HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS THE SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL EFFECTS OF PROPOSED MANDATORY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR CONTINUOUS GLUCOSE MONITORS.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, over two hundred thousand people live in rural areas in the State, which creates unique challenges in health care access, affordability, and health care outcomes; and
4 5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, approximately 108,600 adults, or 9.5 percent of the adult population in the State, live with diabetes, which requires strict management of blood glucose levels, medication, and lifestyle choices to prevent serious complications; and
9 10 11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, continuous glucose monitors provide real-time data and trends on blood glucose levels, surpassing the limited information available through traditional blood glucose meters; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, continuous glucose monitors help patients avoid dangerous blood sugar fluctuations and reduce long-term complications from diabetes, including the need for emergency care; and
19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28	WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that "[b]efore any legislative measure that mandates health insurance coverage for specific health services, specific diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part of individual or group health insurance policies, can be considered, there shall be concurrent resolutions passed requesting the auditor to prepare and submit to the legislature a report that assesses both the social and financial effects of the proposed mandated coverage"; and
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WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, further 1 provides that "[t]he concurrent resolutions shall designate a 2 specific legislative bill that: 3 4 5 (1) Has been introduced in the legislature; and 6 Includes, at a minimum, information identifying the: 7 (2) 8 Specific health service, disease, or provider 9 (A) that would be covered; 10 11 12 (B) Extent of the coverage; 13 14 (C) Target groups that would be covered; 15 16 (D) Limitations on utilization, if any; and 17 (E) Standards of care. 18 19 20 For purposes of this part, mandated health insurance coverage shall not include mandated optionals."; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, section 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, further 24 specifies the minimum information required for assessing the 25 social and financial impact of the proposed health coverage mandate in the Auditor's report; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, House Bill No. 820, introduced in the Regular 29 Session of 2025, proposes to expand existing health insurance 30 mandates to cover continuous glucose monitors; now, therefore, 31 32 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 33 of 2025, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to 34 35 conduct an impact assessment report in accordance with sections 23-51 and 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, of mandating health 36 37 insurance coverage for continuous glucose monitors as proposed 38 by House Bill No. 820 (Regular Session of 2025); and 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to submit a report of the Auditor's findings and recommendations, 41 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 42



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than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 1 of 2026; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 4 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor, Director of 5 Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and Insurance Commissioner. 6 7 8 9 OFFERED BY MAR 0 7 2025
