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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 78-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) Unless otherwise provided by law, all officers and
4	employees shall be paid at least semimonthly except that
5	substitute teachers, part-time hourly rated teachers of adult
6	and evening classes, and other part-time, intermittent, or
7	casual employees may be paid once a month [and that the
8	governor, upon reasonable notice and upon determination that the
9	payroll payment basis should be converted from predicted payroll
10	to after-the-fact payroll, may allow a one-time once a month
11	payroll payment to all public officers and employees to effect a
12	conversion to after-the-fact payroll as follows:
13	(1) The implementation of the after-the-fact payroll will
14	commence with the June 30, 1998, pay day, which will
15	be delayed to July 1, 1998;
16	(2) The July 15, 1998, pay day will be delayed to July 17,
17	1998;

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1	(3)	The July 31, 1998, pay day will be delayed to August	
2		3, 1998;	
3	-(4)-	The August 14, 1998, pay-day will be delayed to August	
4		19, 1998;	
5	(5) -	The August 31, 1998, pay day will be delayed to	
6		September 4, 1998;	
7	(6)	The September 15, 1998, pay day will be delayed to	
8		September 18, 1998; and	
9	(7)	Thereafter, pay days will be on the fifth and the	
10		twentieth of every month. If the fifth and the	
11		twentieth fall on a state holiday, Saturday, or	
12		Sunday, the pay day will be the immediately preceding	
13		weekday.]	
14	; provide	d that the payroll payment basis shall be converted	
15	from afte	r-the-fact payroll to predicted payroll and shall	
16	commence with the August 5, 2026, pay day, which shall be paid		
17	on July 1, 2026, and thereafter pay days shall be on the		
18	fifteenth day and last day of every month. If the fifteenth day		
19	or the last day of the month falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or		
20	holiday, the pay day shall be on the immediately preceding		
21	weekday.		



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1 The implementation of the [after-the-fact] predicted 2 payroll shall not be subject to negotiation under chapter 89." 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 to 6 establish six full-time equivalent (6.0 FTE) positions to 7 perform tasks related to payroll processing, including training, expanded monitoring and auditing, expanded overpayment analysis, 8 9 and overpayment collection. 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act. 11 12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 14 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 15 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 16 year 2026-2027 to pay for the costs necessary to convert 17 employees from an after-the-fact payroll schedule to a predicted 18 payroll schedule.

19 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department20 of accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.

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SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 begun before its effective date.

4 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

6 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Amends payroll requirements for public officers and employees by requiring them to be paid pursuant to a predicted payroll schedule, rather than an after-the-fact payroll schedule. Provides that the predicted payroll schedule shall not be subject to negotiation under Chapter 89, HRS. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
