A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTEGRATED LAND USE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that multiple climate and sustainability statutory targets have been enacted in the State, 2 including developing at least 22,500 affordable rental housing 3 4 units, doubling food production, increasing food exports, 5 requiring the department of education and university of Hawaii 6 to become net-zero in energy use, requiring that all of the 7 electricity generated in Hawaii come from renewable sources, 8 sequestering more atmospheric carbon and greenhouse gases, 9 requiring all state and county facilities to use reclaimed 10 water, and requiring the mandatory upgrade of all cesspools. The legislature recognizes that, with the recent expansion 11 12 of the office of planning and sustainable development through Act 45, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, and Acts 152 and 153, 13 Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, the office of planning and 14 sustainable development functionally serves as the State's 15 16 centralized coordinating agency to lead efforts in climate adaptive and sustainable land use policies. 17

- 1 The legislature further finds that the State would benefit
- 2 from a land use plan that integrates various climate and
- 3 sustainability goals and studies, especially on the use of
- 4 agricultural lands. An integrated land use study would help to
- 5 address recent events and public opposition to affordable
- 6 housing projects and renewable energy projects on agricultural
- 7 land.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to require the office of
- 9 planning and sustainable development to develop an integrated
- 10 land use study that incorporates the various climate and
- 11 sustainability goals and studies to serve as a guide for
- 12 planning and decision making on the use of agricultural lands.
- 13 SECTION 2. (a) The office of planning and sustainable
- 14 development shall conduct an integrated land use study for
- 15 agricultural districts as classified under section 205-2, Hawaii
- 16 Revised Statutes.
- 17 (b) The purpose of the integrated land use study shall be
- **18** to:
- 19 (1) Develop land use data that can be used for planning
- 20 and decision making for the competing uses of lands
- 21 within agricultural districts; and

1	(2)	Determine the land use feasibility and needs of lands
2		within agricultural districts to meet the State's
3		climate, sustainability, and housing statutory
4		targets.

- 5 (c) The integrated land use study shall incorporate the
- 6 recommendations of:
- 7 (1) The Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan pursuant to section 226-65, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- 9 (2) The state land use review of districts;
- 10 (3) The Hawaii sea level rise vulnerability and adaptation 11 report pursuant to section 225P-3, Hawaii Revised 12 Statutes; and
- 13 (4) The State's climate, sustainability, and housing14 statutory targets, as needed.
- (d) The integrated land use study shall also consider the Hawaii state plan update phase one and the soil classification study required pursuant to Act 189, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022.
- 18 (e) The integrated land use study shall include
 19 recommendations for each county.
- 20 (f) In conducting the integrated land use study, the
 21 office of planning and sustainable development shall:

1	(1)	bevelop data based estimates on the amount of fand
2		required to meet the competing uses of lands within
3		the agricultural districts by compiling and analyzing
4		existing data from various government entities,
5		including the department of agriculture; department of
6		transportation; department of land and natural
7		resources; department of business, economic
8		development, and tourism; Hawaii state energy office;
9		Hawaii housing finance and development corporation;
10		public utilities commission; and the counties.
11		Secondary input shall be sought from the university of
12		Hawaii, utility companies, nonprofit agricultural
13		organizations, the agricultural community, and other
14		organizations or entities deemed appropriate by the
15		office;
16	(2)	Clearly define and prioritize the protection of
17		productive agricultural lands to prevent further
18		encroachment from non-agricultural developments,
19		including developing measures to ensure agricultural
20		lands designated for agriculture production are not
21		compromised for short-term development needs;

1	(3)	include direct input from the agricultural community			
2		to ensure the study reflects the realities and needs			
3		of farmers and ranchers;			
4	(4)	Conduct outreach to ensure county and community input			
5		and acceptance; and			
6	(5)	Once the initial compilation of data is completed,			
7		analyze the available acreage in each county along			
8		with the potential impacts for the proposed changes.			
9	SECT	ION 3. The office of planning and sustainable			
10	development shall submit an interim report to the legislature na				
11	later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular				
12	session of 2026 on the progress of developing data-based				
13	estimates and the progress of the integrated land use study and				
14	a final r	eport to the legislature and the land use commission no			
15	later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular				
16	session of 2027.				
17	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general			
18	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so			
19	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and			
20	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal			
21	year 2026	-2027 for the establishment of full-time			

- 1 equivalent (FTE) planner positions, exempt from chapter 76,
- 2 Hawaii Revised Statutes, and for computers, office supplies,
- 3 travel, and other expenses to conduct the integrated land use
- 4 study.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 6 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
- 7 Act.
- **8** SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
- 11 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 12 year 2026-2027 for personnel costs and other expenses of the
- 13 integrated land use study project.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 15 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
- **16** Act.
- 17 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
