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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

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REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT AN IMPACT ASSESSMENT OF  
ELIMINATING COST-SHARING FOR CERTAIN DIAGNOSTIC AND  
SUPPLEMENTAL BREAST EXAMINATIONS.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii ranks the fourth highest for breast cancer  
2 incidence in the country, and incident rates continue to  
3 increase; and  
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5 WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society recommends that high  
6 risk-patients or women with dense breast tissue category 3  
7 should receive a mammogram and a breast MRI every year starting  
8 at the age of thirty; and  
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10 WHEREAS, diagnostic imaging is conducted on patients who do  
11 exhibit symptoms of breast cancer, or who have had an abnormal  
12 mammography result; and  
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14 WHEREAS, supplemental imaging is conducted on patients who  
15 have already been diagnosed with breast cancer, or who have been  
16 deemed to be at a high risk for breast cancer due to a family  
17 history of the disease; and  
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19 WHEREAS, breast cancer screening and follow-up imaging have  
20 significantly increased the early detection of breast cancer in  
21 the past twenty-five years; and  
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23 WHEREAS, it is not required for insurers to cover  
24 supplemental examinations or follow-up diagnostic screenings,  
25 which could result in costs ranging from hundreds to thousands  
26 of dollars; and  
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28 WHEREAS, a 2019 study by the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer  
29 Foundation found cost as the primary reason women avoid follow-



1 up diagnostic imaging recommended by their healthcare provider;  
2 and

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4 WHEREAS, removing financial barriers to follow-up  
5 diagnostic and supplemental breast examinations is critical for  
6 the health and economic security of women in Hawaii and will  
7 help avoid more costly treatments in the future; and

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9 WHEREAS, numerous states have enacted legislation that  
10 eliminates patient cost-sharing for diagnostic and supplemental  
11 breast imaging; and

12  
13 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires  
14 that, before considering any legislative measure that mandates  
15 health insurance coverage for specific health services, specific  
16 diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part  
17 of individual or group health insurance policies, the  
18 Legislature shall adopt a concurrent resolution asking the  
19 Auditor to prepare and submit to the Legislature a report that  
20 assesses the social and financial effects of the proposed  
21 mandatory coverage; and

22  
23 WHEREAS, section 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, further  
24 specifies the minimum information required for assessing the  
25 social and financial impact of the proposed health coverage  
26 mandate in the Auditor's report; now, therefore,

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28 WHEREAS, House Bill No. 598, introduced during the Regular  
29 Session of 2025, proposes to prohibit the imposition of cost-  
30 sharing requirements for certain diagnostic and supplemental  
31 breast examinations; and

32  
33 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
34 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
35 of 2025, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to  
36 conduct an impact assessment in accordance with sections 23-51  
37 and 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, of eliminating cost-sharing  
38 for certain diagnostic and supplemental breast examinations as  
39 proposed by House Bill No. 598, Regular Session of 2025; and

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41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Auditor is requested to include  
42 in its assessment the impact of the Affordable Care Act,





11 2026; and
