, will only 12 be effective if they are able to be fully implemented, which

services. Moreover, since SNAP benefits are federally

- 19 The legislature also finds that the State does not
- 20 participate in the elderly simplified application project, which
- 21 is a demonstration project that seeks to increase participation

- 1 among the older adult low-income population facing barriers to
- 2 participation in SNAP. Specifically, the demonstration project
- 3 waives the recertification interview requirement, allows for
- 4 greater flexibility in verification, and extends the
- 5 certification period to thirty-six months.
- 6 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 7 (1) Require the department of human services to adjust the
- 8 minimum certification periods for supplemental
- 9 nutrition assistance program benefits households,
- participate in the elderly simplified application
- 11 project, and report to the legislature; and
- 12 (2) Appropriate funds to the department of human services
- 13 to enhance staffing related to the supplemental
- 14 nutrition assistance program.
- 15 SECTION 2. (a) The department of human services shall set
- 16 the minimum certification periods for supplemental nutrition
- 17 assistance program benefit households to twelve months; provided
- 18 that for households in which all adult members are sixty years
- 19 of age or older, the certification periods shall be at minimum
- 20 twenty-four months.

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1	(d)	The department of human services shall participate in
2	the elder	ly simplified application project of the supplemental
3	nutrition	assistance program to simplify eligibility
4	determina	tions for eligible households. Participation in the
5	elderly s	implified application project shall include:
6	(1)	Establishing recertification periods of a least
7		thirty-six months for households composed entirely of
8		adults sixty years of age or older or adults with
9		disabilities; and
10	(2)	Waiving the recertification interview for eligible
11		households, to the extent allowed by federal law.
12	·(C)	The department of human services shall seek any
13	necessary	federal approvals or waivers to implement the
14	provision	s of this section and shall promptly amend its rules,
15	policies,	and procedures to effectuate the intent of this
16	section.	
17	(d)	The department of human services shall submit a report
18	of its fir	ndings and recommendations, including any proposed
19	legislatio	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
20	to the con	nvening of the regular sessions of 2026 and 2027 that
21	shall inc	lude:

1	(1)	Data on the implementation and utilization of the
2		supplemental nutrition assistance program and elderly
3		simplified application project, including the number
4		and characteristics of participating households;
5	(2)	Administrative cost savings or changes; and
6	(3)	Analysis of the participation rates.
7	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
9	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
10	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
11	year 2026	-2027 to strengthen access to the supplemental
12	nutrition	assistance program by:
13	(1)	Authorizing differential pay increases for positions
14		related to the facilitation of the supplemental
15		nutrition assistance program;
16	(2)	Establishing new positions to improve access to the
17		supplemental nutrition assistance program,
18		particularly for economically disadvantaged
19		communities; and
20	(3)	Undertaking any other programs or initiatives the
21		department of human services deems effective in

1	improving supplemental nutrition assistance program
2	participation rates.
3	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
4	of human services for the purposes of this Act.
5	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
