A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that despite Hawaii's
2	increasing risk of experiencing extreme weather events,
3	information consolidation and sharing is lacking as it relates
4	to locations where the public can shelter at a moment's notice.
5	In addition, few public buildings meet minimum requirements for
6	hurricane sheltering while demand for public evacuation shelter
7	space is likely to exceed available inventory.
8	The legislature finds it is critical to take a more focused
9	approach towards shelter retrofitting and strengthen
10	communication of available shelters amongst government entities
11	and the general public.
12	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
13	(1) Require the Hawaii emergency management agency to
14	inventory all designated emergency shelters statewide
15	and their ability to withstand a category one
16	hurricane or higher;

1	(2)	Collaborate with the counties to publish a publicly
2		available list of shelters and their respective
3		hurricane rating; and
4	(3)	Provide funding for the hurricane shelter retrofit
5		program and establish a director position to manage
6		its activities.
7	SECT	ION 2. Section 127A-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended t	o read as follows:
9	"§12	7A-3 Hawaii emergency management agency. (a) There
10	is establ	ished within the department of defense the Hawaii
11	emergency	management agency. The adjutant general shall serve
12	as the di	rector of Hawaii emergency management and, subject to
13	the direc	tion and control of the governor, shall oversee the
14	agency.	
15	(b)	There shall be an administrator of emergency
16	managemen	t who shall be appointed, and may be removed, by the
17	director,	and who shall have at least three years of experience
18	leading e	mergency management efforts at the local, state, or
19	federal l	evel. The administrator of emergency management shall
20	be the ci	vilian head of and responsible for the day-to-day

operations of the agency. The administrator of emergency

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- 1 management shall report to the director. The administrator of
- 2 emergency management shall, in the absence of the director, have
- 3 all the duties and responsibilities of the director, and shall
- 4 report directly to the governor. The administrator of emergency
- 5 management shall not be subject to chapter 76.
- 6 (c) The administrator may, from funds allotted therefor,
- 7 employ technical, clerical, administrative, and other personnel
- 8 and make such expenditures as may be necessary.
- 9 (d) The administrator shall coordinate the activities of
- 10 the agency with all county emergency management agencies, other
- 11 state agencies, other states, or federal agencies involved in
- 12 emergency management activities, and all organizations for
- 13 emergency management within the State, whether public or
- 14 private, and shall maintain liaison and cooperate with all
- 15 county emergency management agencies, other state agencies,
- 16 other states, or federal agencies involved in emergency
- 17 management activities as provided in this chapter.
- 18 (e) The agency shall perform emergency management
- 19 functions within the territorial limits of the State. In
- 20 performing its duties, the agency shall:

1	(\(\pm \)	Prepare a state comprehensive emergency management
2		plan, which shall be integrated into and coordinated
3		with the emergency management plans of the federal
4		government. The plan shall be integrated by a
5		continuous, integrated comprehensive emergency
6		management program. The plan shall contain provisions
7		to ensure that the State prepares for, mitigates
8		against, responds to, and recovers from emergencies
9		and minor, major, and catastrophic disasters. In
10		preparing and maintaining the plan, the agency shall
11		work closely with agencies and organizations with
12		emergency management responsibilities;
13	(2)	Assign lead and support responsibilities to state
14		agencies and personnel for emergency management
15		functions and other support activities;
16	(3)	Adopt standards and requirements for county emergency
17		management plans. The standards and requirements
18		shall ensure that county plans are coordinated and
19		consistent with the state comprehensive emergency
20		management plan;

1	(4)	Make recommendations to the legislature, building code
2		organizations, and counties for zoning, building, and
3		other land use controls; and other preparedness,
4		prevention, and mitigation measures designed to
5		eliminate emergencies or reduce their impact;
6	(5)	Anticipate trends and promote innovations that will
7		enhance the emergency management system;
8	(6)	Institute statewide public awareness programs. This
9		shall include intensive public educational campaigns
10		on emergency preparedness issues, including but not
11		limited to the personal responsibility of individual
12		citizens to be self-sufficient for up to fourteen days
13		following a natural or human-caused disaster;
14	(7)	Coordinate federal, state, and local emergency
15		management activities and take all other steps,
16		including the partial or full mobilization of
17		emergency management forces and organizations in
18		advance of an actual emergency, to ensure the
19		availability of adequately trained and equipped forces
20		of emergency management personnel before, during, and

after emergencies and disasters;

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1	(8)	Implement training programs to improve the ability of
2		state and local emergency management personnel to
3		prepare and implement emergency management plans and
4		programs. This shall include a continuous training
5		program for agencies and individuals that will be
6		called on to perform key roles in state and local
7		post-disaster response and recovery efforts and for
8		local government personnel on federal and state post-
9		disaster response and recovery strategies and
10		procedures;
11	(9)	Adopt standards and requirements for state agency
12		emergency operating procedures and periodically review
13		emergency operating procedures of state agencies and
14		recommend revisions as needed to ensure consistency

(10) Coordinate, in advance whenever possible, such executive orders, proclamations, and rules for issuance by the governor as are necessary or appropriate for coping with emergencies and disasters.

and program; and

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2 shelters statewide and their ability to withstand a category one 3 hurricane or higher." 4 SECTION 4. Section 127A-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows: 6 "(f) For purposes of this section, "shelter" includes any 7 structure, excavation, or other facility or item used or useful 8 for the protection of persons[-] and any public building 9 constructed after January 2026 that meets the requirements of 10 section 107-27(e)." 11 SECTION 3. The Hawaii emergency management agency shall 12 collaborate with the respective counties to publish a publicly 13 available list of shelters and their respective hurricane rating 14 by category no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 15 the regular session of 2026. 16 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the 19 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 20 2026-2027 for a hurricane shelter retrofit program; provided 21 that \$ of the appropriation may be used to fund one

(f) The agency shall inventory all designated emergency

- 1 full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) position in the Hawaii emergency
- 2 management agency for a hurricane shelter retrofit program
- 3 director.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 5 emergency management agency for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
