A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that skateboard accidents SECTION 1.
- 2 on roadways and streets can result in serious injury to the
- 3 skateboard user, including head trauma. According to an article
- published in the Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, 4
- 5 "Injuries to the Head and Face from Skateboarding: A 10-Year
- 6 Analysis From National Electronic Injury Surveillance System
- 7 Hospitals", from 2009 to 2018, there were an estimated 100,201
- 8 emergency room visits nationwide related to trauma to the head
- 9 and face while skateboarding. The article concluded that "[a]
- 10 substantial number of [emergency department] visits were a
- 11 result of skateboarding-related facial trauma. Given the
- 12 neurologic outcomes of head trauma and functional consequences
- 13 of facial fractures, especially among adolescents, our findings
- 14 suggest that injury prevention programs and more aggressive
- helmet use may be necessary to reduce morbidity and 15
- 16 hospitalization".

1 The legislature further finds that existing laws in the 2 State protect bicyclists under the age of sixteen by requiring 3 operators to wear a helmet. Additionally, the legislature notes that other states require helmets for minors including 4 5 California, New York, and Oregon. Extension of existing safety 6 provisions for bicyclists to skateboard riders will provide 7 additional protection for all roadway users. 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the use 9 of a safety helmet by anyone under the age of sixteen while 10 riding a skateboard on roadways and streets. 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part XII to be appropriately 12 13 designated and to read as follows: 14 "\$291C- Skateboards; helmet required. (a) No person 15 under sixteen years of age shall operate a skateboard upon a 16 street, roadway, bikeway, or any other public property unless 17 the person is wearing a properly fitted and fastened helmet that 18 is designed to fit the user, protect against head trauma, and 19 has been tested by a nationally recognized agency such as the 20 National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, National Safety 21 Council, or Children's Safety Network.

- 1 (b) This section shall not be construed to legalize the
- 2 use of skateboards in violation of any county ordinance.
- 3 (c) For the purposes of this section, "skateboard" means a
- 4 short board with wheels that a person stands on to move along a
- 5 surface or to perform tricks."
- 6 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
