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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONVENE A KAILUA BAY ADVISORY WORKING GROUP.

WHEREAS, the Kailua-Kona Wharf, commonly referred to as the 1 Kailua Pier, in Kailua-Kona, Hawai'i Island, serves as a vital 2 hub for place-based cultural history, community gatherings, 3 ocean-based tourism, and recreational activities which supports 4 local businesses and enhances the economy of West Hawai'i; and 5 1 6 WHEREAS, Kailua Pier and the surrounding area of Kailua Bay 7 hold deep cultural and historical significance to the Hawai'i 8 Island community as a sacred and political center for Native 9 Hawaiians, serving as the royal residence of King Kamehameha I 10 in his later years and the site of Ahu'ena Heiau, where the King 11 governed and upheld traditional Hawaiian practices; and 12 : 1 13 WHEREAS, Kailua Bay witnessed pivotal moments in Hawaiian 14 history, including the transition from the traditional kapu 15 system to a new era of governance in 1819, marking a profound 16 shift in the cultural and societal structure of Hawai'i; and 17 3 B - 2 J - 2 18 WHEREAS, the area has remained a vital hub for maritime 19 activity, commerce, and cultural traditions, sustaining 20 generations of Native Hawaiian fishers, voyagers, and 21 practitioners who continue to honor the ancestral connection to 22 the land and ocean; and : ÷ . 23 : : : : : : 24 WHEREAS, today, the Kailua Pier provides essential access 25 for fishing, boating, and cultural events, including the annual 26 Oueen Lili'uokalani Canoe Race, the IRONMAN World Championship, 27 and traditional Hawaiian ceremonies, fostering both economic 28 growth and cultural preservation; and 29 30 WHEREAS, in addition to servicing local residents, the 31 Kailua Pier serves as a key arrival point for cruise ships, 32 bringing thousands of visitors to West Hawai'i each year, who 33 2025-1747 HCR SMA-3.docx

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contribute significantly to the region's economy through 1 tourism-related spending by supporting local businesses, 2 restaurants, tour operators, and cultural sites; and 3 4

5 WHEREAS, the high level of activity at the Kailua Pier has resulted in persistent challenges related to homelessness, 6 including the frequent vandalism of public facilities, damage to 7 8 restroom infrastructure, and unauthorized encampments, creating ongoing safety and sanitation concerns for residents and 9 visitors; and 10

WHEREAS, while maintenance of the Kailua Pier is essential 12 13 for public safety, environmental protection, and the long-term benefit of the community, persistent vandalism and destruction 14 15 of public restrooms and infrastructure have led to rising 16 maintenance costs, disruptions to public access, and the need for continuous repairs by state and county agencies; and 17 : 18

WHEREAS, the management and operations of Kailua Pier fall 19 under the jurisdiction of multiple government agencies, 20 including the Department of Land and Natural Resources, various 21 departments of the County of Hawai'i such as Parks and Recreation 22 and the Police Department as well as federal entities such as 23 the United States Coast Guard; and 24

WHEREAS, local nonprofit organizations, including 26 Destination Kona Coast, play a crucial role in visitor education 27 and greeting programs while serving as dedicated stewards of 28 Kailua Pier, actively monitoring its operations, identifying 29 30 facility concerns, and relaying issues to government officials in a timely manner; and 31

32 33 WHEREAS, adopting an interjurisdictional approach to addressing challenges at Kailua Pier would enhance communication 34 between pier users and government officials, while fostering 35 coordinated oversight and effective management among responsible 36 authorities; now, therefore, 37 : ÷
