A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 291L-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
3	and to read as follows:
4	""Reviewing entity" means a county police department or
5	authorized employee of the department of law enforcement."
6	SECTION 2. Section 291L-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
8	"(c) Proof of a violation of section 291C-108 shall be
9	evidenced by information obtained from an automated speed
10	enforcement system authorized pursuant to this chapter. A
11	certificate, sworn to or affirmed by the reviewing [county
12	police department, entity, or a facsimile thereof, based upon
13	inspection of any clear and unobstructed photographs,
14	microphotographs, video, or other recorded images produced by
15	the system, shall be prima facie evidence of the facts contained
16	therein. Any photographs, microphotographs, video, or other

- 1 recorded images shall be available for inspection in any
- 2 proceeding to adjudicate the liability for that violation."
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 291L-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended as follows:
- 5 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- 6 "(a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary and except as
- 7 otherwise provided in this chapter, beginning January 1, 2025,
- 8 whenever any motor vehicle is determined, by means of an
- 9 automated speed enforcement system, to have exceeded the posted
- 10 maximum speed limit by not less than [five] seven miles per hour
- 11 in violation of section 291C-108, the State's third-party
- 12 contractor shall cause a summons or citation, as described in
- 13 this section, to be sent by first-class mail, that is postmarked
- 14 within ten calendar days after the date of the incident, to the
- 15 registered owner of the motor vehicle at the address on record
- 16 at the vehicle licensing division. If the end of the ten-
- 17 calendar-day period falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday,
- 18 then the ending period shall run until the end of the next day
- 19 that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday. The registered
- 20 owner shall be determined by the identification of the motor
- 21 vehicle license plate."

- 1 2. By amending subsection (d) to read:
- 2 "(d) Before mailing the summons or citation for a traffic
- 3 infraction pursuant to subsection (a), the [applicable county
- 4 police department] reviewing entity shall review and verify the
- 5 validity of the clear and unobstructed photographic, digital, or
- 6 other visual image of the license plate of the motor vehicle
- 7 required under this section."
- 8 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the state highway
- 9 fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 10 necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the same sum or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2026-2027 for the
- 12 establishment and implementation of the automated speed
- 13 enforcement systems program.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 15 of transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
