A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a main goal of the 2 department of education's State of Hawaii public education 2023-3 2029 strategic plan is to have "all students graduate high 4 school prepared for college and career success and community and 5 civic engagement." As part of this goal, an action item in the strategic plan includes "expand[ing] students' opportunities for 6 structured work-based learning experiences, including 7 internships for high school students, through partnerships with 8 9 employers, community partners, military and higher education 10 institutions." 11 To achieve the goals set forth in the strategic plan, the 12 department of education is actively pursuing internships for 13 students, including graduating high school students. However, 14 the department finds that once students graduate from high 15 school, they are no longer considered a student and are not 16 covered for workers' compensation while they are participating

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- 1 in a department-sponsored work-based learning opportunity during
- 2 the summer following graduation.
- 3 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to allow newly
- 4 graduated former students to be eligible for workers'
- 5 compensation coverage during the summer following their high
- 6 school graduation while participating in work-based learning
- 7 programs sponsored by the department of education.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 302A-430, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "\$302A-430 Coverage for workers' compensation. (a)
- 11 Whenever a student or a new high school graduate participating
- 12 in a school-approved work-based learning program sponsored by
- 13 the department [of education] or a student participating in a
- 14 school-approved work-based learning program sponsored by the
- 15 [University] university of Hawaii undertakes to perform work for
- 16 a private or public employer as part of the student's or new
- 17 high school graduate's work-based learning program, whether paid
- 18 or unpaid, the State shall be deemed to be the responsible
- 19 employer for the purposes of workers' compensation coverage $[\tau]$:
- 20 provided that no coverage under this section shall be provided
- 21 beyond July 31 of the student's or the new high school

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1	graduate's high school graduation year, and that coverage shall	
2	be the student's or the new high school graduate's exclusive	
3	remedy to	the same extent as provided for in chapter 386 as
4	against the State and the private employer participating in the	
5	program.	
6	(b)	The department shall submit an annual report to the
7	legislatu	re no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
8	each regu	lar session that contains the following information:
9	<u>(1)</u>	The number of students participating in the school-
10		approved work-based learning program sponsored by the
11		department or the university of Hawaii;
12	(2)	The number of workers' compensation claims filed
13		pursuant to this section; and
14	(3)	The number of students who continue to participate in
15		the school-approved work-based learning program
16		sponsored by the department or the university of
17		Hawaii after high school graduation."

20	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
