HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU'S DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SERVICES TO IMPLEMENT ROAD SAFETY AND TRAFFIC FLOW IMPROVEMENTS IN HAWAII KAI.

1	WHEREAS, Hawaii Kai is a suburban community home to many
2	local families; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, speeding is a recurring concern for Hawaii Kai's
5	pedestrians; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, in a recent study by the City and County of
8	Honolulu's Department of Transportation Services it was found
9	that seventy-one per cent of drivers failed to yield for
10	pedestrians at a busy intersection in Hawaii Kai, which was the
11	highest rate of the ten intersections included in the island-
12 13	wide study; and
15	WHEREAS, there are numerous highly trafficked areas in
14	Hawaii Kai and Kalama Valley which lack crosswalks, making
16	movement on foot a dangerous proposition; and
17	movemente on root a dangerous proposition, and
18	WHEREAS, for example, streets surrounding Kalama Valley
19	Community Park are often traversed by young athletes, though the
20	absence of crosswalks makes crossing thoroughfares difficult and
21	dangerous; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, the intersection of Hawaii Kai Drive and Kealahou
24	Street is another location of concern in Kalama Valley, with
25	frequent speeding and no crosswalks making this an unfriendly
26	pedestrian environment; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, there are numerous streets in Hawaii Kai which are
29	prone to speeding, though the implementation of traffic calming

measures are rare, despite numerous long-standing requests from 1 2 elected officials and community members alike; and 3 4 WHEREAS, as the main ingress and egress of East Honolulu, Kalaniana'ole Highway is a highly utilized thoroughfare with 5 6 many drivers frequently sitting in traffic; and 7 8 WHEREAS, drivers turning left off Kalaniana'ole Highway at 9 times must wait over five minutes for the signal to change, even 10 at night when there are very few vehicles on the road; and 11 12 WHEREAS, at other locations in Honolulu, traffic turn signals flash yellow during low traffic volume hours, which give 13 drivers the opportunity to make a left turn if they determine it 14 is safe; now, therefore, 15 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 18 19 of 2025, the Senate concurring, that the City and County of Honolulu's Department of Transportation Services is urged to 20 install crosswalks in Kalama Valley, prioritizing areas around 21 the Kalama Valley Community Park and at the intersection of 22 23 Hawaii Kai Drive and Kealahou Street; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Department of Transportation and the City and County of Honolulu's Department 26 of Transportation Services are urged to study traffic calming 27 28 measures throughout Hawaii Kai to reduce speeding and urgently implement the most optimal solutions; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Department of 31 32 Transportation and the City and County of Honolulu's Department 33 of Transportation Services are urged to make light timing 34 changes and adjust parameters to maximize traffic flow, including exploring the installation of turn signals on 35 Kalaniana'ole Highway to flashing yellow lights during low 36 traffic volume hours to give drivers the discretion to decide if 37 38 it is safe to turn; and 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 40 41 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of
