H.B. NO. 40

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 151, Session 2 Laws of Hawaii 2022, amended the Electronic Device Recycling and 3 Recovery Act to make wholesale changes to the state electronic waste recycling program. The purpose of Act 151 included, among 4 5 other things, expanding the definition of "electronic waste" to 6 cover more electronic devices, establishing manufacturer 7 recycling goals, and requiring manufacturers to pay for 8 convenient recycling options for consumers.

9 However, the changes made through Act 151 have been slow to 10 increase electronic waste collection sites and make recycling 11 more convenient for residents of the State. In addition, in the 12 implementation of Act 151, manufacturers have struggled to 13 comply with all new requirements, especially due to increased 14 weight targets and increased penalties for failing to meet the 15 electronic device collection requirements. Weight targets have 16 been particularly problematic since the weights of electronic 17 devices have decreased over time, and for that reason, many



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1 other states and localities have moved away from using weight 2 requirements. 3 The legislature further finds that incentivizing more 4 permanent recycling sites and events and adding certain legacy 5 and peripheral devices to the law will expand recycling access 6 and convenience to the general public. 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to amend the 8 Electronic Device Recycling and Recovery Act by: 9 (1) Allowing manufacturers to coordinate activities 10 directly related to the recycling of covered 11 electronic devices; 12 (2) Expanding the scope of covered electronic devices to 13 include electronic device peripherals and certain 14 legacy devices; and 15 (3) Requiring manufacturers to provide free collection 16 service locations for residents of every zip code 17 containing twenty-five thousand or more residents, one 18 on-site collection service location on the island of 19 Molokai, and at least four collection events annually 20 on the county of Hawaii outside of Kona and Hilo.



1	SECTION 2. Chapter 339D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

5	group of manufacturers, or a coordinating body acting in				
. 6	accordance with this part may negotiate, enter into contracts				
7	with, collaborate, coordinate, or otherwise conduct business				
8	with each other and with any other entity developing,				
9	implementing, operating, participating in, or performing any				
10	other activities directly related to a plan to recycle covered				
11	electronic devices approved pursuant to this part. The				
12	manufacturer, group of manufacturers, and any entity developing,				
13	implementing, operating, participating in, or performing any				
14	other activities related to a plan to recycle covered electronic				
15	devices approved pursuant to this part shall not be subject to				
16	damages, liability, or scrutiny under federal antitrust law or				
17	chapter 480, regardless of the effects of their actions on				
18	competition. The supervisory activities described in this part				
19	are sufficient to confirm that activities of the manufacturers,				
20	a group of manufacturers, and any entity developing,				
21	implementing, operating, participating in, or performing any

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""Reuse" means any operation by which [an] a covered
 electronic device changes ownership and is used for the same

4 SECTION 4. Section 339D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 "\$339D-23 Manufacturer responsibility. (a) Beginning 7 January 1, 2023, a manufacturer shall recycle or arrange for the 8 recycling or reuse of any <u>covered</u> electronic device sold in the 9 State. Manufacturers shall fully fund their recycling plan, 10 including the collection, transportation, and recycling of all 11 <u>covered</u> electronic devices in the State.

(b) By September 1, 2022, and annually thereafter, each manufacturer shall submit a plan to the department to establish, conduct, and manage a program for the recycling of <u>covered</u> electronic devices sold in the State, which shall be subject to the following conditions:

17 (1) The plan shall not permit the charging of a fee at the
18 point of collection if the <u>covered</u> electronic device
19 is brought by the <u>covered</u> electronic device owner to a
20 central location for recycling; provided that the plan
21 may include a reasonable transportation fee if the

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1 manufacturer or manufacturer's agent removes the 2 <u>covered</u> electronic device from the owner's premises at 3 the owner's request and if the removal is not in 4 conjunction with delivery of a new <u>covered</u> electronic 5 device to the owner;

(2) The plan shall include a description of the methods 6 7 for the convenient collection of covered electronic 8 devices at no cost to the owner, except as provided in 9 paragraph (1). The recycling plan shall provide for 10 collection services of covered electronic devices in 11 each county and zip code tabulation area, as defined 12 by the United States Census Bureau, with a population 13 greater than twenty-five thousand. The recycling plan 14 shall include at least one of the following:

- 15 (A) Staffed drop-off sites;
- 16 (B) Alternative collection services, including on17 site pick-up services; or
- 18 (C) Collection events held at an easily accessible,19 central location;
- 20 (3) The plan shall provide collection services at a
 21 minimum of once per month;



1 The plan shall not contain only a mail-back option; (4) 2 (5) The plan shall specify the use of only collectors registered with the State pursuant to section 339D-28; 3 4 and The plan shall specify the use of recyclers that have 5 (6) achieved and maintained third-party accredited 6 7 certification from the Responsible Recycling Standard 8 for Electronics Recyclers (R2), Standard for 9 Responsible Recycling and Reuse of Electronic 10 Equipment (e-Stewards), or an internationally 11 accredited third-party environmental management 12 standard for the safe and responsible handling of 13 covered electronic devices. 14 (C) The department shall review each manufacturer's plan 15 and, within sixty days of receipt of the plan, determine whether 16 the plan complies with this part. If the plan is approved, the 17 department shall notify the manufacturer or group of 18 manufacturers. If the plan is rejected, the department shall 19 notify the manufacturer or group of manufacturers and provide 20 the reasons for the plan's rejection. Within thirty days after 21 receipt of the department's rejection, the manufacturer or group



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of manufacturers may revise and resubmit the plan to the
 department for approval.

3 (d) Each manufacturer may develop its own recycling plan
4 or may collaborate with other manufacturers[; provided that the
5 plan is implemented and fully operational by January 1, 2023].
6 Manufacturers who collaborate on plans designed to comply with
7 the requirements in section 339D-23.1(f) may coordinate such
8 plans in any program year.

9 (e) The obligations under this chapter for a manufacturer 10 that manufactures or manufactured covered electronic devices, or 11 who sells or sold covered electronic devices manufactured by 12 others, under a brand that was previously used by a different 13 person in the manufacture of covered electronic devices, shall 14 extend to all covered electronic devices bearing that brand." 15 SECTION 5. Section 339D-23.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows:

17 "[+]\$339D-23.1[+] Manufacturer recycling goals. (a) The 18 department shall use the best available information to establish 19 the weight of all <u>covered</u> electronic devices sold in the State, 20 including the reports submitted pursuant to section 339D-23.3,

13		cent, by weight, of the manufacturer's covered
14		electronic devices sold in the State two years prior,
15		unless amended by rule pursuant to chapter 91; and
16	(3)	Beginning January 1, 2025, the equivalent of seventy
17		per cent, by weight, of the manufacturer's covered
18		electronic devices sold in the State two years prior,
19		unless amended by rule pursuant to chapter 91.
20	(d)	A manufacturer may collect any covered electronic
21	device to	meet its recycling goal.

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(e)	A manufacturer may consider reused <u>covered</u> electronic
devices t	oward achieving its recycling goals.
<u>(f)</u>	A manufacturer shall be considered to have satisfied
the recyc	ling obligations under subsection (c) if the
manufactu	rer meets the requirements of section 339D-23(b)(2) by
providing	<u>:</u>
(1)	On-site collection service locations for recycling at
	no cost in each county and zip code tabulation area,
	as defined by the United States Census Bureau, with a
	population greater than twenty-five thousand;
(2)	One on-site collection service location on the island
	of Molokai; and
(3)	Four or more collection events in the county of Hawaii
	outside of Kona and Hilo.
(g)	A manufacturer may collaborate to provide collection
locations	under subsection (f) collectively through a
<u>coordinat</u>	ing body designated by manufacturers for this purpose
or as ind	ividual manufacturers; provided that:

11	SECTION 6. Sections 339D-8, 339D-10, 339D-21, 339D-22,

13	Statutes, are amended by substituting the phrase "covered				
14	electronic device", or similar term, wherever the phrase				
15	"electronic device", or similar term, appears, as the context				
16	requires.				
17	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed				
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.				
19	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
